I met Mollie and became familiar with On Purpose Journey, Inc. a year ago. The soldier who was driving the HUMVEE and was severely injured when our son was killed in Iraq was invited to attend a function sponsored by Mollie's group. When he shared his story with her, he mentioned the Castners. Mollie contacted me and invited us to attend as well. Although her organization had not previously been involved with families of fallen soldiers, she reached out to us in a unique way. She managed to create a very special evening at a Milwaukee Admirals hockey match that included us, two Wounded Warriors and other veterans. The Admirals organization honored our son and the Wounded Warriors that evening. Since then that soldier, Jeff Vorpahl, has become actively involved in On Purpose Journey, Inc. by writing articles for the website sharing his experiences in Iraq.

Fast forward to this fall. Mollie asked me to speak at the dedication ceremony for her book, The Little White Truck With The Big Mission, at Milwaukee War Memorial Center. I was honored to participate to share my son's experiences on 9/11 as well as what had transpired in our lives since that fateful day. I had met Joe Campbell, one of the people involved in the story, seven years ago through his involvement in Being There – Reaching Out, Inc., an organization of Wisconsin families who have lost military members since 9/11. The dedication was very special to say the least. So many groups were brought together to remember what has happened since 9/11. Lives were forever changed. I felt that I was not only speaking for my son at that day but for all of the military personnel who have died since 9/11.

That day I purchased several copies of the book. I presented a copy to each of the elementary school IMCs in our school district in my son's memory. The IMC director was delighted to receive them and guaranteed that the books would become a part of commemorations of 9/11 in future years. They are too young to remember that day, but the book tells the story from the unique perspective of bringing a piece of the 9/11 steel to Milwaukee, Wisconsin.
