Charter Prospectus Concerns- Global Academic and Nursing Education Leader

City of Milwaukee Charter School Committee Members,

Schools and Communities United are skeptical that this educational program would be able to adequately prepare students as well as fiscal concerns about chartering more schools despite Milwaukee's declining birth rates.

Our current concerns are detailed below:

1. Will the program approved by the Department of Health Services?
2. How many hours is the CNA training program?
3. Who will administer the CNA program training so the students are ready to pass the state exam?
4. No program has a 100% pass rate. What happens to students who don't pass the state exam the first time?
5. Who pays for the exam?
6. Will students have clinical hours, how many, and where will they do their clinical hours?
7. What is the plan to find qualified teachers who can "thread the Nursing Program" through all of the high school courses when they plan to pay an average salary of \$30,000?
8. Having a CNA program taught by instructors with real life healthcare experience is absolutely vital for this type of program. How many of their teachers will be certified teachers AND have clinical healthcare experience?
9. What will the financial impact of this school be on Milwaukee Public Schools?

It's also important to note that the RLLB Global Nurse Leaders Academies school continues to shop around for a chartering authority and continues to be denied. Their previous applications were denied by the City of Milwaukee Charter School Review Committee in 2014 and Wauwatosa as well. Unfortunately, the 4/2/2014 CSRC minutes and video are not publicly available on the website at this time to reference.

This proposal leaves more questions than answers. We look forward to these and any other questions being addressed during the review process.
