## **B. SUPPORTING INFORMATION**

1. State the action requested, including the dollar amount and specific departmental accounts(s) to which the Contingent Fund appropriation would be made.

This resolution transfers \$28,000 from the 2007 Common Council Contingent Fund (Account Number 0001 9990 C001 006300) to the Department of Neighborhood Services (Equipment Account Number 0001 1320 R999 006800) for the purchase of up to 10 Tripwire Camera Systems for surveillance of graffiti vandalism and criminal activity.

- 2. State the purpose of the action requested which includes the program, service or activity to be supported by the funding, as well as the objective(s) to be accomplished.
- Graffiti vandalism usually occurs during late-night and early morning hours, under cover of darkness, with no witnesses. Tripwire Camera Systems can be placed in locations with a high incidence rate for graffiti vandalism. The cameras are activated by motion, and information and images of the graffiti vandalism as it is taking place are transmitted within seconds to a receiver. The info and images can be used as a tool in identification and apprehension of graffiti vandals, as well as linking the perpetrators to other historical graffiti incidents.
- 3. Describe the circumstances which prompt the request.

Graffiti vandalism on public and privately owned buildings and structures costs the City of Milwaukee hundreds of thousands of dollars each year. Graffiti devalues neighborhoods and business areas because it gives the appearance of lawlessness and rampant criminal activity. As stated in Item #2, graffiti vandalism often occurs under cover of darkness, with no witnesses. By placing Tripwire Camera Systems in locations where repeated graffiti incidents have occurred, information and images of the graffiti vandalism can be captured as the event takes place. The info and images can be used by the Department of Neighborhood Services and law enforcement to identify and apprehend the vandals, and possibly link them to other historical graffiti incidents. The graffiti may also be removed in a more timely manner, since DNS will have more rapid notification of its occurrence.

4. What are the consequences of not providing the program, service, or activity which is funded by this request? Graffiti vandalism will continue to flourish, and the same locations that are currently a magnet for repeated graffiti vandalism will continue to be tagged.

5.	Explain why funds authorized in the Budget are insufficient to provide for the program, service, or activity in question.
	When the Department of Neighborhood Services prepared its 2007 requested budget in the spring of 2006, it could thave foreseen the need to provide funding for Tripwire Camera Systems. The Anti-Graffiti Policy Committee cussed the use of Tripwires Cameras in the spring of 2007.
