

Are you eligible?

- Must be a Wisconsin resident
- Must be a U.S. Citizen or qualified alien
- Anyone between the ages of 21 and 64 years old
- Individuals older than 24 must be the biological or adoptive parent or the primary care giver for a child under the age of 18 who is a relative
- Unemployed for at least four weeks
- Ineligible for unemployment insurance benefits and W2
- Have an annual household income level less than 150% of the federal poverty level (see guidelines below)
- Did not work 1,040 hours in another Transitional Job
