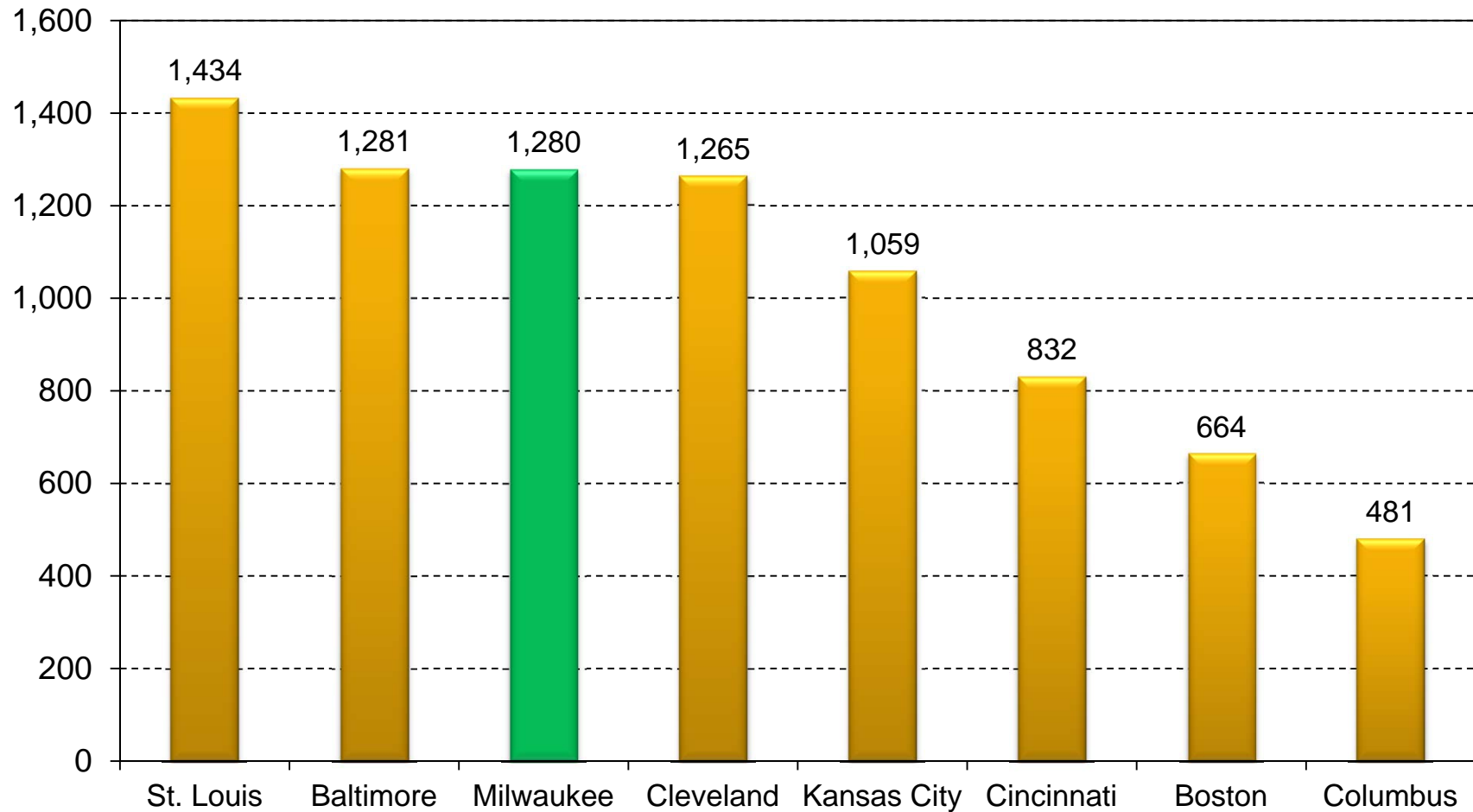

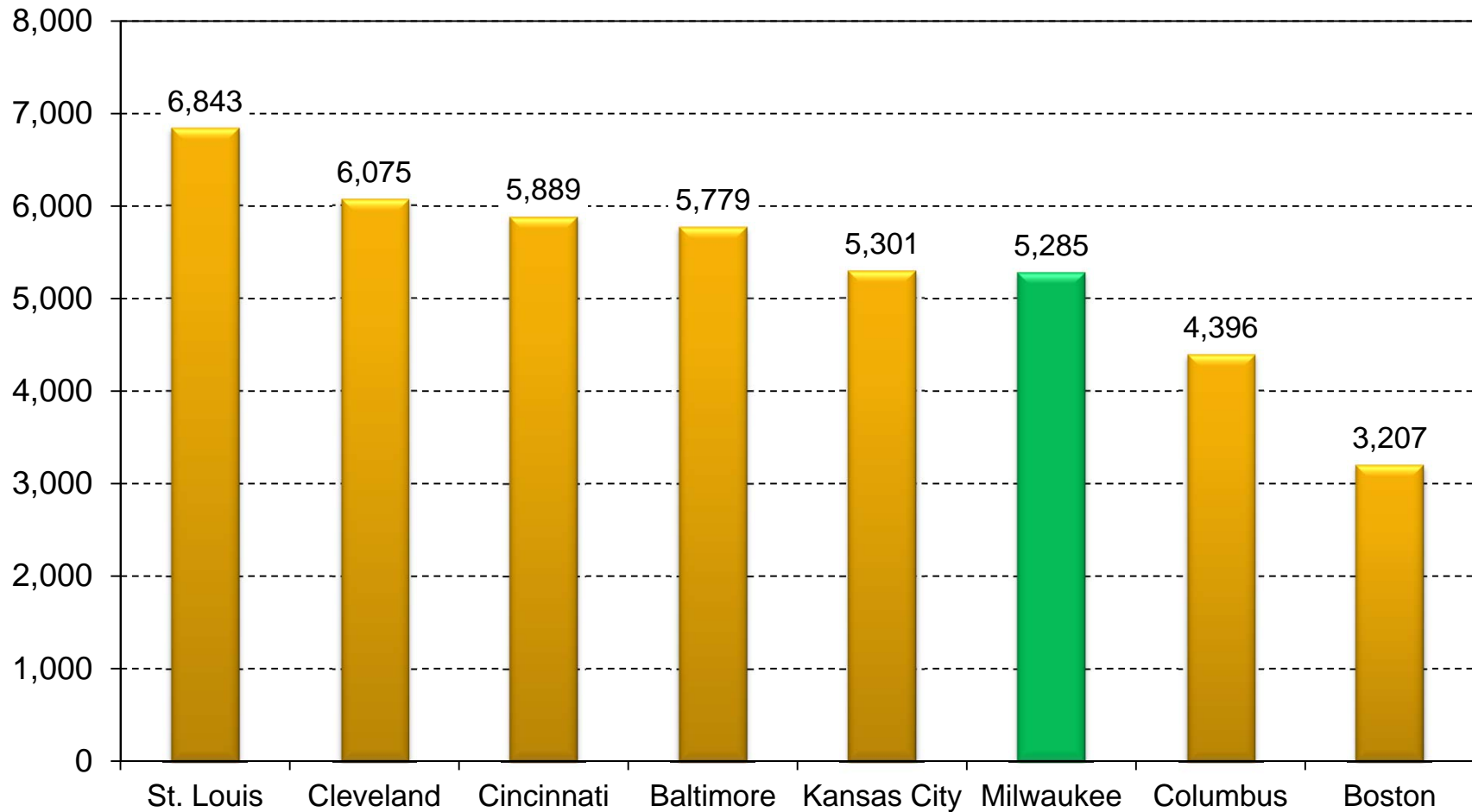
1. Milwaukee shares challenges of crime with most comparable cities

