SWORN CHARGES BY CHIEF OF POLICE FOR REVOCATION OF LICENSE

Pursuant to Wisconsin Statutes Section 125.12 and Sections 90-12 and 85-4, Milwaukee Code of Ordinances ("MCO"), Chief of Police Edward Flynn, a City of Milwaukee resident and interested party, by Captain Leslie Thiele, Commander of Police District 1, City of Milwaukee resident and interested party, being first duly sworn and upon her oath, respectfully charges the following based upon review of official Milwaukee Police Department ("MPD") reports drafted in the ordinary course of business, review of documents received by MPD District 1 and communication with other police and municipal officials:

1. Man F. Zhang (DOB 1/6/1978) is the agent of Kiku LLC (collectively, the "Licensee"), the holder of a Class "B" Tavern license, a Cigarette and Tobacco license and a Food Dealer – Restaurant license for the licensed premises known as Kiku located at 200 West Wisconsin Avenue, Milwaukee, Wisconsin.

2. On May 4, 2014, MPD performed an underage tavern enforcement initiative using MPD Police Aides who were under the age of 21. The Police Aides were instructed they could not lie if asked if they were underage or show any form of documentation, which could be construed as identification. At 1:10 a.m. an undercover Police Aide and Police Officer successfully gained entry in Kiku. The Police Aide approached the bar and ordered and was served a beer. The Police Aide was not challenged for identification to verify her age at any point

even though there was a security guard at the door. Mr. Zhang was cited for Sale of Alcohol to Underaged Person (case #14041936). On September 26, 2014, Mr. Zhang was found guilty.

3. On October 20, 2014, Kiku was scheduled for its renewal hearing before the Licenses Committee for its Class "B" Tavern license. The Licenses Committee recommended nonrenewal based on a second nonappearance.

4. On November 5, 2014, the Common Council approved the nonrenewal recommendation.

5. On January 6, 2015, Mr. Zhang appeared before the Licenses Committee on behalf of Kiku for a new Class "B" Tavern application. Mr. Zhang's counsel stated that in response to the May 4, 2014 sale to underage person violation, Mr. Zhang has a trained security guard and all patrons will be carded. Mr. Zhang stated that the individuals who sold alcohol without a license were terminated. Based on statements at the hearing from Mr. Zhang's counsel and witnesses testifying on behalf of Kiku, there was a decrease in business since Kiku's Class "B" Tavern license was approved for nonrenewal. A security guard testified that the procedure is to check identification. The Licenses Committee recommended approval, holding item #9 (related to an open child abuse felony case, 2013CF04453). At the hearing, Mr. Zhang's counsel stated the underlying event for item #9 occurred upstairs from Kiku "probably" during business hours.

6. On January 21, 2015, the Common Council approved Kiku's Class "B" Tavern license.

7. On February 27, 2015, MPD performed a districtwide underage tavern enforcement initiative using MPD Police Aides who were under the age of 21. The undercover Police Aides were instructed they could not lie if asked if they were underage or show any form

of documentation, which could be construed as identification. At 1:20 a.m. an undercover Police Aide and undercover Police Officer successfully gained entry in Kiku and were seated by a waitress. The undercover Police Aide ordered and was served a beer. Neither the undercover Police Aide nor the undercover Police Officer were asked for identification at any point. While sitting in Kiku, a marked police squad drove past the business. The hostess started telling people the police are driving around. At that time, some individuals started to put the hoods of their sweatshirts up over their head, hid alcohol beverages and started walking back towards the back of the establishment and into the bathroom. The undercover Police Officer overhead comments like, "As long as they don't come in here." The hostess then walked to the undercover Police Aide's and undercover Police Officer's table and had two bright orange wristbands in her hand and asked to see identification cards. The undercover Police Aide stated she did not have her identification card and the undercover Police Officer advised she was only drinking water but still showed her identification card. The undercover Police Officer was over the age of 21. The hostess placed the wristband on the undercover Police Officer's left wrist and stated to the undercover Police Aide, "If the cops come in here, push the beer to her." The undercover Police Aide and undercover Police Officer agreed. Uniformed Police Officers entered Kiku and asked the undercover Police Aide and undercover Police Officer to leave the premises and speak with them. As the undercover Police Aide and undercover Police Officer went to the bar to pay for the beer, the hostess stated, "If the cops ask, say you were drinking the beer" and pointed to the undercover Police Officer. The undercover Police Aide and undercover Police Officer agreed and left Kiku. Kiku was cited for Sale of Alcohol to Underaged Person (citation # 61568710). The citation is pending a pre-trial on July 13, 2015.

