Your Food Dealer License Application as agent for "Aadam Food LLC" for "Jay's Food" at 4402 W Center St.

There is a possibility that your application may be denied for one or more of the following reasons: The committee regarding the application shall be based on evidence presented at the hearing. Per MCO 85-2.7-4, probative evidence concerning whether or not a new license should be granted may be presented on the following subjects: whether or not the applicant meets the municipal requirements, the appropriateness of the location and premises where the licensed premises is to be located and whether use of the premises for the purposes or activities permitted by the license would tend to facilitate a public or private nuisance or create undesirable neighborhood problems such as disorderly patrons, unreasonably loud noise, litter, and excessive traffic and parking congestion. Probative evidence relating to these matters may be taken from the plan of operation submitted with the license application, if any, but shall not include the content of any music. Evidence regarding the fitness of the location of the premises to be maintained as the principal place of business, including but not limited to whether there is an overconcentration of businesses of the type for which the license is sought; whether the proposal is consistent with any pertinent neighborhood business or development plans, or the location's proximity to areas where children are typically present. The applicant's record in operating similarly licensed premises; and whether or not the applicant has been charged with or convicted of any felony, misdemeanor, municipal offense or other offense, the circumstances of which substantially relate to the activity to be permitted by the license being applied for or any other factor which reasonably relates to the public health, safety or welfare may also be considered. See attached police report or correspondence.

Notice for applicants with warrants or unpaid fines:

Proof of warrant satisfaction or payment of fines must be submitted at the hearing on the above date and time. Failure to comply with this requirement may result in a delay of the granting/denial of your application.

Failure to appear at this meeting may result in the denial of your license. Individual applicants must appear only in person or by an attorney. Corporate or Limited Liability applicants must appear only by the agent designated on the application or by an attorney. Partnership applicants must appear by a partner listed on the application or by an attorney. If you wish to do so and at your own expense, you may be accompanied by an attorney of your choosing to represent you at this hearing.

You will be given an opportunity to speak on behalf of the application and to respond and challenge any charges or reasons given for the denial. No petitions can be accepted by the committee, unless the people who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify. You may present witnesses under oath and you may also confront and cross-examine opposing witnesses under oath. If you have difficulty with the English language, you should bring an interpreter with you, at your expense, so that you can answer questions and participate in your hearing.

You may examine the application file at this office during regular business hours prior to the hearing date. Inquiries regarding this matter may be directed to the person whose signature appears below.

Limited parking for persons attending meetings during normal business hours is available at reduced rates (5 hour limit) at the Milwaukee Center on the southwest corner of Kilbourn Avenue and Water Street. You must present a copy of the meeting notice to the parking cashier.

I have been actively engaging in dialog, to humanize the faces of the community with the growing and active takeover of our community with disregard to safety and appearance, and noise that only attracts poor businesses to this area.

1- Parking currently we have two hour parking at this location, if this is not enforced we have people parking where they feel despite the city ordinances, see some attached pictures ( if more pictures are required let me know, we can add to the 200 you may already have.

Since the parking department is currently beginning to issue tickets, the trash cans on Center have been routinely knocked down, cars blasting music even though they are not in the cars.... in other words there is kickback. This not only detracts the safety for residents but also High school, Kindergarten school and church. **Maham is not an option as it only promotes** tragedy. This is a historic area Sherman to about 46th street and it is not designed for big cars and hanging out. Schools buses, church goers, city buses, high traffic, cruising, that center is currently experiencing.

My concerns:

The store's history, the owners and the business not actively calling police, or the city parking which has a direct effect on their own businesses. My talking with the other business is that he keeps his head low in fear of retaliation, no stress as he calls it.

2- They have mentioned they want to move the bus stops to accommodate their customers' parking habits. If the owners parked on the side streets they would have more parking space for the customers and they would walk our streets and perhaps have a greater desire to work for safety.

These businesses have created a killing field of parasitical economics.

have become territory. It is up to you guys to create a licensing process with these types of businesses that is actually enforceable and demands they engage in the safety around their business.

All businesses need to become residents acting like these business places are their private homes that demand constant upkeep.

The best thing I can think of is that you create a licensing honoring process which demands they engage in safety, cleanliness, noiseless imprint in our neighborhood. It is not about WINNING IT IS ABOUT SAFETY AND BECOMING A POSITIVE ASSET WITH THE ENVIRONMENT THEY PLACE THEIR BUSINESS IN TO MAKE MONEY. PLEASE USE YOUR EXPERIENCE AND YOUR WISDOM TO DEVELOP A BETTER WAY OF ENFORCEABLE LICENSING AND EVALUATE HOW THESE BUSINESSES CAN BECOME A VALUED ASSET TO THEIR NEIGHBORS. Those wishing to provide oral testimony via phone or internet are asked to contact the staff assistant, Yadira Melendez at (414) 286-2775 or stasst5@milwaukee.gov for necessary information. Please make such requests no later than one business day prior to the start of the meeting. You are not required to attend the hearing, but please see the information below if you would like to provide testimony. Once the Licenses Committee makes its recommendation, this recommendation is forwarded to the full Common Council for approval at its next regularly scheduled hearing.

# Important details for those wishing to provide information for the Licenses Committee to consider when making its recommendation:

- 1. The license application is scheduled to be heard at the above time. Due to other hearings running longer than scheduled, you may have to wait some time to provide your testimony.
- 2. You must appear in person and testify as to matters that you have personally experienced or seen. (You cannot provide testimony for your neighbor, parent or anyone else; this is considered hearsay and cannot be considered by the committee.)
- 3. No letters or petitions can be accepted by the committee (unless the person who wrote the letter or the persons who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify).
- 4. Persons opposed to the license application are given the opportunity to testify first; supporters may testify after the opponents have finished.
- 5. When you are called to testify, you will be sworn in and asked to give your name, and address. (If your first and/or last names are uncommon please spell them.)

- 6. You may then provide testimony.
- a. Include only information relating to the above license application.
- b. Include only information you have personally witnessed or seen.
- c. Provide concise and relevant information detailing how this business has affected or may affect the peaceful enjoyment of your neighborhood.
- d. If by the time you have the opportunity to testify, the information you wish to share has already been provided to the committee, you may state that you agree with the previous testimony. Redundant or repetitive testimony will not assist the committee in making its recommendation.
- 7. After giving your testimony, the members of the Licenses Committee and the licensee may ask questions regarding the testimony you have given or other factors relating to the license application.
- 8. Business Competition is not a valid basis for denial or non-renewal of a license.

Please Note: If you have submitted an objection to the above application your objection cannot be considered by the committee unless you personally testify at the hearing.
