HASS AVOCADO FARMING -BOMET EAST AND NAROK SOUTH

Avocado farming was started in 2016 with initial support of 40 seedlings, at Kshs.1000, to farmers by a white family

> About 200 famers - men and women received seedlings. The women participants included widows and single mothers.

> > 54 farmers are currently harvesting avocados. The number is expected to increase to 100 by 2025.
