Milwaukee College Prep is a nonprofit organization that runs outstanding urban charter public schools that close the achievement gap and prepare low-income students to graduate from college. One of the guiding core beliefs at Milwaukee College Prep is that every child, no matter his or her circumstance, has a unique and individual genius. It is up to us to unlock that genius, no excuses. Milwaukee College Prep has three campuses:

- 36th Street Campus ~ 2449 N. 36th Street ~ K-8 ~ Est: 1997 ~ 502 students
- 38th Street Campus ~ 2623 N. 38th Street ~ K-4 ~ Est: 2011 ~ 248 Students
- Lloyd Street Campus ~ 1228 W. Lloyd St ~ K-8 ~ Est: 2010 ~ 450 Students

Milwaukee has among the lowest reading scores in the nation.	90% of Milwaukee College Prep’s scholars are advanced or proficient in Reading.
Wisconsin has the highest percentage of black 8th graders in the nation whose performance is rated “below basic” in reading and math.	100% of Milwaukee College Prep 8th graders were advanced or proficient in Reading.
Nationally, only 40% of African-Americans graduate from high school.	More than 93% of our alumni graduate from high school and 40% of our first alumni class is getting ready to graduate from college.

- 95% attendance rate in 2010-11 and single digit attrition rates for past 14 years.
- MCP is an independent charter (public) school. Any child who lives in the City of Milwaukee is eligible to attend at no cost.
- In 2009, our school was named the best charter school in the state of Wisconsin and it also won the National School of Character award.
- Our students’ results best describe Milwaukee College Prep’s success. For example, the majority of our graduates are attending prestigious college prep high schools including Marquette High, Brookfield Academy, Dominican, Rufus King, Pius, Riverside, St. John’s Northwestern Military Academy, the Thacher School (CA) Piney Woods (MS), and Phillips Exeter Academy (NH).
- 90% of our alums have graduated from high school and over 70% are attending colleges such as Howard University, DePaul University, Marquette University and Savannah Institute of Art and Design.