5. Communities are testing public health approaches as a crime prevention supplement to conventional policing work

# 2014 Jan – June Violent Crime Rate



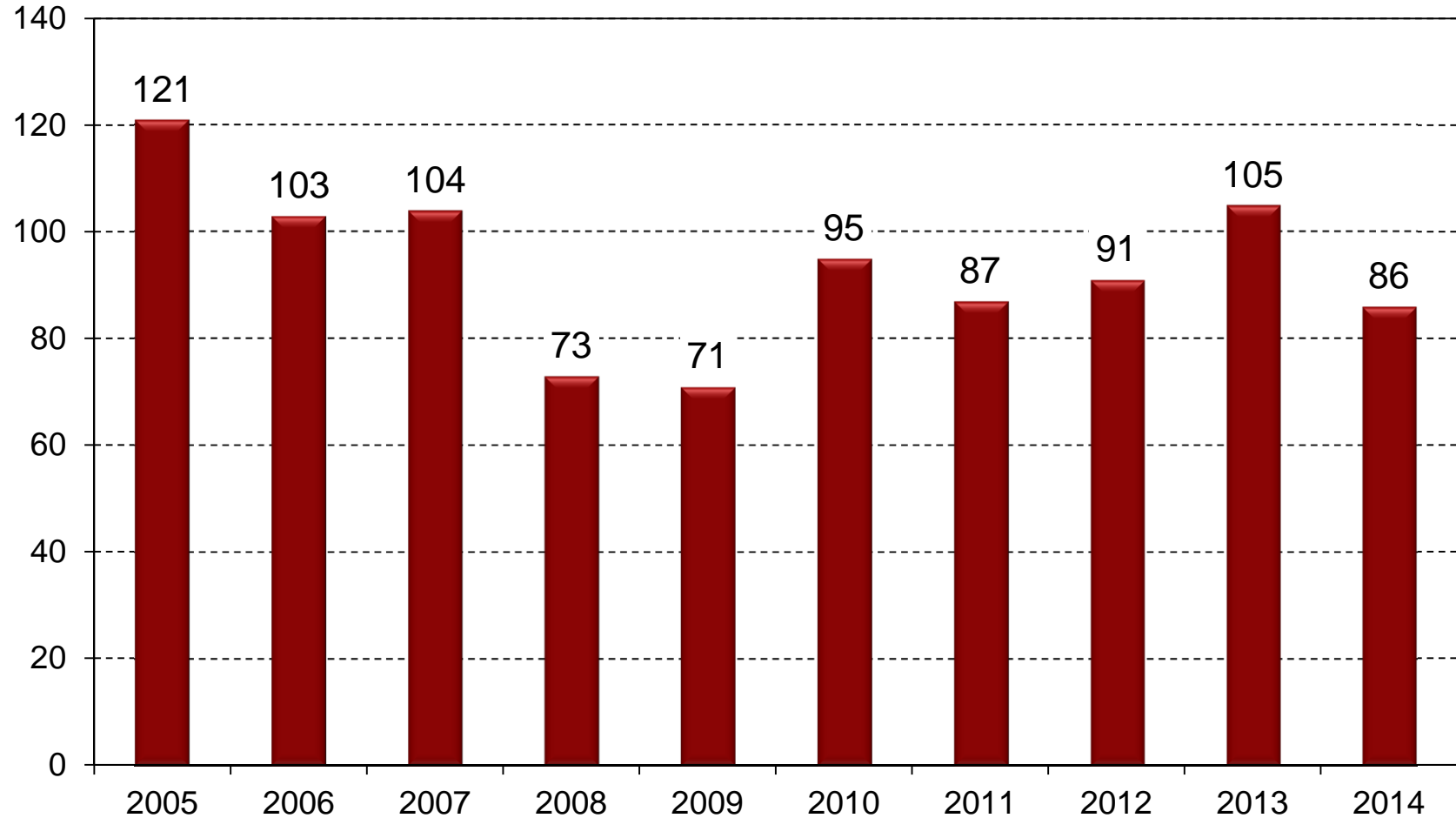

# 2014 Jan – June Total Crime Rate



