PASSAGE OF THE FOLLOWING:

[241341](#) A substitute ordinance establishing a pedestrian mall to be known as “Nativity Jesuit Pedestrian Mall” in South 29th Street from West Orchard Street to a point approximately 180 feet south of West Orchard Street, in the 8th Aldermanic District. Whereas, The City of Milwaukee desires to establish a pedestrian mall to be known as “Nativity Jesuit Pedestrian Mall” in South 29th Street, from West Orchard Street to a point approximately 180 feet south of West Orchard Street, in the 8th Aldermanic District; and

Whereas, In accordance with s. 62.71(4), Wis. Stats., the Common Council finds that:

- a. The proposed pedestrian mall will be located adjacent to a business district as it is in the vicinity of storefronts at the intersection of West Greenfield Avenue and South Layton Boulevard, as well as nearby schools and hospital.
- b. Reasonably convenient alternate routes exist for private vehicles to traverse around the proposed pedestrian mall.
- c. Continued, unlimited use by private vehicles of the proposed pedestrian mall would endanger pedestrian safety.
- d. Properties abutting the proposed pedestrian mall can be provided reasonably and adequately with emergency vehicle services, as well as delivery and receiving of merchandise or materials, from other streets or alleys.
- e. It is in the public interest to use the proposed pedestrian mall for pedestrian purposes.
- f. Preparation of preliminary plans, acquisition of land, and use of public funds are unnecessary to improve the proposed pedestrian mall, considering that all plans and improvements will be completed and paid for by a private entity upon:
 - i. Review and recommendation by the City Plan Commission.
 - ii. Approval of plans for these improvements by the Common Council.

The Mayor and Common Council of the City of Milwaukee do ordain as follows:

Part 1. Section 113-26 of the code is created to read:

113-26. Nativity Jesuit Pedestrian Mall.

1. CREATED. In accordance with s.66.0905 and 62.71, Wis. Stats., a pedestrian mall is established in an area previously used for vehicular thoroughfare in South 29th Street from West Orchard Street to a point approximately 180 feet south of West Orchard Street. The designated area shall be limited to pedestrian and bicycle users, and to emergency, public works maintenance, and utility transportation vehicles.

2. AREA AND LOCATIONS. The area and location to be included in the pedestrian mall established under this section is specifically described as follows: Commencing at the Northeast Corner of the Northeast Quarter of Section 1, Township 6 North, Range 21 East, City of Milwaukee, Milwaukee County, Wisconsin; thence South 88 degrees 14 minutes 18 seconds West along the North line of the Northeast Quarter, aforesaid, a distance of 692.93 feet; thence South 00 degrees 34 minutes 22 seconds East, 380.76 feet to the Northeast Corner of Lot 1 of Certified Survey Map No. 9047 as recorded in Document 10787136, Milwaukee County Records, said point also being the Point of Beginning; thence North 89 degrees 25 minutes 38 seconds East, 60.00 feet to a point in the East right-of-way line of South 29th Street; South 00 degrees 34 minutes 22 seconds East, 179.78 feet; thence South 89 degrees 25 minutes 14 seconds West, 60.00 feet to a point in the East line of said Lot 1 and the Westerly right-of-way of South 29th Street; thence North 00 degrees 34' minutes 22 seconds West, along said East line and Westerly right-of-way line 179.79 feet to the Point of Beginning.

5. [241588](#) Resolution relating to acceptance and execution of funding of a Green Solutions grant from the Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewerage District for the installation of permeable pavers, vegetated swales and bioswales on West Lisbon Avenue from North 100th

Street to West Burleigh Street as part of the Wisconsin Department of Transportation's street reconstruction project, in the 5th and 10th Aldermanic Districts.

Whereas, Green infrastructure, such as vegetated swales, bioswales and permeable pavements, reduce the volume of stormwater in the sewer system and the amount of pollutants discharged to surface waters; and

Whereas, MMSD desires to promote the installation of Best Management Practices such as vegetated swales, bioswales and permeable pavements and is willing to provide the City funding as part of its Green Solutions Program; and

Whereas, The Common Council File Numbers 241189 authored the reconstruction of West Lisbon Avenue from North 100th Street to West Burleigh Street; and

Whereas, The City and WisDOT have prepared plans to install bioswales, vegetated swales in the terrace areas and permeable pavers in the parking lanes of West Lisbon Avenue from North 100th Street to West Burleigh Street; and

Whereas, The cost of the green infrastructure portion is approximately \$1,200,000; and

Whereas, The City will also enter into a post installation Maintenance Covenant with MMSD after the completion of the project and the template Maintenance Covenant is submitted to this file; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, By the Common Council of the City of Milwaukee, that the Department of Public Works, Infrastructure Services Division is hereby authorized to apply, accept, and execute grant funding for the projects from the Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewerage District under the terms specified above; and be it

Resolved, That the Commissioner of Public Works is authorized to accept MMSD Green Solutions Funding in accordance with Milwaukee Code of Ordinances 304-81; and, be it

Resolved, That the Commissioner of Public Works is authorized to accept MMSD Green Solutions Funding in accordance with Milwaukee Code of Ordinances 304-81; and, be it

Further Resolved, That the Green Solutions funding agreement (G98005P161) and a template post installation maintenance covenant submitted to this file are hereby approved, and City personnel, including the DPW Commissioner, are authorized: (i) to cause the City to enter those documents in the same form, or in substantially the same form and substance, as have been submitted to this file; and (ii) to take such

further acts as may be contemplated or required to be taken by the City thereunder so as to carry out the intent and purpose of this resolution and those documents; and, be it

Further Resolved, That upon approval of this Agreement, the City Comptroller is authorized to create within the Capital Grant and Aid Projects Fund the appropriate Project/Grant Chartfield Value for these projects, and transfer to these accounts the amount required under the agreement and City accounting policy, but not to exceed a ten percent increase of the total amounts reserved for the grantor’s share and local share or \$5,000, whichever is greater, as follows:

(2) The zoning map is amended to change the zoning for the property located at: 300 West Juneau Avenue, Tax Key No. 361-0409-110; 1225 North Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Drive, Tax Key No. 362-0470-100; 1245 North Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Drive, Tax Key No. 362-0469-100; 1224 North Vel R. Phillips Avenue, Tax Key No. 362-0471-100; and 1244 North Vel R. Phillips Avenue, Tax Key No. 362-0468-100 from General Planned Development (GPD) to a Detailed Planned Development (DPD).

(3) The requirements set forth in said detailed plan attached to this Common Council File as Exhibit A, constitute the zoning regulations for the area contained in such planned development district described, provided further, that the effect of the approval of such detailed plan is that such plan shall limit and control construction, location, use and operation of all land and structures included within the detailed plan to all conditions and limitations set forth in such detailed plan.