8. On March 7, 2015, MPD performed an underage tavern enforcement initiative

using MPD Police Aides who were under the age of 21. The Police Aides were instructed they could not lie if asked if they were underage or show any form of documentation, which could be construed as identification. At 12:15 a.m. an undercover Police Aide and Police Officer successfully gained entry in Kiku without being asked for identification. While inside, the Police Aide and Police Officer were asked for identification by security. Both the undercover Police Aide and undercover Police Officer stated they did not have any identification. Mr. Zhang approached them and asked if they were going to order drinks or food, and they stated they were only going to order food. They were ushered to a nearby table and given menus. Approximately 10 minutes later, the undercover Police Aide ordered and was served a bottled beer. When a waitress approached to take their food order, a uniformed Police Sergeant and uniformed Police Officer entered Kiku. At that time, the waitress asked for identification, which the undercover Police Aide denied having. The waitress then said, "Ok, um, I'll just take away (the beer) for a little bit OK." When the undercover Police Officer asked why, the waitress responded, "The police are coming, then I'll bring it back." Mr. Zhang approached the table and agreed to remove the beer from the bill because it was taken away while the police were present. The waitress then indicated she would return the beer when the police left. The waitress also indicated they could come back the next night without identification, stating "I know who you guys are so I'll be like" (and made a motion indicating she will recognize re-entry without identification). When the undercover Police Aide and undercover Police Officer left Kiku, the security guard asked why they were leaving so soon. The undercover Police Officer stated her friend (referring to the Police Aide) felt uncomfortable due the police presence inside. One of the security officers stated that if they sat back in the restaurant they would be okay, as police typically do not check back there. At that point, Mr. Zhang approached and stated, "Just go, just go." The uniformed Police

Sergeant and uniformed Police Officer approached Mr. Zhang and informed him Kiku was found in violation during that tavern check and a prior tavern check on February 27, 2015. Mr. Zhang told MPD it was impossible that Kiku was found in violation as each patron is required to provide identification prior to being allowed entry. Kiku was cited for Sale of Alcohol to Underaged Person (citation # 61569421). The citation is pending a pre-trial on July 13, 2015.

9. The March 7, 2015 violation was recorded with an undercover camera. It is attached as **Exhibit A**.

10. On April 17, 2015, MPD performed an underage tavern enforcement initiative using a MPD Police Aide who was under the age of 21. The undercover Police Aide was instructed she could not lie if asked if she was underage. At 11:00 p.m. an undercover Police Aide and undercover Police Officer successfully gained entry in Kiku without being asked for identification. While inside, the Police Aide and Police Officer were asked for identification by security. Both the undercover Police Aide and undercover Police Officer stated they did not have any identification and were denied entry. The undercover Police Aide and undercover Police Officer told security their identification was in the car and later returned with identification cards. The identification card the undercover Police Aide presented was for a 25 year old 5'5" female with shoulder length brown hair. The undercover Police Aide was 19 years old, 5'10" with long blond hair. A picture of the identification used and a picture of the undercover Police Aide on April 17, 2015 are attached as **Exhibit B** and **Exhibit C**, respectively. After the undercover Police Aide provided security her "identification" to the security guard, the security guard seemed unsure who the ID card belong to. Upon entry, the undercover Police Aide and undercover Police Officer ordered and were served beer and food. Kiku was cited for Sale of Alcohol to Underaged Person (citation # 61568905). The citation is pending an arraignment on

June 26, 2015.