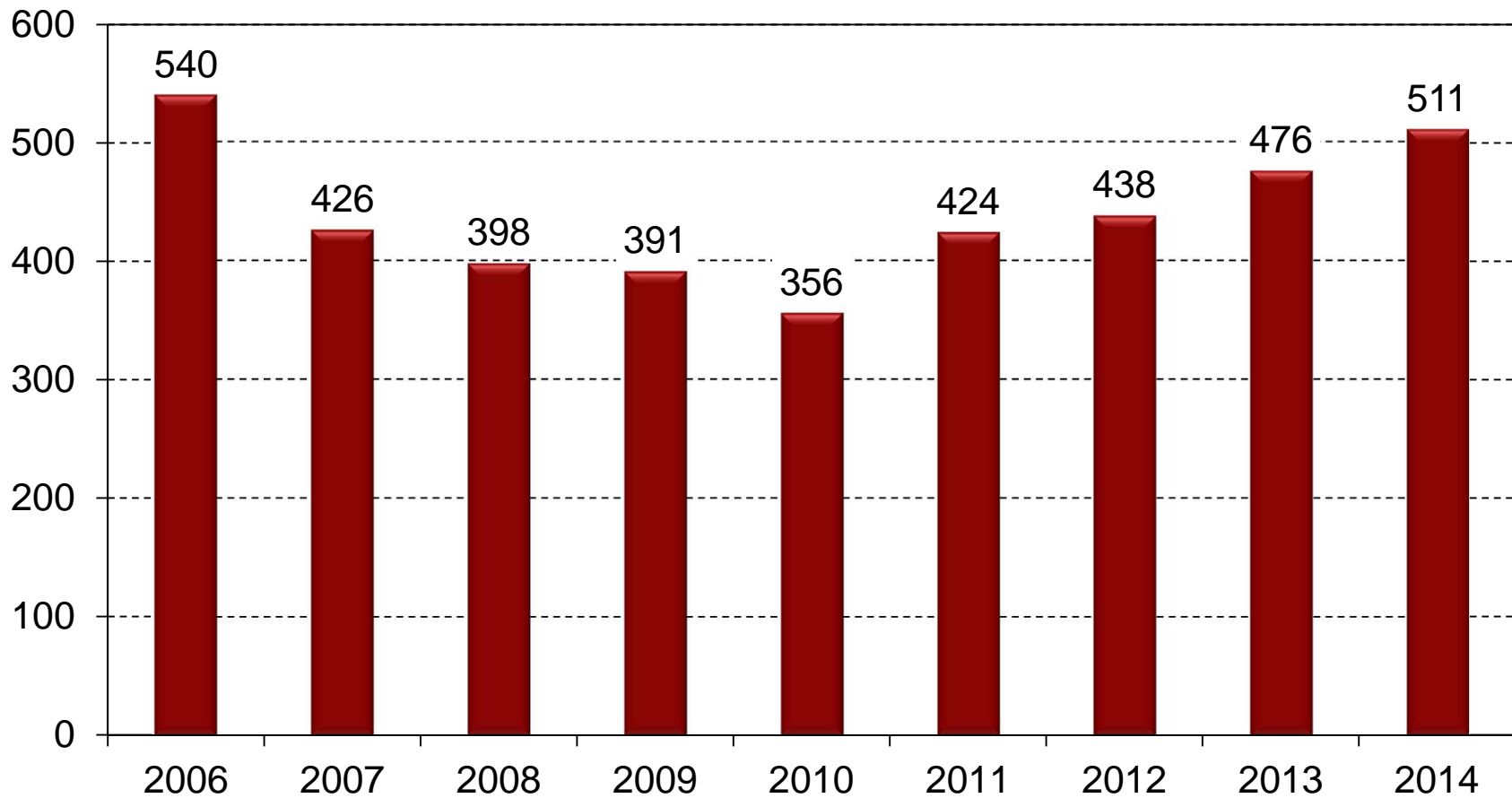

# Homicides in Milwaukee: 2005-2014



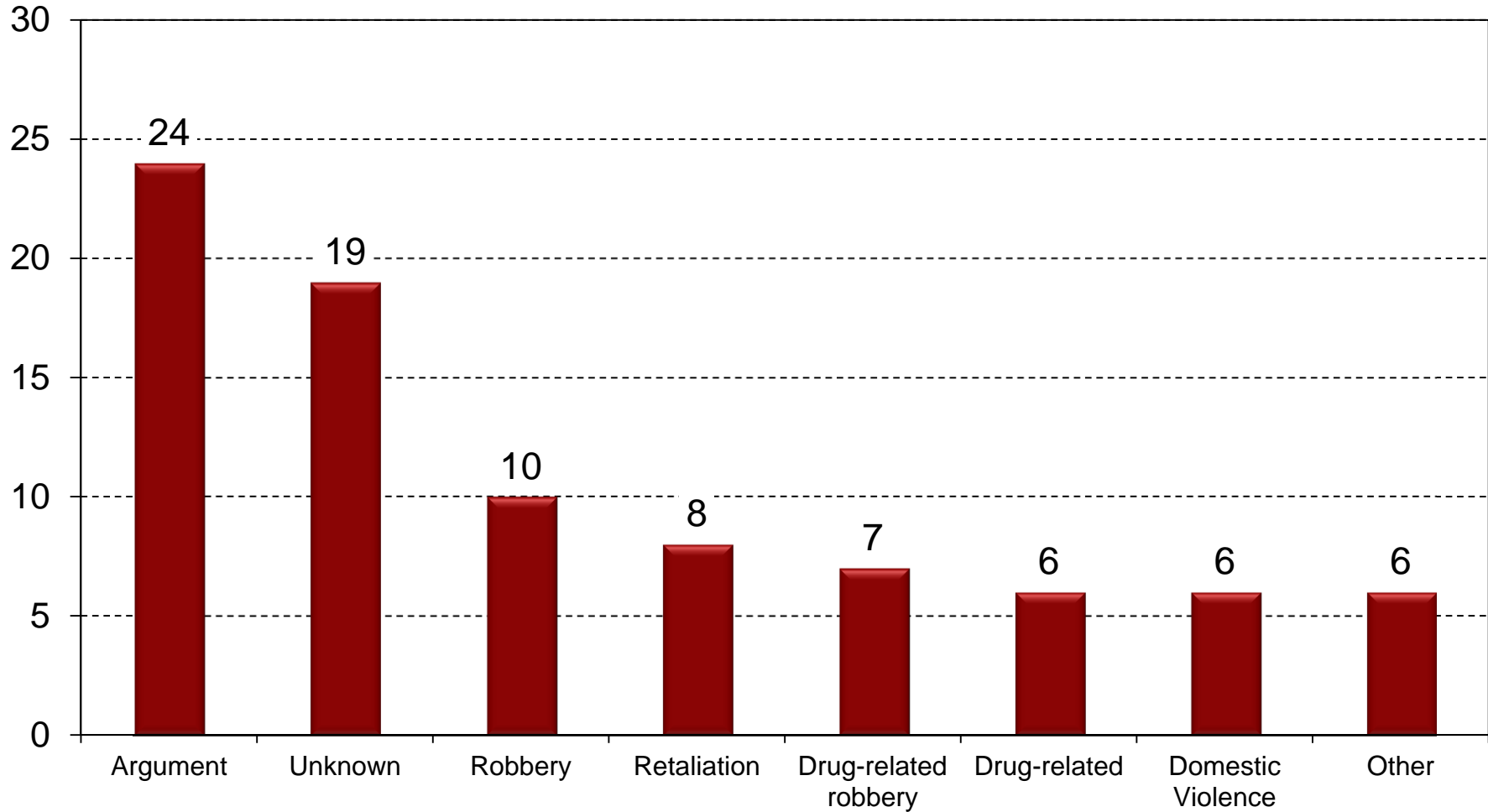

