Dear City Planning Commission,

I am writing to strongly object the Detailed Plan Development zoning change and 5-story parking structure with retail space proposed by New Land Enterprises for the city land at 2574 N. Downer Avenue (file #070034). I grew up in the neighborhood and have seen images of the proposed change that shocked and appalled me. The small greenspace afforded by the city lot and pleasure and history of the popcorn wagon corner is immeasurable. Economically, I don't understand the feasibility of this project. Downer Avenue has always only been able to sustain so much business (as demonstrated by the current several empty storefronts and the rotation of businesses that I have witnessed over the past 20 years) and even with the proposed parking plan, I do not think that the proposal will cause the revitalization claimed.

Aesthetically, the plan is atrocious. It doesn't fit into the historic look of the nearby housing or much of the existing retail spaces. I think you would be doing a disservice to the community surrounding Downer Avenue by allowing this structure to be built. It will detract from the beauty and charm of the neighborhood and likely have a negative impact on the value of the area.
