***WHEREAS,** For a century, Bay View High School has developed both musical and interscholastic sports programs, providing them resources for the last 50 years, preparing amateurs and professionals for a lifetime of music and developing champions who continued in sports after their high school careers, some of whom went on to achieve Olympic gold; now, therefore be it*