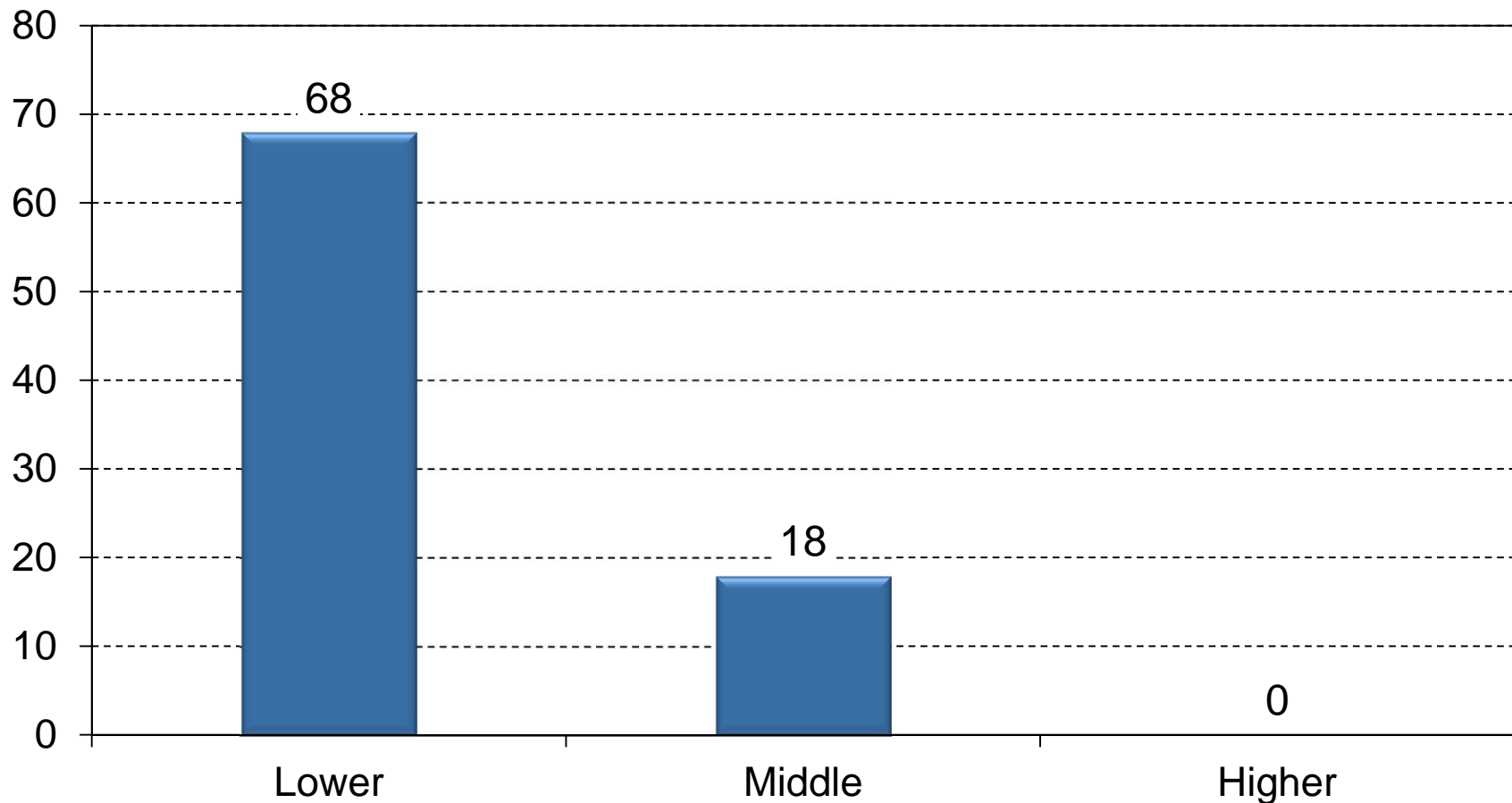
# Homicide Primary Factors: 2014

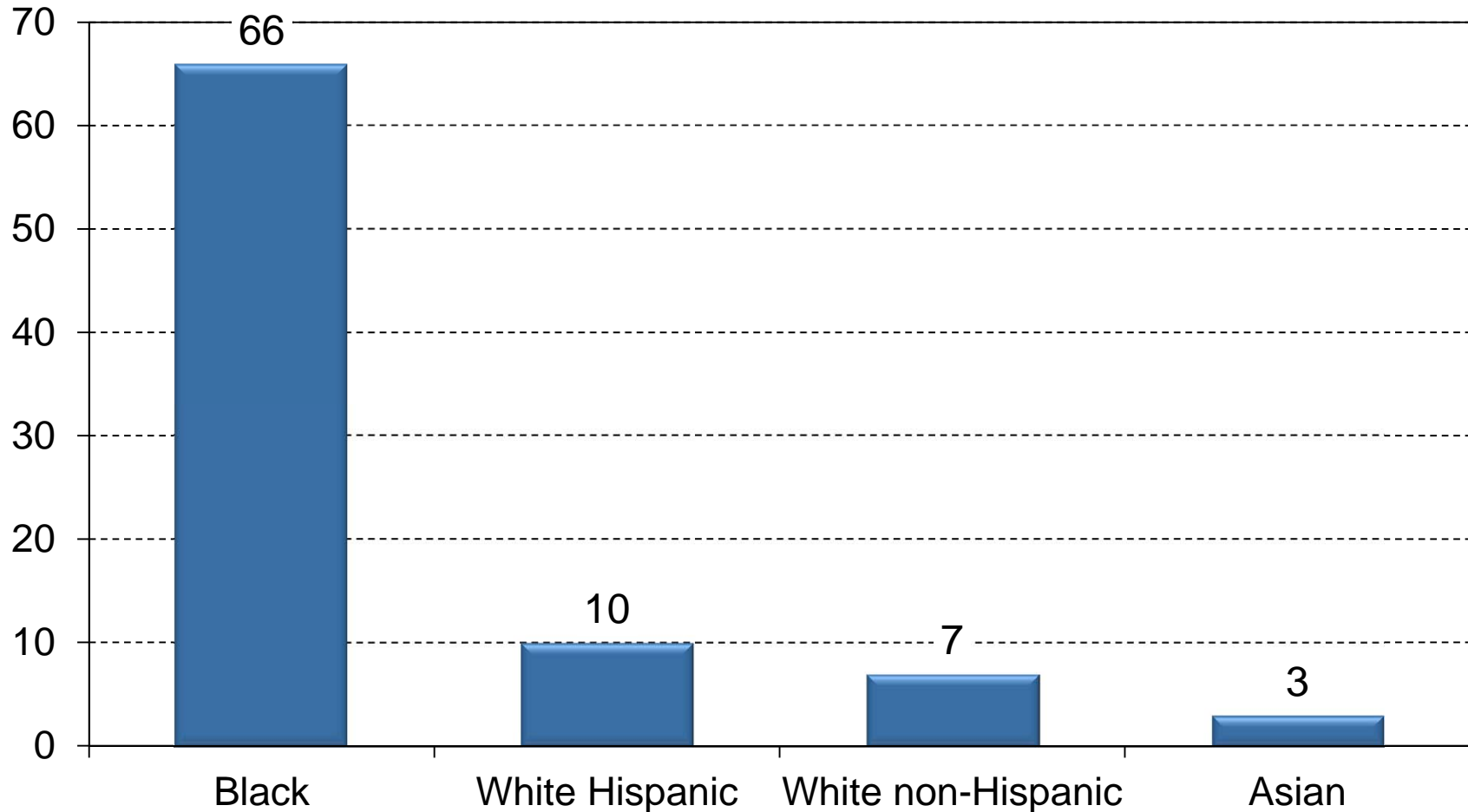


