There is a possibility that your application may be denied for one or more of the following reasons: The recommendation of the committee regarding the application shall be based on evidence presented at the hearing. Per MCO 85-4-4, unless otherwise specified in the code, probative evidence concerning non-renewal, suspension or revocation may include evidence of the following: failure of the applicant to meet municipal qualifications, pending charges against or the conviction of any felony, misdemeanor, municipal offense or other offense, the circumstances of which substantially relate to the circumstances of the particular licensed or permitted activity, by the applicant or by any employee or other agent of the applicant. If the activities of the applicant involve a licensed premises, whether the premises tends to facilitate a public or private nuisance or has been the source of congregations of persons which have resulted in any of the following: disturbance of the peace; illegal drug activity; public drunkenness; drinking in public; harassment of passers-by; gambling; prostitution; sale of stolen goods; public urination; theft; assaults; battery; acts of vandalism including graffiti, excessive littering, loitering, illegal parking, loud noise at times when the licensed premise is open for business; traffic violations; curfew violations; lewd conduct; display of materials harmful to minors, pursuant to s. 106-9.6; or any other factor which reasonably relates to the public health, safety and welfare, or failure to comply with the approved plan of operation. It is the intention of the Common Council to suspend or non-renew the licenses if objectors provide testimony related to the factors enumerated in MCO 85-4-4 that the Common Council finds to be true by a preponderance of the evidence and/or police reports and other attached documents relating to objections to the license are a part of this notice and expressly incorporated in this notice. The licensee should be prepared to address these matters at the hearin

Notice for applicants with warrants or unpaid fines:

Proof of warrant satisfaction or payment of fines must be submitted at the hearing on the above date and time. Failure to comply with this requirement may result in a delay of the granting/denial of your application.

Failure to appear at this meeting may result in the denial of your license. Individual applicants must appear only in person or by an attorney. Corporate or Limited Liability applicants must appear only by the agent designated on the application or by an attorney. Partnership applicants must appear by a partner listed on the application or by an attorney. If you wish to do so and at your own expense, you may be accompanied by an attorney of your choosing to represent you at this hearing. You will be given an opportunity to speak on behalf of the application and to respond and challenge any charges or reasons given for the denial. No petitions can be accepted by the committee, unless the people who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify. You may present witnesses under oath and you may also confront and cross-examine opposing witnesses under oath. other patrons. The subjects started arguing with the victim inside and continued outside. The victim stated she was hit in the head with a pistol by one of the subjects. The battery occurred in the alley outside of camera view. The applicant was on scene and cooperative. The officers

were unable to obtain a copy of the video. MPD report filed.

- 4. On 06/21/2019 at 2:08am officers were dispatched to a shooting call at 3202 S 13<sup>th</sup> St. the officers located blood splatter in front of Buckshot's Bar, 3219 S 13<sup>th</sup> St. The officers interviewed the applicant who initially stated there were subjects kick out of the bar for being disorderly. He then stated the bar was closed and there was a fight outside which he witnessed but it was unrelated to the bar. Another employee, Viviana SEDA, stated she did not know anything about the incident outside, then stated she heard something about someone grabbing another patron, which caused a problem between patrons of the bar. The officers located two shell casings in the street across from the bar.
- 5. On 06/24/2019 at 4:05pm officers were dispatched to a Trouble with Subject at Buckshot's Bar, 3219 S 13<sup>th</sup> St. The officers spoke with the caller who is a US Postal carrier. She stated that as she was delivering mail to Buckshot's a subject, who appeared to be intoxicated, came up to her and took the mail. The subject then asked her to kiss him and when she refused he grabbed her hand. The officers were able to identify the subject based upon information obtained from other patrons and issued the subject a Disorderly Conduct citation.

