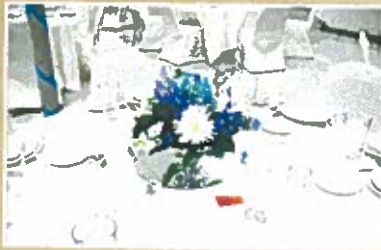

The Quality of Life Center encompasses 24 spacious classrooms, a community library, computer and science labs, art and music rooms, a gymnasium, exercise/aerobic area, walking/running track, cafeteria/banquet facility, bookstore and much more. Since opening its doors in September, 2005, the Quality of Life Center has partnered with King's Academy Christian School. The Academy is a member of the school choice program and serves approximately 200 students grades K-8. In addition, we offer body sculpting and aerobics classes, open gym, youth basketball games, and youth sexuality classes. We are also partners with Aurora Health Care to offer the part-time services of a nurse practitioner, who provides medical screenings, inoculations, health care information, and referrals to appropriate health care providers. Finally, we are partnered with the Black Health Coalition of Wisconsin as a recipient of health information offered to the African American community.

"Take a look, world!

"Look at this precious, bright child!

"I know who I am!

"I am a child of the King!"

These are the final lines of the 266-word creed that students of King's Academy Christian School recite in unison every school day. The upbeat creed stresses that God has given students a great opportunity to learn, so they should take full advantage of it. Principal Evelyn Jones, who wrote the creed, explains that the goal of the school "is to improve the quality of children's academic education by providing a well-rounded, rigorous academic program that is based on the Word of God."

Mission statement: King's Academy Christian School exists to educate children with a Christ-centered curriculum that will prepare them to live Christian lives and will enable them to contribute positively in our society.

King's Academy Christian School, which began in 1999, had been the longtime dream of John W. McVicker Sr., pastor of Milwaukee's Christ the King Baptist Church. The school is located in the new Quality of Life Center next door to the church. Each level is painted a different color and is accented with abstract designs. In addition to classrooms, the center has a state-of-the-art computer lab, gym, science lab, and rooms for music and art. The other tenant of the center is Samaritan Project Inc., a nonprofit organization serving disadvantaged and displaced adults and youth in the multicultural community.

King's Academy offers a full academic curriculum, including art, music, and PE. Whether using textbooks from Christian or secular publishers, the teachers work to incorporate a clear, biblical perspective in their classes. For example, sixth grade teacher Dreanna Dallas nudges students to think biblically. "I integrate a Christian view by allowing students to respond from a Christian perspective to events that plague our world today," she explains. She prompts students with questions such as, How have the recent hurricanes strength-

ened our beliefs as Christians? and How should President Bush as a Christian handle the war in Iraq? The school's effectiveness was acknowledged this year when it received accreditation from Christian Schools International.

King's Academy has clear expectations for student conduct. The school's creed reminds students to respect other people. Students are required to wear uniforms and to walk quietly in the halls with their hands behind them. The school encourages students to use the five Cs: common sense, care, courtesy, cooperation, and consideration. Parents receive a copy of the school's discipline policy, which describes conduct that the school expects and explains how misbehavior will be handled. Christian education, says administrator Marilyn McVicker, must also involve "our lifestyle and our relationships with others."

The school accepts private-pay students and participates in the Milwaukee Parental Choice Program, which pays the tuition of students from low-income families who choose to send their children to private schools. In both cases, kids of the kingdom are learning to serve their King.