# Homicide Victims by Socioeconomic Status: 2014



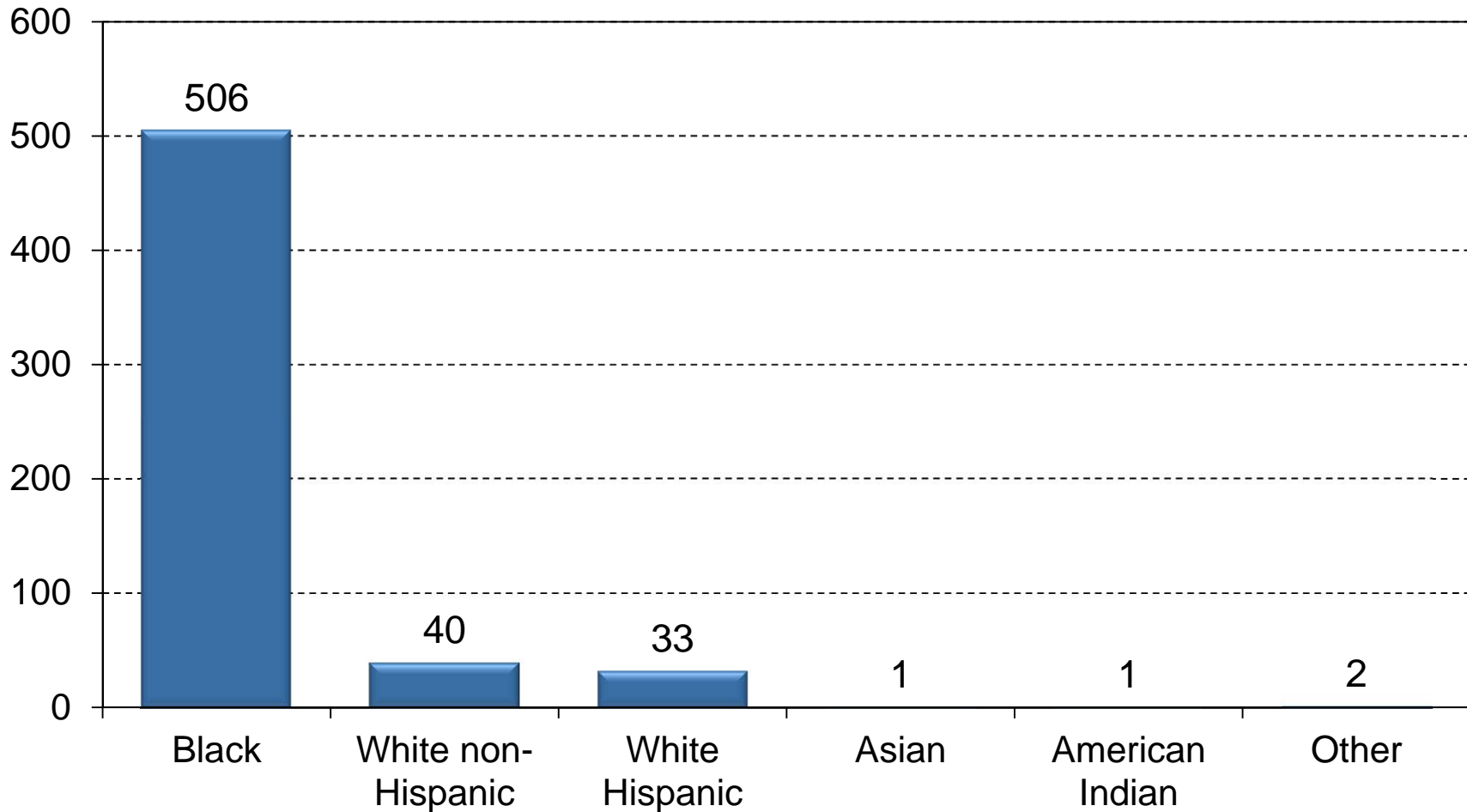

# Shooting Victims