- 1. What are the goals, areas of mutual interest, and involvement between Milwaukee and the sister city based on the areas of culture, business, and/or any other aspects for the past reporting year? The goals of Milwaukee Action Network Inc (MANI) are:
 - Foster Cultural Exchange: MANI aims to promote cultural exchange and understanding between Milwaukee 0 and its sister cities, including Abuja. This involves facilitating opportunities for residents of both cities to engage in cross-cultural activities, such as educational programs, art exhibitions, music festivals, and cultural exchanges.
 - Enhance Economic Cooperation: MANI seeks to strengthen economic ties between Milwaukee and its sister 0 cities by encouraging trade, investment, and business collaborations. By fostering economic cooperation, MANI aims to create opportunities for job growth, entrepreneurship, and economic development in both cities.

As part of its goals, MANI aims to facilitate technology skill transfer and growth between Milwaukee and its sister cities. This involves promoting knowledge sharing, technology partnerships, and collaborative projects that foster innovation, digital literacy, and technological advancements. By facilitating the exchange of technology expertise and resources, MANI strives to enhance the technological capabilities and competitiveness of both Milwaukee and its sister cities, contributing to their overall growth and development.

• Activity: Medical Supplies Donation Drive

- Objective: Improve healthcare access in Abuja by providing essential medical supplies.
- Action Taken: Partnered with local NGO to collect surplus medical equipment, including personal protective equipment (PPE), and other critical supplies. These were organized and shipped to Abuja, ensuring the items met Nigeria's healthcare needs.
- Methods Used:
 - Community outreach efforts and partnerships with local NGO/healthcare providers helped gather supplies.
 - o Collaboration with logistics companies for efficient international shipping and customs handling.
 - Regular communication with Abuja medical institutions to identify specific needs and ensure the supplies reached the right hands.

• Activity: Technology Skill Transfer Program (Planned)

- Objective: To empower young professionals and innovators in Abuja with essential technology skills to foster growth in tech industries.
- Planned Action: Development of a series of technology workshops and bootcamps that will introduce participants to software development, cybersecurity, and digital entrepreneurship. Milwaukee tech experts will collaborate with Abuja-based tech hubs to deliver the training.
- Planned Methods:
 - A hybrid learning model combining virtual instruction from Milwaukee and in-person mentorship in Abuja.
 - 0 A focus on both theoretical and practical applications, with hands-on projects for participants.
 - Long-term partnerships with local Abuja tech startups to ensure ongoing mentorship and project incubation.

 - **Objective:** Address equipment shortages in Abuja by providing functional firefighting gear no longer in active use by Milwaukee's fire department.

- Action Plan: Milwaukee's fire department will assess, refurbish, and ship surplus fire equipment, including hoses, protective gear, helmets, and other essentials. All equipment will be inspected to ensure it meets safety standards before donation.
- **Outcome:** This donation will significantly increase Abuja's inventory of reliable firefighting equipment, allowing teams to operate more safely and efficiently during emergencies.

In-Person, Hands-On Training in Abuja:

- Equipment Operation and Maintenance: Milwaukee firefighters will travel to Abuja to train local teams on the donated equipment, demonstrating proper operation, upkeep, and repairs. Training will emphasize safe handling practices and situational use.
- **Live Fire and Rescue Drills:** Firefighters in Abuja will engage in practical simulations, such as fire suppression and rescue operations, under the guidance of Milwaukee firefighters. This hands-on approach will allow Abuja's team to practice critical skills in real-time scenarios.
- Emergency Medical Skills for First Responders: Hands-on training will cover essential first aid, CPR, and trauma care, preparing Abuja firefighters to provide emergency care on-site during rescue operations.

3. Please identify the progress made (or lack thereof) for the goals, objectives, and activities of the organization regarding the sister city relationship for the past year.

• For the past year, the Milwaukee-Abuja Sister Cities relationship has made measurable progress in several areas, particularly in the provision of medical supplies to Abuja. However, there has been limited progress on the Technology Skill Transfer and Growth initiative, as it remains in the planning phase.

• Progress Made:

• Medical Supplies to Abuja:

• Improve healthcare infrastructure in Abuja by providing critical medical supplies.

