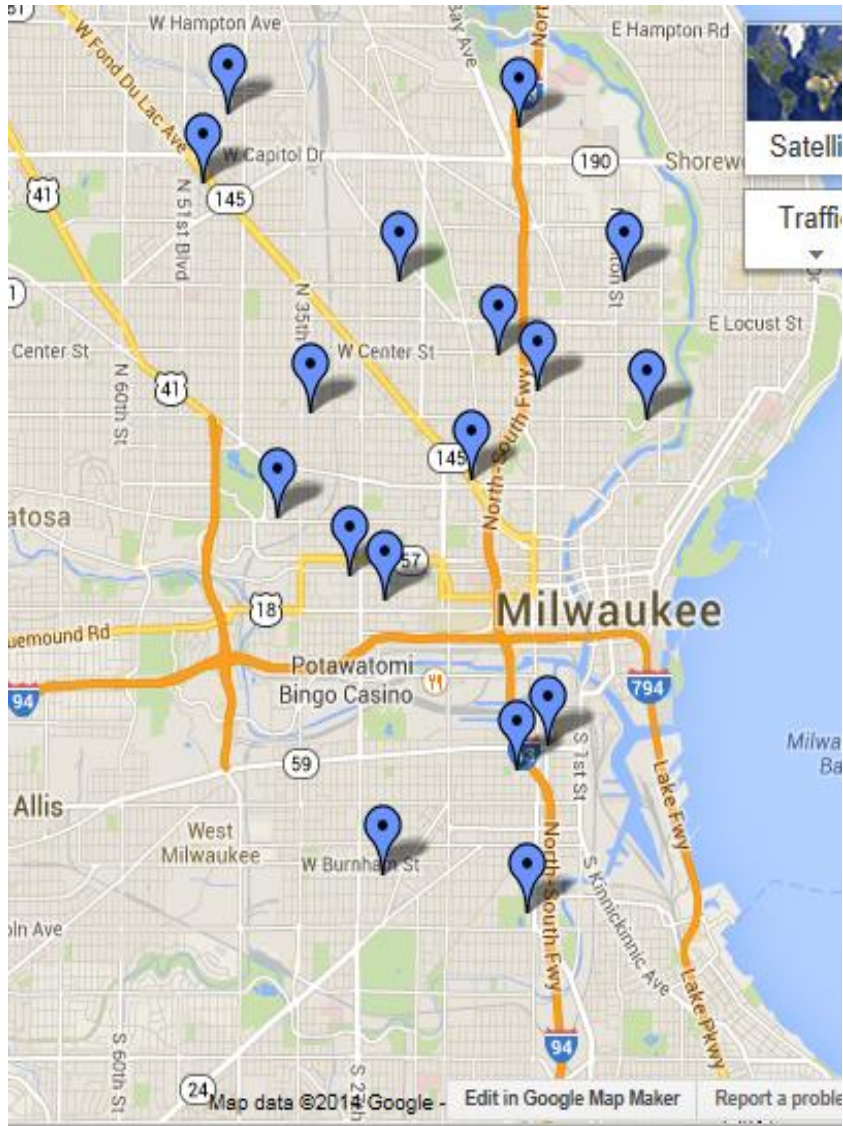

Engaging more than 20,000 young people every year, the Safe Places involve them in youth-led crime reduction and neighborhood improvement projects, drug and alcohol prevention activities, gang resistance and violence prevention

Community Partners

- Safe & Sound Community Partners are community organizers who contact residents in high-crime neighborhoods door-to-door year round, listening to, and addressing, the individual concerns of residents. They recruit youth to attend Safe Places and work with youth leaders to implement community anti-crime initiatives. Community Partners work with residents to organize block watches, building relationships and communication between residents, law enforcement and city services. Partners develop neighborhood-based initiatives, enhancing safety and reducing crime, positively impacting the community and improving the overall quality of life for residents.



Collaboration with Law Enforcement

- Milwaukee HIDTA (High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area) is part of the Safe & Sound Strategy and collaborates with the other elements of Safe & Sound to reduce the demand for illegal drugs on our streets and involve youth and residents in grass roots anti-drug efforts. The goal of the Milwaukee HIDTA is to disrupt and/or dismantle criminal organizations that import, transport and distribute illegal drugs.

Through the SCP program, approved businesses will receive a 50% match on a surveillance camera system. The business partner will pay \$1200.00 and Safe & Sound will pay \$1200.00. The surveillance camera system publicly retails for \$3000.00.

- 3 HD resolution bullet cameras
- 1 LCD 18.5 inch monitor
- 3 Hours of installation

Community Prosecution Unit

- A community prosecutor is an assistant district attorney who works directly in Milwaukee's communities. Milwaukee's community prosecutors are housed in each of the seven Milwaukee police district stations. The community prosecution model is a shift away from a response driven model to an innovative and proactive crime-prevention law enforcement model; the focus is on an increase in quality of life in Milwaukee neighborhoods.

