1. Description of Grant Project/Program (Include Target Locations and Populations):

The grant monies will be used to improve and advance environmental health capacity through local public health involvement in surveillance, data collection and development of appropriate outcome measurements associated with environmentally related disease. The Milwaukee Health Department will serve as a partner with the State of Wisconsin Division of Public Health in: 1) conducting a community-wide environmental health needs assessment; 2) development of a model database for tracking and compiling data associated with environmental diseases and relevant exposures; 3) development of appropriate outcome measures for evaluating the success of select environmental health programs; and 4) liaison between local health agencies and State of Wisconsin Division of Public Health in assuring practical implementation at the municipal/county level

2. Relationship to City-wide Strategic Goals and Departmental Objectives:

The goals and objectives of this grant project is consistent with departmental strategic initiatives of assuring environmental quality and reducing the incidence of adverse environmental exposures and related disease.

3. Need for Grant Funds and Impact on Other Departmental Operations (Applies only to Programs):

The grant will support and enhance departmental outcomes based management activities within the realm of environmental health programs and enable preliminary development and assessment of electronic tracking of select environmental exposures and/or diseases.
