## **SANDRA HOEH**

*passed from this life on May 1, 2024 at the age of 82, and a celebration of life will be held August 17, 2024 in Belmont, Vermont; and*

**WHEREAS,** *Sandra Hoeh was born to Milton and Semah, and raised in Brooklyn's Brighton Beach, where she attended Manhattan's Little Red Schoolhouse and graduated from Elisabeth Irwin High School, before continuing her passion for education by attending the University of New Hampshire, where she earned a bachelor's degree in History and a Phi Beta Kappa key in 1963; and*

**WHEREAS,** *Sandra Hoeh, upon graduating, moved to Milwaukee in 1972, driven by a pursuit for better opportunities, she was elected Alderwoman for Milwaukee's 3<sup>rd</sup> District and served 13 years on the Common Council, and was the first woman to serve as vice-chair and chair of the Finance and Personnel Committee; and*

**WHEREAS,** *Sandra Hoeh was deeply involved in the community and local politics, and after her service on the Council, she served as the Sanitation Superintendent in the Department of Public Works as well as Assistant Chancellor for University Relations at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, and in 2003, she returned east to an appointment in Dartmouth College's Provost's Office where she was Director of Community Relations; and*

**WHEREAS,** *Sandra Hoeh was an involved member of her community until the end, and in her retirement she continued her involvement in local, state, and national campaigns and was a tireless proponent of peace, women's rights, civil rights, marriage equality, and justice; now, therefore, be it*

**RESOLVED,** *That the Common Council of the City of Milwaukee herewith offers its sincere condolences to the family and friends of Sandra Hoeh, who will be remembered fondly for her hard work, dedication, and love of her family and friends; and, be it*