Responsibilities of the Community Prosecution Unit include:

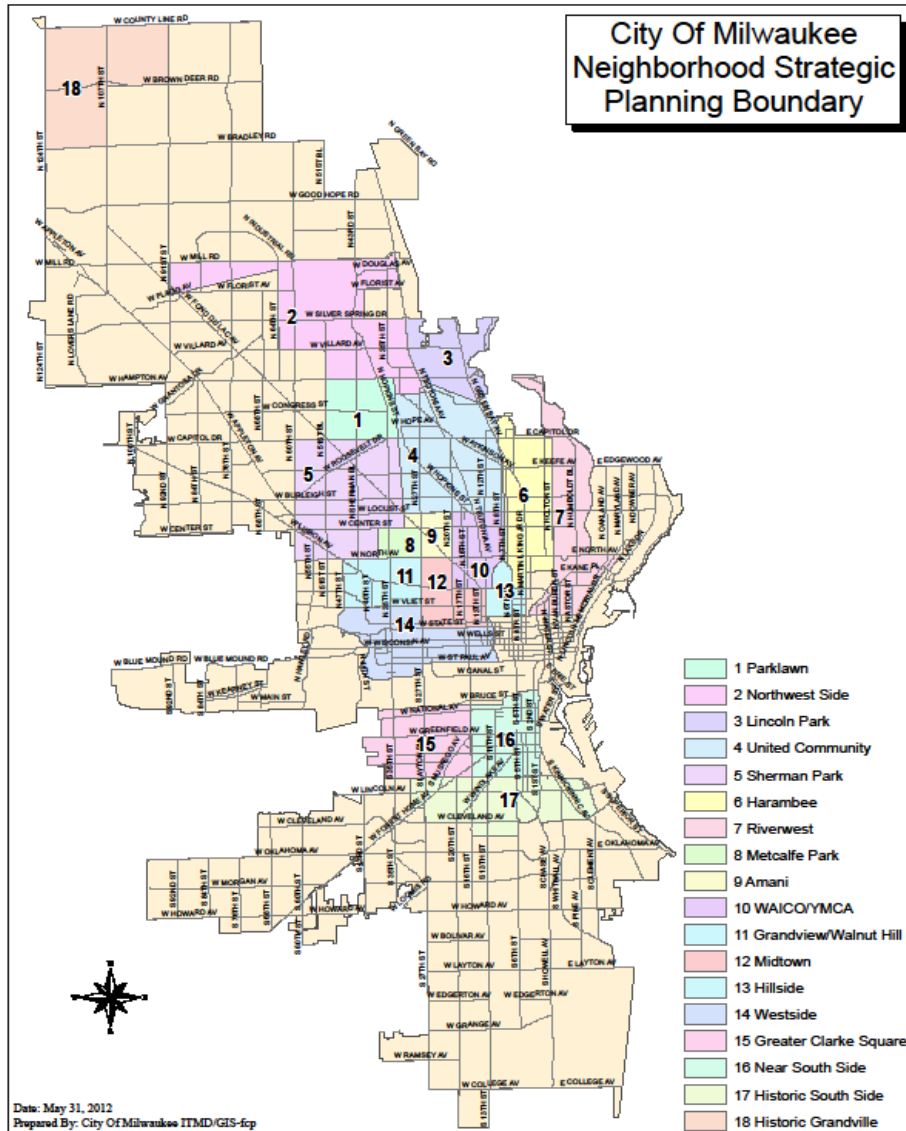
- **Nuisance Properties**
Homes and buildings that are the repeated sources of complaints and police calls involving drug dealing, prostitution, gambling, trash, dangerous dogs and code violations. Encourage landlords to enroll in the free city Landlord Training Program.
- **Crime Prevention**
The Community Prosecutor is available to work with schools, churches and community groups to help residents get involved, to discuss crime prevention techniques and how to effectively report criminal behavior to the police.



Neighborhood Strategic Planning Community Organizing

- Programs are a coordinated, pro-active approach to neighborhood stability combining organizing efforts with public enforcement efforts (DNS, Health , Police and City Attorney) as a tool in dealing with crime, neighborhood clean ups, nuisance properties, block club formation and other neighborhood issues.

Project Name: City of Milwaukee -Milwaukee Builds Program

Description:

- This program is patterned after Youthbuild and will be expanded to provide skilled labor apprenticeships to the building trades, working with a large population of low income unemployed adults. Contracts have been let to existing Youthbuild coordinating agencies for Rental Housing Rehabilitation and Housing Construction. This program will work with the existing housing stock of the local Public Housing Authority (PHA) and Foreclosed properties operating within the City of Milwaukee's Neighborhood Stabilization Program's Land Bank. Also included will be the rehabilitation and redevelopment of commercial mixed-use space.
- This project meets the National Objective by benefiting low/moderate income persons through various housing activities. This project is under the eligible activity categories of: Housing Construction, Rehab Single Unit Residential; Multi-Unit Residential eligible activities.

Location: Neighborhood Revitalization Strategy Area 1 & 2

Partners: Department of Labor, Milwaukee Area Workforce Investment Board (MAWIB), Department of City Development, Housing Authority of City of Milwaukee, Wisconsin Regional Training Partnership (WRTP) Northcott Neighborhood House and Milwaukee Christian Center

New Home Construction: Program participants learn all aspects of home construction produces affordable homes that are sold to low-income families



Training Activities

Deconstruction: By deconstructing homes and buildings we're able to salvage and recycle 40% to 70% of the building materials (i.e. the shingles being removed from the roof become asphalt, use studs are transferred to new constructions and siding, piping and windows are recycled) **This is a Green Activity**
