Televising of Government Bodies on the City Channel

Order of Priority Revised March 31, 2016

1. All regularly-scheduled meetings of the Common Council and standing committees of the Council.

Please note that in all the cases below, coverage will depend on the availability of resources and some priority will be given to those meetings for which adequate notice has been given to City Channel staff. Scheduling concerns should be directed to x5918

- 2. All special Common Council, standing committees of the Council, and County Board meetings, subject to the Council President's assessment of importance of subject matter to be discussed at the special meeting. Televising of special Council meetings does not have priority over regularly-scheduled Council standing committee meetings.
- 3. All <u>regularly-scheduled Mayoral budget hearings</u>.
- 4. Regular meetings of the Capital Improvements Committee, the Historic Preservation Commission, the City of Milwaukee Youth Council, the Fire and Police Commission, the Public Transportation Review Board, the Anti-Graffiti Policy Committee, the City Plan Commission, the Board of Zoning Appeals, and the Administrative Review Appeals Board, in that order-
- 5. Special meetings of the above bodies.
- 6. Replays shall be prioritized with the following order: meetings of the Common Council, the standing committees of the Council, the County Board, Mayor's budget hearings, the Capital Improvements Committee, the Historic Preservation Commission, the City of Milwaukee Youth Council, the Fire and Police Commission, the Public Transportation Review Board, the Anti-Graffiti Policy Committee, the City Plan Commission, and Administrative Review Appeals Board, in that order. Live meetings shall take precedence over replays of recorded meetings.

Use of the "B" Channel on the City's Website

If a meeting cannot be televised on the City Channel, it may be scheduled on the "B Channel" on the City's website. These meetings will be archived for future web availability, but not necessarily recorded for video playback by the City Channel staff.
