  - The Milwaukee Police Department is the host agency for the Southeast Wisconsin Threat Analysis Center (STAC), an all crimes, all threats, information sharing fusion center for the eight counties of Southeast Wisconsin including Milwaukee, Waukesha, Racine, Kenosha, Walworth Ozaukee, Washington, and Dodge.
