

See the 2024 Mayor's Design Awards Winners

20 projects big and small are named best of the best in Milwaukee design

The City of Milwaukee is recognizing the best in design through its 27th annual Mayor's Design Awards.

A total of 20 projects are being recognized, including <u>one building</u> that was previously described as "the quintessential definition of blight."

An in-person ceremony to recognize the winners is being held Friday evening at the <u>UW-Milwaukee School of Architecture and Urban Planning</u>. Mayor <u>Cavalier Johnson</u> is leading the ceremony.

Administered by the <u>Department of City Development</u>, the awards program began under Mayor <u>John</u> <u>Norquist</u> and was continued by Mayor <u>Tom Barrett</u>. The 2024 awards are the third under Johnson.




