


Welding Median Pay after 5 years


Power of a Certificate





Retirements


Replacement openings will outstrip new growth 3:1 by 2020





Demand for skilled tradesmen will grow by nearly 50%, but the supply will decrease by about 12% over the same period



Welding Pathways






Accreditation

- 12 technical college credits offered that create a pathway to both the technical diploma and associate degree programs
- Students who complete associate degrees in welding can transfer credits to 18 different four-year programs including UW system institutions and Ferris State University (Credits Transferable)
- Curriculum created by Advanced Manufacturing Partnership employers in conjunction with Fox Valley Technical College
- Training leads to lifelong learning opportunities and personal advancement along with greater personal earnings potential
- Leads to enhanced economic impact due to the greater levels of income that can be achieved by participants resulting in greater income, sales, and property tax revenue generation at State and local levels