11. The April 17, 2015 violation was recorded with an undercover camera. It is attached as **Exhibit D**.

12. On June 5, 2015 at approximately 1:30 pm, MPD and the Department of Revenue performed a compliance check on Kiku. The investigation revealed that Kiku was operating without a licensed person on premises. The manager on duty, who does not hold a Class "B" Manager's license, admitted to MPD that alcohol had been served and sold that day. The Department of Revenue found two contaminated liquor bottles. In addition, Kiku hung a banner sign facing the public indicating they are "Open Til 3 AM." The terms of Kiku's license restrict its operation from 11:00 am (12:00 pm on Sunday) until 2:00 am on weekdays and 2:30 am on weekends. Upon information and belief, Mr. Zhang was detained in the House of Corrections with Huber privileges (*see* ¶ 19 below); however, Mr. Zhang is not eligible for release to be on scene at the business until approximately 4:30 pm. Kiku was cited for Responsible Person on Premises Required (citation # 48973511132). The citation is pending initial appearance.

13. On June 9, 2015 at approximately 2:05 am (early Tuesday morning), MPD observed four subjects inside Kiku after closing hours. According to its plan of operation, the terms of its licenses and MCO 90-15, Kiku may be open until 2:00 am on weekdays. Mr. Zhang told the responding officer he was not in violation and offered to show MPD surveillance video. MPD viewed the surveillance video, which not only confirmed the presence of four patrons in Kiku after 2:00 am but it also showed Mr. Zhang remove glasses in front of two patrons and empty them in a drain upon arrival of MPD. Kiku was cited for Patrons After Hours (citations # 60909951-4). The citations are pending initial appearance.

14. On March 30, 2015, Kiku was offered enrollment into the Respect 21 diversion

program for the February 27, 2015 violation. In order to successfully complete Respect 21, Kiku would need to enroll in the program within two weeks (and pay the \$250 enrollment fee), successfully pass four mystery shopper inspections (with third-party inspectors 21 years old or older but young enough to trigger an ID check) in a six-month period, and not violate any provision of MCO ch. 85, 90 or 108 during that six-month period. Successful completion would result in Kiku not being issued a citation for the underlying February 27, 2015 violation. A copy of the enrollment letter is attached as **Exhibit E**.

15. On April 28, 2015, Kiku was notified that it had failed to successfully enroll in the program within two weeks. A copy of the failure to enroll letter is attached as **Exhibit F**. As a result, citation #61598710 was issued to Mr. Zhang.

16. On September 25, 2013, MPD located Mr. Zhang at Kiku and took him into custody as a wanted suspect. Because there was no other licensed person on premises, MPD advised the employees to close Kiku for the night. MPD returned the following night and observed Kiku was open and serving alcohol even though Mr. Zhang was still in custody and no other licensed person was on premises. MPD advised the employees to stop alcohol beverages sales and to not serve any until Mr. Zhang returned. On September 26, 2013, MPD returned to Kiku to find the premises was again operational and selling alcohol beverages. Kiku was ordered closed and Mr. Zhang cited for Responsible Person on Premises Required (case # 13096508). On May 15, 2014, Mr. Zhang was found guilty.

17. Mr. Zhang was previously cited for Responsible Person Upon Premise on October 18, 2010. On June 13, 2011, Mr. Zhang was found guilty (case #10128701).

18. On April 14, 2015, Mr. Zhang was found guilty of one count of misdemeanor bail jumping (Wis. Stat. § 946.49(1)(a)) for 2014CF002692. Mr. Zhang was sentenced to one day in

the House of Corrections (time served).

19. On April 14, 2014 Mr. Zhang was also found guilty of two counts of misdemeanor battery (Wis. Stat. § 940.19(1)), one count of intimidate victim/dissuade reporting (Wis. Stat. § 940.44(1)), and one count of disorderly conduct (Wis. Stat. § 947.01(1)) for 2013CF004453. Mr. Zhang was sentenced to 7 months in the House of Corrections for the first battery count, 7 months in the House of Corrections (imposed and stayed, consecutive to each other sentence) and 24 months probation (imposed, consecutive), 6 months in the House of Corrections for the disorderly conduct count (imposed and stayed, consecutive to each other sentence) and 24 months probation (imposed, consecutive), and 8 months in the House of Corrections for the second battery count (imposed and stayed, consecutive to each other sentence) and 24 months probation (imposed, consecutive). Mr. Zhang was granted Huber privileges for work only. According to statements made by Mr. Zhang's counsel during the January 6, 2015 Licenses Committee hearing, the underlying event occurred upstairs from Kiku during business hours.

