Please be advised that the Operating Engineers and their Contractors have an agreement providing for the following rates of wages and fringe benefits **effective June 1, 2003**.

6-1-03 PER HOUR

- 1. (A) Cranes, Tower cranes, and Derricks with or without attachments with a lifting capacity of over 100 tons or Cranes, Tower cranes and Derricks with boom, leads, and/or jib lengths measuring 176 feet or longer, Boring machines (directional), Master mechanic or Foreman. There will be a premium of the higher of \$.50 per 100 ton or per one hundred feet of boom (or any portion thereof) for the length of boom over 200 feet or lifting capacity of the crane over 200 tons to a maximum of 500 tons or 500 feet if CCO certification is required a ten(\$.10) cent per hour increase will be paid for all cranes.... \$29.79

OTE:

THE LENGTH OF BOOM ON WHICH TOWER CRANE LONG BOOM WAGE RATE SHALL BE BASED IS THE DISTANCE FROM THE GROUND BASE LEVEL OF THE TOWER TO THE POINT OF INTERSECTION AND FROM THE CENTERLINE OF THE BOOM TO THE TIP OF THE BOOM. IN THE CASE OF CRAWLER OR MOBILE CRANES, WHERE THE TOWER CRANE ATTACHMENT IS MOUNTED, THE LONG BOOM PROVISIONS OF THIS AGREEMENT SHALL BE COMPUTED FROM THE BOOM PINS ON THE ROTATION BASE TO POINT SHEAVES.
