1. Description of Grant Project/Program (Include Target Locations and Populations):

The State of Wisconsin, Office of Justice Assistance is the State Administering Agency for federal justice and homeland security grant funds. Grant recipients use these funds to develop and implement innovative approaches for reducing crime and assisting crime victims, preparing and responding to acts of terrorism, and improving public safety radio communications and information sharing among first responders and public safety agencies. The Milwaukee Fire Department's application reflects the State of Wisconsin, Office of Justice Assistance goals to, in collaboration with the Milwaukee Public School district, take effective steps to prevent violent school crises from occurring, and in the worst case scenario, respond swiftly to minimize injury and loss of life.

3. Need for Grant Funds and Impact on Other Departmental Operations (Applies only to Programs):

These funds will augment City and grant funding related to protecting Milwaukee citizens from crime, fire and other hazards. The Milwaukee Fire Department has a direct interest in gun violence and safety. In 2005, the department documented 285 lives saved from gun shot wounds. From January 1, 2007 through September 2007 another 200 documented lives were saved. Without our advanced life support intervention, Milwaukee homicide rate would have been increased by 200 in 2007 alone.
