
INVESTING OPIOID SETTLEMENT FUNDS

BACKGROUND

- The City of Milwaukee was party to opiate litigation
- The litigation resulted in various settlements, for example from manufacturers, distributors, and retail pharmacies
- Funds transfer amount and timeline
- WI settlement shares are split 70/30
 - 70% local share
 - went directly to the state's litigating cities (including City of Milwaukee) and counties (n=87)



VISION

A Milwaukee free from harms of substance use, where astute investment of opioid settlement funds (OSF) promotes wellbeing for all




THE CONTINUUM OF CARE

- The continuum of care is an established and vetted framework
- Fitting backbone for citywide opioid settlement fund strategy
- All allowed uses for the OSF align to one or more of the four categories
- These 4 strategy categories will act as guideposts to ensure Milwaukee's investments to remediate the opioid
 epidemic are impactful and wide-reaching
- Positions the City to take action on a broad array of activities across the full spectrum of potential solutions
 - Support collective impact
 - Hold space for the many non-City programs
 - Operate within the broader context of disciplines, practitioners, agencies working on this matter















SUBSTANCE MISUSE TREATMENT STRATEGY






- Facilitate ongoing health care as called for via screening protocol

- Array of services and supports identified in the "Sequential Intercept Model"








STRATEGIC GOALS

- Goal 1: Invest across the continuum of care ecosystem: promotion, prevention, treatment, and maintenance. Assure Milwaukee OSF investments address social, structural, commercial, and political drivers of population health outcomes.
- Goal 2: Pursue sub-awarding opportunities to bolster diffusion of funds to organizations engaged in this work. Build upon existing public health infrastructure, and further complementary programming by financially supporting implementation of community-operated efforts along the continuum of care.
- Goal 3: Invest effort and funds to build capacity for a multi-sectoral response. Build on existing interconnectedness between public health, human services, public safety, and the criminal legal system; expand coordination to amplify impact across sectors.
