File #041567 is a resolution relating to the claim of Leslie Barber of the payment of certain benefits.

## **Background**

- 1. This resolution relates to the payment of accrued flex-time, unused at the time of the retirement of the claimant.
- 2. The claimant, Leslie Barber, retired from the rank of Assistant Chief of Police on October 7, 2004.

## **Discussion**

- 1. Flex-time refers to a flexible schedule policy for certain management-level City of Milwaukee employees. Flex-time is not considered overtime or compensatory time but allows the employee "flexibility" in scheduling as the duties and responsibilities of the position require fulfillment regardless of the parameters of a regular 8-hour day or 40-hour work week.
- 2. The claimant's salary classification at retirement was subject to the provisions of the flex-time ordinance.
- 3. The flexible schedule ordinance makes no provision for cash payment upon retirement, nor at any other time.
- 4. The City Attorney has determined that the flex-time ordinance does not prohibit the Common Council from purchasing accrued flex-time from city management employees when the Council deems this purchase to be in the best interests of the city.
- 5. The City Attorney is not making a recommendation on this file.

#### **Fiscal Effect**

- 1. The total amount of this resolution is \$52,895.48, from the MPD salary account.
- 2. If this resolution is adopted, the City Attorney recommends that a full release of claim be signed.