- 6. On 08/18/2019 at 2:20am officers were dispatched to a fight at 3228 S 13<sup>th</sup> St. When the officers arrived they found an accident at the location and a subject in front of Buckshots, 3219 S 13<sup>th</sup> St. bleeding from the mouth. The victim stated he was at Buckshots and got into a verbal altercation with another patron. As he was leaving he was assaulted and the assault continued outside. The victim then attempted to drive off and struck a parked car. The officer contacted the applicant on a later date and obtained the video of the incident.
- 7. On 09/16/2019 an officer conducted follow up from a call on 09/07/2019 regarding a fight at Buckshots, 3219 S 13<sup>th</sup> St. The officer spoke with a neighbor who stated there was a large group of people fighting outside of Buckshots that night. She stated she has called the Police in the past for similar incidents. The officer spoke to another neighbor who stated she was awaken by the large fight and she called the police. She said the subjects left just prior to the arrival of the police. She stated she observed the owner of the bar standing outside watching the fight but he did nothing to stop the fight. He then drove off with the subjects just prior to the arrival of the police.
- 8. On 10/06/2019 at 1:01am officers were flagged down at Buckshots, 3219 S 13<sup>th</sup> St. by the applicant regarding a Trouble with Subject. The applicant pointed out a subject walking away that had been involved in a fight inside the tavern. The subject stopped and talked with police. The applicant stated the other party had already left and he did not want to prosecute. The subject was allowed to leave in a cab.
- 9. On 10/13/2019 at 2:20am officers were dispatched to Shots fired at 3224 S 13<sup>th</sup> St. The officer determined this to be related the patrons leaving Buckshots, 3219 S 13<sup>th</sup> St. The officer interviewed the applicant who stated he was closing the bar at 2:10am and had to escort out 30-40 people. He observed a fight outside and he went to break it up. When he was back inside he heard several shots fired outside. The applicant provide video to the officers. While on scene a shooting victim arrived at St Lukes hospital. This subject stated he was at the bar for about 1 hour before the fight started. The victim went outside and joined in the fight. After the applicant broke up the fight the victim was walking off when someone fired shots, striking him in the leg. The victim was 20 years old and the applicant was cited for Allow Underage on Premise.

10. On 10/18/2019 at 10:12pm officers conducted underage tavern enforcement in District 6. An underage Police Aide able to gain entry to Buckshots, 3219 S 13<sup>th</sup> St. At the bar the Police Aide ordered a beer from the applicant. The applicant asked for ID and when the Police Aide could not show ID the applicant kicked him out.

- 11.On 11/07/2019 a meeting was held at District 6 regarding Buckshots, 3219 S 13<sup>th</sup> St. The applicant stated he has been in business for many years at this location and he has noticed as other bars close, his cliental gets younger. The applicant stated he has raised his drink prices and has noticed a decrease in sales but hopes the problems will decrease. The applicant provided a letter stating changes he would make including: ID every patron after 10pm; having a bouncer at the door scanning for weapons and maintaining capacity; closing 30 minutes early to disperse crowds and calling the police to report any problems. The applicant also stated he would have the bouncer prevent large crowds from forming outside. The applicant was cooperative and was willing to work to keep peace in the neighborhood.
- 12. On 02/22/2020 at 7:59pm officers were dispatched to a fight in the area of S 13<sup>th</sup> St and W. Euclid Av. When the officers arrived they observed multiple intoxicated subjects in front of Buckshots, 3219 S 13<sup>th</sup> St. The officer spoke with one bartender who stated he did not see anything. The officer spoke with the manager who stated there was a birthday party that day and there was a group that started to argue. When the subjects started fighting they were pushed outside. The manager stated she was one of the people that called the police. The officers could not locate any of the subjects injured or admitting to be in the fight.

13. On 11/06/20 at 8:35pm, Milwaukee Police conducted a license premise check at 3219 S. 13<sup>th</sup>

- Street. The employee was cooperative and all their papers were in order.

  14. On 09/16/20 at 7:31pm. Milwaukee Police conducted a license premise check at 3219 S. 13th
- 14. On 09/16/20 at 7:31pm, Milwaukee Police conducted a license premise check at 3219 S. 13th Street. The employee was cooperative and all their papers were in order.
- 15. On 10/15/20 at 4:50pm, Milwaukee Police conducted follow-up regarding a ten day suspension handed down by the Milwaukee Common Council at 3219 S. 13<sup>th</sup> Street. Upon arrival, officers did observe that the tavern was still operating and the applicant stated he received a letter in the mail today (10/15/20) and that he planned on closing his establishment and cooperating with the suspension notice. All patrons were asked to leave due to the suspension and the applicant was respectful and receptive during the follow-up investigation.
- 16. On 07/22/21 at 11:59pm, Milwaukee Police were dispatched to 3219 S. 13<sup>th</sup> Street for a battery complaint. Investigation revealed that no battery occurred.