20. One of the terms of Mr. Zhang's probation is absolute sobriety. A copy of the certified judgment of conviction for 2013CF004453 and 2014CF002692 is attached as **Exhibit G**. As of the date of this filing, Mr. Zhang is the Class "B" Tavern licensee and there is no Class "B" Manager license attributed to Kiku.

21. Mr. Zhang was previously cited for Presence of Minor at Licensed Premises on January 17, 2011. On June 23, 2011, Mr. Zhang was found guilty (case #11017201).

22. On the Auxiliary Questionnaire Alcohol Beverage License Application, Mr. Zhang checked "No" for "Have you ever been convicted of any violations of any county or municipal ordinances?" Mr. Zhang signed a notarized copy of the application on November 12,

2014. As of the November 12, 2014 date of signature, Mr. Zhang was convicted of the following six non-traffic municipal ordinances:

A copy of the Auxiliary Questionnaire Alcohol Beverage License Application is attached as **Exhibit H**.

23. A copy of the January 6, 2015 Licenses Committee is attached as **Exhibit I**.

24. Kiku is a repeat violator of the sale of alcohol to minors, presence of minor at licensed premises and responsible person on premises requirements, which has had a substantial adverse effect upon the health, safety or convenience and prosperity of the immediate neighborhood.

25. Kiku is operated in such a manner that it constitutes a public nuisance.

BASED UPON the May 4, 2014 sale of alcohol to a minor, the February 27, 2015 sale of alcohol to a minor, the March 7, 2015 sale of alcohol to a minor, the April 17, 2015 sale of alcohol to a minor, the June 5, 2015 responsible person on premises violation, the June 9, 2015 patrons after hours violations, Kiku’s employees’ multiple attempts to conceal the sale of alcohol violations from authorities, recent criminal convictions of the registered agent, Man Zhang, for criminal activity that occurred above Kiku “probably” during Kiku business hours, previous convictions

of presence of minor and responsible person on premises requirements, the drain on police resources to perform compliance checks and the repeated failure to instill a meaningful procedure to comply with alcohol laws as they relate to the sale of minors, which has cumulatively had a substantial adverse effect upon the health, safety or convenience and prosperity of the immediate neighborhood;

THE CHIEF OF POLICE, by his designee, respectfully requests the immediate revocation of the Class "B" Tavern license relative to the above-referenced Licensee and licensed premise because:


1. Pursuant to Wis. Stat. Secs. 125.04(5)(a)-(b) and Wis. Stat. Sec. 125.12(2)(ag)4., the Licensee has an arrest or conviction record and/or has habitually been a law offender for offenses that substantially relate to the circumstances of the license;
2. Pursuant to Wis. Stat. Sec. 125.07(1), Kiku has repeatedly sold alcohol beverages to underage persons;
3. Pursuant to Wis. Stat. Sec. 125.12(2)(ag)1., the Licensee has violated Wis. Stat. ch. 125 and municipal regulations;
4. Pursuant to MCO 90-12-1-a and MCO 85-34, the Licensee made a material false statement on the Auxiliary Questionnaire Alcohol Beverage License Application by checking "No" for "Have you ever been convicted of any violations of any county or municipal ordinances?";
5. Pursuant to MCO 90-12-1-c, the Licensee has violated state law and city ordinance prohibiting the sale of intoxicating liquors or fermented malt beverages to underage persons;

6. Pursuant to MCO 90-12-1-d, Kiku has violated the following provisions: (1) operating after close of business hours (MCO 90-15); (2) sale to underage persons (MCO 90-18); and (3) presence of underage persons (MCO 90-19);
7. Pursuant to MCO 85-4-4-c and 90-12-1-f, Kiku is operated in such a manner that it constitutes a public or private nuisance and that conduct at Kiku, including but not limited to the repeated sale of alcohol to underage persons, operation after hours, and repeated failure to have a responsible person on premises, has had a substantial adverse effect upon the health, safety or convenience and prosperity of the immediate neighborhood; and
8. Pursuant to MCO 90-12-1-i and MCO 85-4-4-c-22, there are other reasonable causes which are in the best interests, public safety, welfare and good order of the City of Milwaukee, including:
 - a. **Failure to implement meaningful ID checks:** Despite statements made at the January 6, 2015 Licenses Committee hearing by Mr. Zhang's counsel that Kiku had implemented an identification check procedure, Kiku failed to prevent an underage person from purchasing alcohol beverages on all three subsequent undercover compliance checks. On two of those occasions, Kiku failed to utilize any form of an identification check. On the third occasion, Kiku unreasonably relied upon a clearly false form of identification. Each of these failed compliance checks were made within three and a half months of the Licenses Committee hearing.
 - b. **Attempts to Obstruct Police Investigation:** During both the February 27, 2015 and March 7, 2015 undercover compliance checks, Kiku staff members advised

