





Total Departmental Budget




Comparative Funding





Personnel Budget



Wages adjustments have been proposed for the following positions:



The Department has also restructured the Special Enforcement Division into a new Special Enforcement Section, eliminating the position of Special Enforcement Manger, one of 2 Special Enforcement Supervisor, and 2 of 10 Special Enforcement Inspector positions.

Staffing Vacancies

The Department currently has 30 vacancies in funded positions, down from 46 vacancies this time last year. The highest number of vacancies are in the Development Center (5), followed by Residential Inspection Services (4) and Targeted Enforcement (4). Average length of position vacancy is 323.5 days.





Revenue

The Proposed Budget estimates \$27,336,000 in total revenues will be generated by the department, an increase of \$725,500 from the 2025 Adopted Budget. The department is expected to generate:

Special Purpose Accounts

The Proposed Budget eliminates funding for the Graffiti Abatement Special Purpose Account, reducing the total SPA budget to \$55,000.

Grants

The Department has 3 grants through CDBG and one through FEMA for a total of \$2,749,513. Grants are for housing code enforcement, targeted code enforcement, for inspection services, and for the Landlord Tenant Compliance Program.