- 17. On 10/30/21, officers conducted a license premise check at Buckshot's, 3219 S. 13<sup>th</sup> St. All licenses were valid and no violations were found.
- 18. On 03/06/22 at 2:08am, A police officer observed patrons exit the bar at 3219 S. 13<sup>th</sup> St., and begin to physically fight. Upon the officer activating the emergency lights and air horn, most of the crowd dispersed. Officers interviewed the bartender who stated a few patrons began to cause trouble inside the bar, and upon exiting the bar, a physical fight ensued. Officers observed the bar appeared to be over capacity and interviewed the agent, who was on scene. The agent stated it was his birthday and invited a few people and admitted the bar became overcrowded. The agent and bartender were cooperative with the investigation and agreed to close the bar early. Two patrons were arrested for refusing to leave despite the agents request.

- 19. On 06/08/23 at 2:55am, Milwaukee Police were dispatched to Trouble with Subject at 3219 S. 13<sup>th</sup> St. On arrival the bar was closed and the officer was unable to contact anyone
- 20. On 06/25/23 at 2:20am, Milwaukee Police were dispatched to a shooting at 3219 S. 13<sup>th</sup> St. On arrival, officers observed the victim, not breathing, with a single gunshot wound to their chest. Life saving measures by MPD and MFD were unsuccessful. The agent was very cooperative with the investigation and allowed officers to view video surveillance of the incident. Investigation revealed that the victim was inside the bar with the suspects. Once the patrons left the establishment a physical altercation transpired outside which the victim was not involved in. As the actors involved with the fight began to walk away, the victim is seen backing up slowly and one of the actors fired serval rounds at the victim, striking him.
- 21. On 06/25/23 at 4:19p.m., Milwaukee Police were dispatched to a Subject with Gun at 3219 S. 13<sup>th</sup> St. Upon arrival officers observed approximately 10 subjects outside of the bar. The officers were advised the subjects with guns had already left the location. The agent was on scene and stated they had been working all day monitoring a vigil that was being held outside for a homicide victim. Officers did not view video surveillance of the incident.

22. On 09/12/24 at 1:27a.m., Milwaukee Police were dispatched to a Subject Wanted (Armed with a Firearm) at 3219 S. 13<sup>th</sup> St. Prior to arrival officers confirmed the subject was a felon and the wanted status, as well as a photo of the subject. On arrival officers located the subject and they were placed in custody. A search incident to arrest revealed the subject was in possession of a loaded firearm, as well as a white powdery substance, later testing positive for fentanyl and cocaine. It should further be noted the arrestee was easily recognizable due to gang tattoos and several patrons were hostile toward officers during the arrest, verbalizing gang affiliation, leading officers to believe several gang members were together at the bar.

On Thursday, September 12, 2024, at 1:27AM, Squad 6320 (myself and P.O. Nashata NORWOOD both in

full duty uniforms, equipped with BWCs, and operating a marked MPD squad #65098) responded to 3219 S. 13th Street (Buck Shots Bar), in the City and County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin for a Subject Wanted (armed with a firearm) complaint.

Prior to arriving, I conducted a check of CCAP records for the name of the wanted subject that was provided, which revealed that the subject, Gustavo ENRIQUEZ Jr. (W/M, 06-07-90) -AKA- Gustavo ENRIQUEZ Jr. (W/M, 06-09-90), has a felony warrant for his arrest issued for Milwaukee County Court Case #2023CF004174.

A DOT/Wanted check revealed that ENRIQUEZ had open felony warrants:

The check of CCAP records also revealed that ENRIQUEZ has prior felony convictions.

All of the above convictions prohibit ENRIQUEZ from possessing any firearms.

I requested additional squads and a supervisor to meet us at the gas stations at W. Morgan Avenue and S. 13th Street. we devised a plan to contain the entrances on the bar and locate and arrest ENRIQUEZ if he was there. We had access to and viewed prior booking photos of ENRIQUEZ and we had a description of him wearing a red shirt and having long hair possibly in a ponytail which was provided by the anonymous caller.