the undercover underage Police Aide how to avoid detection from MPD if the police entered Kiku. In the February 27, 2015 compliance check, the employee told the Police Aide to "push the beer" to the above-aged undercover Police Officer if the police entered and the hostess told the undercover Police Aide to tell the police the undercover Police Officer was drinking the beer. In the March 7, 2015 compliance check, the employee stated she would take the beer away when the police arrived and then give it back when the police left.

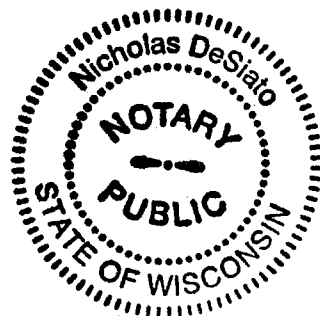

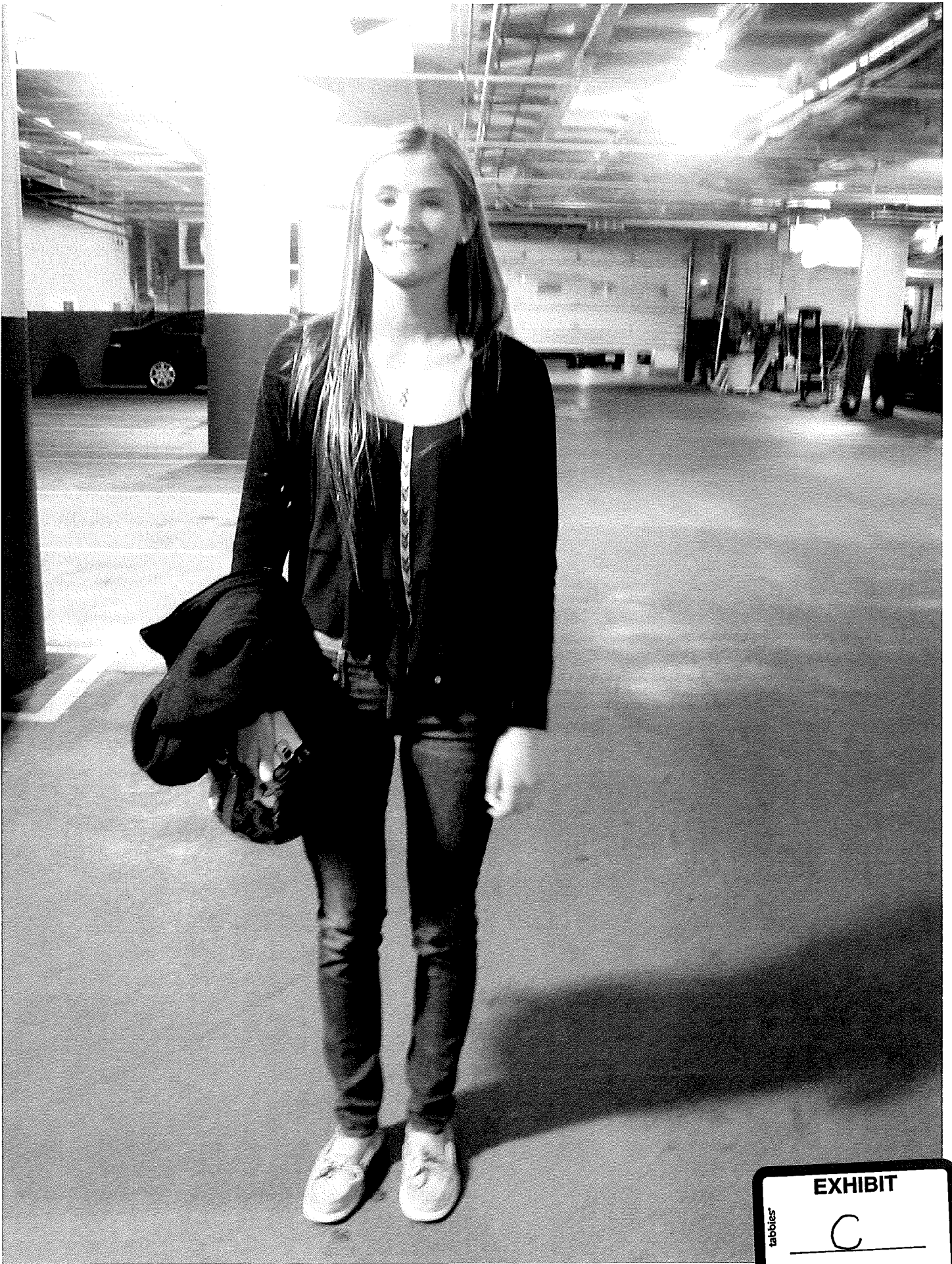

Re: Notice to Enroll in Municipal Citation Diversion Program – “Respect 21”

Dear Man F. Zhang:

This letter is notice to you that the Milwaukee Police Department has found your business, Kiku, located at 200 W. Wisconsin Av. in violation of Milwaukee Code of Ordinances § 90-18-1-a-2 (Presence of Minor at Licensed Premises) AND/OR Milwaukee Code of Ordinances 90-18-1-a-2 (Sale to Minor) on 02/27/15. As an individual or entity that is licensed or subject to a license in the operation of a business upon the premises, you are a responsible party for licensed-related violations that occur at your business.

The sale or offering of sale of alcohol to underage persons or persons not permitted by your alcohol license is a serious offense that may have an adverse impact on the maintenance or future issuance of your license.

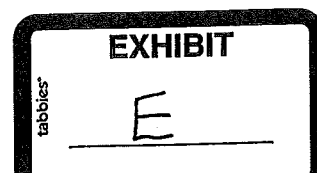
In lieu of having a citation(s) issued for the above violation(s), you are eligible to enroll in a municipal citation diversion program called “Respect 21.” If you successfully complete Respect 21, your citation(s) will not be issued. The Enrollment Form and Program Agreement are included with this letter.

