Everett ("Boobie") Moore

February 11, 1932 - November 23, 2003

Everett Earl "Boobie" Moore was born on February 11, 1932, in Franklin, Louisiana to the late Henry King and Lucille Moore. He was the youngest of three children. Moore graduated from North Division High School, and, in 1977, he was co-owner of Moore's Barbershop and later took over the family business and restaurant known as Ozell's 502, which had been in business since 1957 at the corner of Fifth and Garfield. He later changed the name of the establishment to Boobie's Place. His bar was a fanfare blues bar and regularly hosted popular blues performers at Boobie's Place. Moore was also one of the original organizers of Garfield Days, a popular Milwaukee street festival.

Boobie, as he was affectionately called, was an excellent barber and very personable. People enjoyed being around him in the barbershop and later in Boobie's Place. State and city dignitaries regularly visited Boobie's Place because it was a warm, inviting and hospitable place to meet and greet people. He served on the board of Summerfest and on the Wisconsin Restaurant Association board of directors.

Moore was very active in the Prince Hall Masonic Fraternity. He served as Past Master of Ashler Lodge #7, was a member of Ionic Consistory #70 and was a 33 Degree Mason and Past Potentate of Zembo Temple #70.
