Adopting the Capital Budget of the District for the 2002 Fiscal Year

RESOLVED, by the Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewerage Commission that the Executive Director's proposed 2002 Capital Budget, setting forth the anticipated revenues and available funds of the District for capital purposes of \$168,949,000 and the anticipated capital expenditures of the District of \$236,705,000 resulting in an new local share of \$67,756,000 for the fiscal year ending December 31, 2002 is hereby adopted, and that \$82,760,00 in anticipated 2001 capital funds on hand be carried over into the 2002 fiscal year as follows:

Tax Stabilization Fund

\$82,760,000

Item 24

Levying of Taxes for District Capital Purposes for the 2002 Fiscal Year

RESOLVED, by the Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewerage Commission that:

- 1. In order to finance the acquisition, extension, planning, design, construction, adding to or improvement of land, waters, property or facilities for sewerage purposes as provided in the 2002 fiscal year capital budget of the District, there is hereby levied in the year 2001, upon all taxable property in the District (as equalized for State purposes), in addition to all other State Taxes, a non-repealable, direct annual tax in an amount sufficient for the purposes listed below:
- 2. The 2001 taxes of the District for 2002 purposes, which include:
- a. \$19,407,000 for debt service coming due in 2002 on outstanding general obligation bonds of the District (for which a non-repealable direct annual tax has previously been levied by the Commission) less amount deposited in the debt service fund created for the general obligation bonds; and
- b. \$20,384,00 for debt service coming due in 2002 on outstanding general obligation bonds of the District which debt was sold to the State of Wisconsin Clean Water Fund Program (for which a non-repealable direct annual tax has previously been levied by the Commission) less amounts deposited in the debt service fund created for the general obligation bonds; and
- c. \$2,516,000 for debt service coming due in 2002 on new anticipated general obligation notes of the District to be sold to the State of Wisconsin Clean Water Fund Program; and
- d. \$25,449,000 to finance a portion of the 2002 fiscal year capital budget;

totaling \$67,756,000, shall be carried on to the tax roll of each city, town or village wholly or partially within the boundaries of the District and collected in addition to all other taxes and in the same manner and at the same time, all as provided by law.
