1. Description of Grant Project/Program (Include Target Locations and Populations):

The purpose of *Preserving Infant and Child Health* (PICH) is to establish a collaboration between Fetal Infant Mortality Review (FIMR) and Child Death Review (CDR), leading to improved comprehensive data reports and greater effectiveness of prevention interventions. The combined efforts of FIMR and CDR will have a greater chance for improving childhood health outcomes for problems like unsafe sleep or childhood infections than either could work alone.

2. Relationship to City-wide Strategic Goals and Departmental Objectives:

The reduction of infant deaths and stillbirths and the elimination of disparities in these deaths is one of the main priorities of the City of Milwaukee Health Department.

3. Need for Grant Funds and Impact on Other Departmental Operations (Applies only to Programs):

This grant funds 75% of one Health Project Assistant position that works on Fetal Infant Mortality Review.

4. Results Measurement/Progress Report (Applies only to Programs):

Annual reports are required by the granting agency. The report will detail progress on the following objectives:

- 1) Data collection, data quality and interpretation
- 2) Introduction of FIMR to five southeastern Wisconsin counties and increased CDR and FIMR collaboration.

- 2) Data analysis and recommendations leading to increased media coverage of prematurity as the leading cause of infant death and stillbirth.
- 3) Detailed sustainability plan for FIMR programs drafted by the State of Wisconsin and PICH partners.
