composition of the safety commission:

1. One-third of the members shall be representatives of private agencies and organizations providing public safety education and injury prevention training.

2. The matters of safety under the review of the commission shall include, but not be limited to, motor vehicle, pedestrian, bicycle, water, fire and firearm safety and accidental poisoning.

3. The commission shall be responsible for the coordination of citywide cooperative public safety actions involving public and private agencies and organizations.

4. Each year, and with the assistance of the police department and department of public works, the commission shall prepare and submit to the common council a report summarizing the status of the matters of safety the commission has the responsibility to review. The reports shall include, but not be limited to, recommendations on appropriate actions necessary or advisable to be taken by the various departments, boards, commissions or agencies or by the mayor and common council to reduce the rates of accident occurrences, and comparison and analysis of citywide public safety actions over time to determine the extent of progress being made to reduce and eliminate the public safety matter.
