- I called the police because I have a valid and unexpired restraining order against Terrance Louis who was on my property at the time of the call.
- I complied with the police officers by showing them the restraining order and the CCTV video evidence of Terrance Louis on my property.
- I have attached a copy of the restraining order.

In response to the incident which occurred on April 9th, 2023

Gas N Go Enterprises, Inc took the following actions:

I personally attempted to defuse the fight between a mother and daughter by talking to the
mother and daughter and encouraging them to not fight and to peacefully leave the premises.
 They refused my plea. I was concerned for the safety of both the mother and daughter and
therefore I called the police so that no one would get harmed from the escalating argument.

- The officers recognized the mother and daughter because they frequently request police services from Milwaukee Police District 5. They know that these two often have great conflict. I would say it was a good thing that I contacted the police because the situation could have easily gotten worse since these two often have very aggressive arguments.
- I was then cooperative with responding police officers who helped to defuse the situation.

In response to the incident which occurred on August 8th, 2023

Gas N Go Enterprises, Inc took the following actions:

- The cashier recognized the two individuals who had arrived in the white Infinity as individuals who had stolen merchandise from my store in the past. When the cashier asked the individuals to leave the premise, they showed him a firearm. The cashier then called the police.
- The cashier complied with the police by showing them the CCTV video footage of the incident.
- To prevent this from happening again, we have a sign posted on the store front saying that weapons and firearms are not allowed in the store. A photo of this sign has been attached.

In response to the incident which occurred on August 12th, 2023

Gas N Go Enterprises, Inc took the following actions:

- The victim was shot off the premise of the business, he walked to our gas station and the cashier offered him shelter by allowing him inside and locking the door.
- The employee was helpful by calling police for a shooting that did not occur on our property but for the benefit of the victim's well being.
- The cashier was cooperative with the police and the investigation.

These actions demonstrate that Gas N Go Enterprises, Inc does and will always prioritize community safety.