- Progress:
 - A successful donation drive was organized in Milwaukee, resulting in the collection and shipment of vital medical equipment and supplies to Abuja. The supplies, including PPE, syringes, and diagnostic tools, were delivered to medical institutions in Abuja, filling a significant gap in available resources.
- Educational Exchange and Scholarship Program for Abuja Municipal High School (Planned)
- Memorandum of Understanding (MOU):
 - Objective: Establish a formal partnership with **Leading Change** to oversee program management, ensuring effective coordination between institutions.
- **Progress:** The MOU has been developed, defining each partner's roles, responsibilities, and objectives for the program's success.

Technology Skill Transfer and Growth (Planning Phase):

- Goal: Develop a technology skill transfer initiative to foster innovation and entrepreneurship in Abuja's tech community.
- Progress:

- Preliminary planning for the tech and knowledge exchange programs has been completed, MOU developed with a local NGO with a framework for scholarship, training and mentorship.
- Partnerships with MATC and local hubs in Madison, Wisconsin are being explored to ensure strong support for future participants.
- **Challenges:** The program remains in the planning phase, and its implementation has been delayed due to logistical challenges and the need for further funding and resource allocation.

• Lack of Progress:

• Technology Skill Transfer and Growth:

- While detailed planning has been completed, no concrete actions have been taken to launch the initiative. The lack of funding and coordination with on-ground partners has contributed to delays. Additional resources and collaborations are required to move from planning to execution.

- Firefighter Skill Exchange Program (Proposed) Donation of Equipment and In-Person, Hands-On Training in Abuja): Enhance the firefighting and emergency response capacity in Abuja through skill-building, knowledge exchange, and critical resource support.

• Program Goal Established:

- Objective: The goal is to develop a program to build firefighting and emergency response skills for Abuja firefighters, utilizing Milwaukee's resources and expertise.
- Progress: The primary goal has been defined, and initial intentions were shared at a past Sister Cities meeting. However, specifics on activities, timeline, and resource allocation are pending formal input from the Milwaukee Fire Chief.

- Tentative Support Indicated: Background: During a previous Sister Cities meeting, a tentative agreement was reached to explore collaboration on this initiative. However, formal endorsement and detailed input from the Milwaukee Fire Chief are required to move forward.

• Lack of Additional Progress:

- No Formal Activities Initiated: No equipment donations, training content development, or mentorship arrangements have been made due to the pending agreement.
- Pending Milestones: In-person training planning, resource allocation, and coordination with Abuja fire officials are on hold until we have a finalized agreement with the Milwaukee Fire Department.

• Next Steps:

- Secure Formal Agreement with Milwaukee Fire Chief: Await input to finalize the program framework and obtain formal approval to proceed.
- Define Action Plan Post-Agreement: Once agreed, establish a clear action plan for equipment donation, training design, and schedule for in-person activities in Abuja.

Medical Supplies to Abuja

• Outcome: Medical Supplies Delivered

- **Result:** Over \$50,000.00 worth of medical supplies were successfully shipped to Abuja, including PPE (masks, gloves, gowns), diagnostic tools (stethoscopes, blood pressure monitors), syringes, and bandages.
- **Measurement:** Inventory logs confirmed the collection and shipment of over 1,500 items, and delivery confirmations were received from healthcare partners in Abuja

Structuring Technology Skill Transfer and Growth (Proposed Phase)

• Outcome: Development of Program Framework

- **Result:** A complete program framework was developed, detailing the structure for a 3-week tech bootcamp and monthly knowledge exchange sessions.
- **Measurement:** A formalized project plan was drafted, outlining the curriculum, partner engagement, and timelines for program rollout. This plan was shared with key stakeholders in both Milwaukee and Abuja for feedback and refinement.

• Outcome: Partnership with Local Abuja Tech Hubs (Proposed)

- **Result:** Preliminary discussions were initiated with two major tech hubs in Abuja for future collaboration on the technology skill transfer initiative. While formal agreements are still pending, initial interest has been secured.
- **Measurement:** Memoranda of understanding (MOUs) are in development, with both Milwaukee and Abuja partners engaging in planning meetings to finalize partnership terms.

Student Enrollment in Exchange Program (planned):

- **Projected Outcome:** Successfully enrolled 10 students from Abuja Municipal High School in MATC and UWM's exchange and scholarship programs within the first year.

- **Projected Result**: Abuja firefighters report a 30% increase in operational readiness with improved access to essential gear, allowing them to handle emergency calls more safely and effectively.
- Measurement: Post-donation surveys and feedback sessions with Abuja fire departments will gauge equipment impact on response times, safety, and overall readiness.
