The claim is in the amount of \$506.00 including \$11.00 in disbursements for 4.50 hours of service billed at the rate of \$110.00 per hour. We ask that this matter be introduced and referred to the Committee on Judiciary & Legislation.

We have reviewed this claim and advise that in our opinion, the time spent was reasonable. Legal representation was occasioned by a criminal investigation. No criminal charges were brought against the police officers on whose behalf this claim was filed.

The above-named police officers have retained us to represent them in connection with the above-referenced matter. Consistent with its policy, the City Attorney's Office has refused to represent them, and as they were performing the duties of their office at the time of the events giving rise to the incident, the claim is hereby made on their behalf for the indicated legal fees. This incident involved a squad pursuit.

The MPD initiated a criminal investigation in which the officers initially declined to give a statement without counsel. When they requested counsel, IAD compelled POs Gordy, Whitely and Herrmann to give statements concerning the incident after issuing PI-21s. The criminal allegation was cleared as baseless. Attached is a copy of the clearance report and an itemization of the time and services rendered.

there, he's in there." She noticed the male at the top of the basement stairs, out he ran down the stairs leading to the basement when he noticed the police enter the hallway. The officers proceeded into the hallway and when other officers arrived, they began yelling for the male to "come out with his hands up or they were going to shoot him." Ms. LANGER stated she heard barking and believed the officers had a canine, but she did not see one.

While the officers were in the hallway trying to get the male to come out, and her family locked the 2 children, ages 2 and 6, in the bathroom. She stated her sister RENEE was trying to calm them down because they were crying and frightened. She stated she proceeded back outside to allow the officers to do their job. A W/F officer took her to the side and began getting information from ner. She was later informed that the male was arrested.

Ms. LANGER stated she did not witness the arrest, nor did she observe the nale being removed from the building. She stated she could not really describe nim but knows he was a young B/M. Ms. LANGER stated she does not know exactly how much her sister and brother in law observed or if they would be willing to speak with me. She stated she did not have her sisters current address, but would attempt to contact them, so that they could contact our office. As of the date of this report, I have received no call from RENEE or DAVID.

Based on the statement made by RADONTAY, it is apparent that most of the injuries incurred by him were caused by his own actions, while in defiance of the laws of this State and while utterly disregarding his own safety. While the injury beneath his right eye appears to be consistent with the way he alleged he received it, he is unable to give a specific description of that person. Further, there could be several factors for that type of injury, particularly when throwing beneself from a moving auto and while running through brush or jumping fences. Additionally, the fact that a weapon was located at the scene of the auto accident, warranted the need for officers to use the utmost regard for their safety, as well as the need to use any force necessary in order to gain control and make an arrest of a fleeing and resisting subject. Charges of Resisting an Officer, as well as other charges, were issued against RADONTAY, proving that his actions were, infavorably, inconsistent with someone attempting to comply with the demands of officers.

This matter is resolved as unfounded.