Upon enrollment in Respect 21, you will be contacted by the program administrator, the Responsible Retailing Forum (“RRForum”). RRForum will arrange for a Mystery Shopper to visit your business on four separate occasions within a six-month period to observe if your staff is correctly checking IDs. The Mystery Shopper is age 21 or older but young enough to trigger an ID check by a clerk, doorman or server. The Mystery Shopper will attempt to enter your establishment and purchase or be served an alcoholic beverage.

In order to successfully complete Respect 21 and not have the underlying citation(s) issued, you must:

- Enroll in the program by submitting the attached form within two weeks of the date of this letter. There is a \$250 enrollment fee, which is less than the forfeiture amount of the citation(s);

IN SOME JOBS, SUCCESS IS MEASURED BY WHAT DOESN'T HAPPEN.



- Successfully pass all four Mystery Shopper inspections; AND
- Not violate any provision of Milwaukee Code of Ordinances ch. 85 (general licensing requirements), ch. 90 (liquor laws), or ch. 108 (public entertainment premises) for six months as of the date of this notice.

If you do not timely enroll in or successfully complete Respect 21, the underlying citation(s) will be issued.

In addition, the Milwaukee Police Department may issue a Licensed Premises Report for the underlying violation(s). However, if you successfully complete the Respect 21 program, a subsequent Licensed Premises Report will be issued to acknowledge that your business has enrolled in and completed this abatement program. The Milwaukee Police Department strongly encourages you to take advantage of this opportunity and enroll. Enrollment in the program is not an admission of guilt.

This letter is notice to you that you failed to successfully complete Respect 21 because you did not timely enroll in Respect 21. As such, your business will be cited for the underlying violation(s).

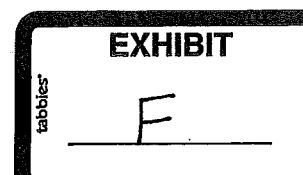
