1. Description of Grant Project/Program (Include Target Locations and Populations):

Wisconsin Emergency Management (WEM) will provide grant funds for the state designated Type 1 and Type II Hazmat teams, to purchase standardized radiological equipment for the response to a Weapons of Mass Destruction (WMD) and Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear and High Yield Explosive (CBRNE) incident, as well as radiological incidents that may occur as a result of an accidental release from authorized users (nuclear power plants, nuclear medicine, construction industry, etc.).

2. Relationship to City-wide Strategic Goals and Departmental Objectives:

As a Tier 1 State of Wisconsin Hazardous Materials Team, the City of Milwaukee Fire Department obtains quarterly stipends from Wisconsin Emergency Management in order to sustain a Team capable of Tier 1 standards and to operate according to a statewide operational plan under a contract. The equipment being offered by Wisconsin Emergency Management, with no match attached, will standardize the radiological detection equipment among the top five Hazardous Materials teams in the state for operational efficiency.

3. Need for Grant Funds and Impact on Other Departmental Operations (Applies only to Programs):

This grant money, being offered with no match cost to the City, will enable the City of Milwaukee Hazardous Materials Team (State of Wisconsin Tier 1 Team) to operate within the standards and operational guidelines as set forth by Wisconsin Emergency Management (operational guidelines and contract attached). Milwaukee Fire Department's Hazardous Materials Team is currently in need of radiological equipment due to equipment breakdown and end of service life on current equipment.