Upon arrival with additional squads, I approached the front door with a rifle, along with P.O. NORWOOD and Squad 6350 (P.O. Rafael LOPEZ) and Squad 6330 (P.O. Omar PEDROZA-BELTRAN and P.O. Leslie TORRES). Squad 6390 (P.O. Terrance ISLAND) and Squad 6340 (P.O. David CONNER) held containment on the bar's rear entrance. ENRIQUEZ was observed through the window, and then as we entered the bar front door, he was located just inside and south of the front door of Buck Shots Bar at the above address, where he was at the bar and acknowledged that his name is "Gustavo" when asked by P.O. LOPEZ. ENRIQUEZ was arrested and walked back to our squads, where he was then searched incident to arrest. During the search, P.O. Rafael LOPEZ located a small plastic baggie with a white powdery substance inside it in ENRIQUEZ's left front shorts pocket along with ENRIQUEZ's keys, some cards, and over \$500 in US Currency. During the search, P.O. Omar PEDROZA-BELTRAN located a fully concealed loaded Taurus G3 9MM semiautomatic (silver/black) firearm S/N #ADK765688 inside ENRIQUEZ's right front shorts pocket. The firearm was loaded with a magazine containing 16 live 9MM rounds. Also found in ENRIQUEZ's right front shorts pocket was a second magazine for the firearm containing 15 live rounds.

It should be noted that some of the other patrons in the bar appeared to be hostile and one of them attempted to record our interactions. The same subject even followed us all the way down the street to our awaiting squad and tried getting as close as he could, basically interfering with the arrest. I had to tell him to stay back. The same subject shouted insults at me, and also shouted to ENRIQUEZ among other things- "King Love!" "You can't do nothing to a king." Due to the potential volatility of the situation, we decided to get ENRIQUEZ out of the area and back to the district as soon as possible.

It should be noted that ENRIQUEZ was easily recognizable due to matching the booking photos we had of him, and due to having a unique crown tattoo on his throat. ENRIQUEZ also has a tattoo on his hand with five dots and a cursive "W." These are symbols of the Latin Kings gang, and it is highly likely that the subject or subjects that ENRIQUEZ was hanging out with at the bar are also members of this gang.

I conducted a later test of the white powdery substance using the Nark II test #33 and Nark II test #07 which showed that the substance was positive for both fentanyl and cocaine with a weight of 4.98 grams.

ENRIQUEZ's concealment and possession of the firearm was done with intent and without consent and is in violation of law following his above-mentioned felony convictions. ENRIQUEZ's possession of the substance that tested positive for cocaine and fentanyl was done with intent and without consent and constitutes a 2nd+ possession of cocaine due to his above-mentioned drug convictions.

ENRIQUEZ was conveyed to District 6 for booking. ENRIQUEZ was later taken for medical clearance at St. Luke's Hospital ER Room G22 due to his admission of having ingested cocaine and marijuana today.

Due to the potential volatility of the situation, we decided to get ENRIQUEZ out of the area and back to the district as soon as possible. We did not re-enter the bar with potential gang members inside in order to avoid further confrontation. I did not recognize employees of the bar or the bar owner to be there during our arrest.

A later check of Milwaukee Licenses revealed that the Tavern License is valid through 11-20-24.

I know the bar to have cameras inside, and no security that I am aware of.

- 1. The license application is scheduled to be heard at the above time. Due to other hearings running longer than scheduled, you may have to wait some time to provide your testimony.
- 2. You must appear in person and testify as to matters that you have personally experienced or seen. (You cannot provide testimony for your neighbor, parent or anyone else; this is considered hearsay and cannot be considered by the committee.)
- 3. No letters or petitions can be accepted by the committee (unless the person who wrote the letter or the persons who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify).
- 4. Persons opposed to the license application are given the opportunity to testify first; supporters may testify after the opponents have finished.
- When you are called to testify, you will be sworn in and asked to give your name, and address. (If your first and/or last names are uncommon please spell them.)

- 6. You may then provide testimony.
- a. Include only information relating to the above license application.
- b. Include only information you have personally witnessed or seen.
- c. Provide concise and relevant information detailing how this business has affected or may affect the peaceful enjoyment of your neighborhood.
- d. If by the time you have the opportunity to testify, the information you wish to share has already been provided to the committee, you may state that you agree with the previous testimony. Redundant or repetitive testimony will not assist the committee in making its recommendation.
- 7. After giving your testimony, the members of the Licenses Committee and the licensee may ask questions regarding the testimony you have given or other factors relating to the license application.
- 8. Business Competition is not a valid basis for denial or non-renewal of a license.