by Ethnicity: 2014



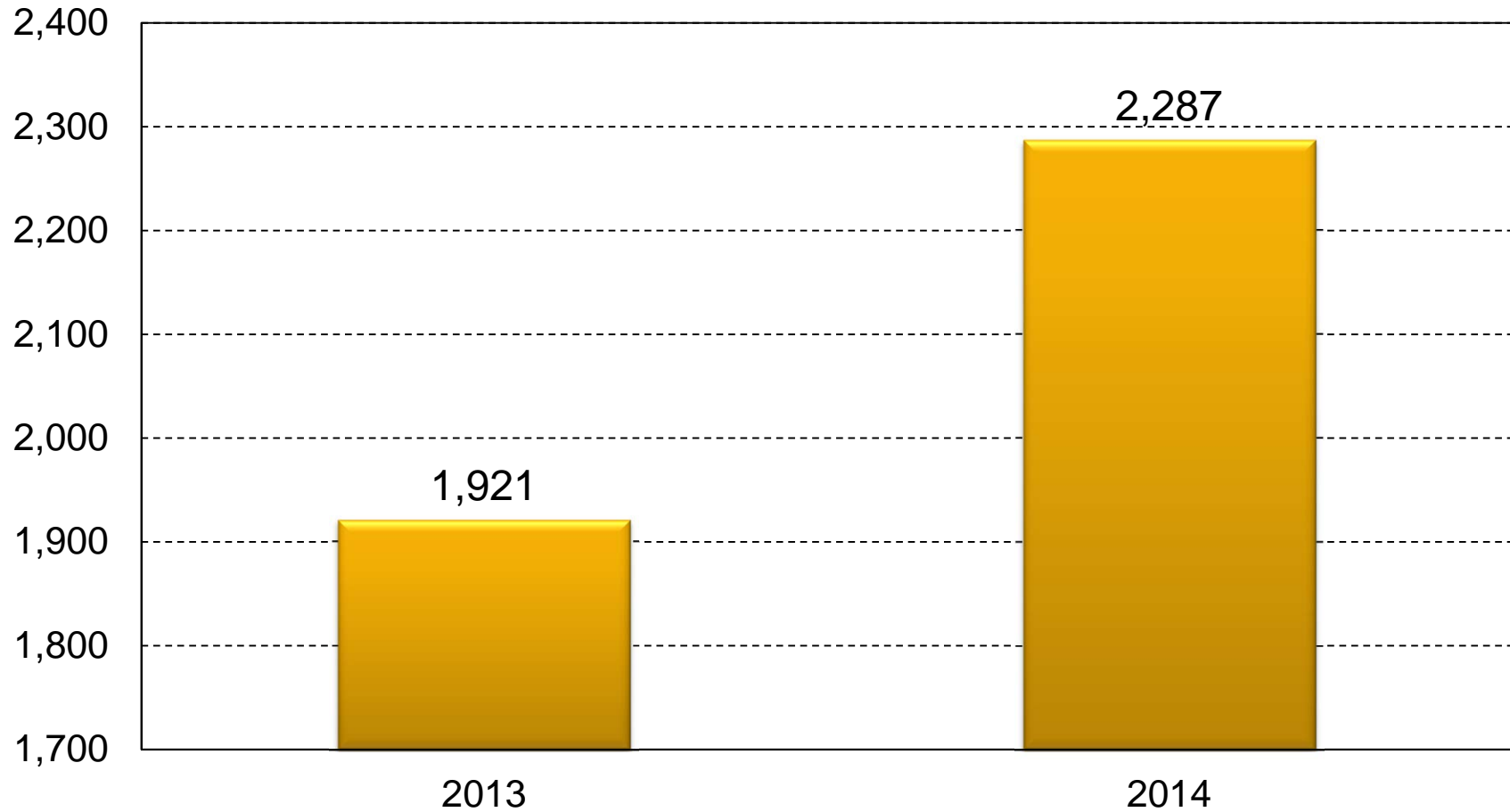

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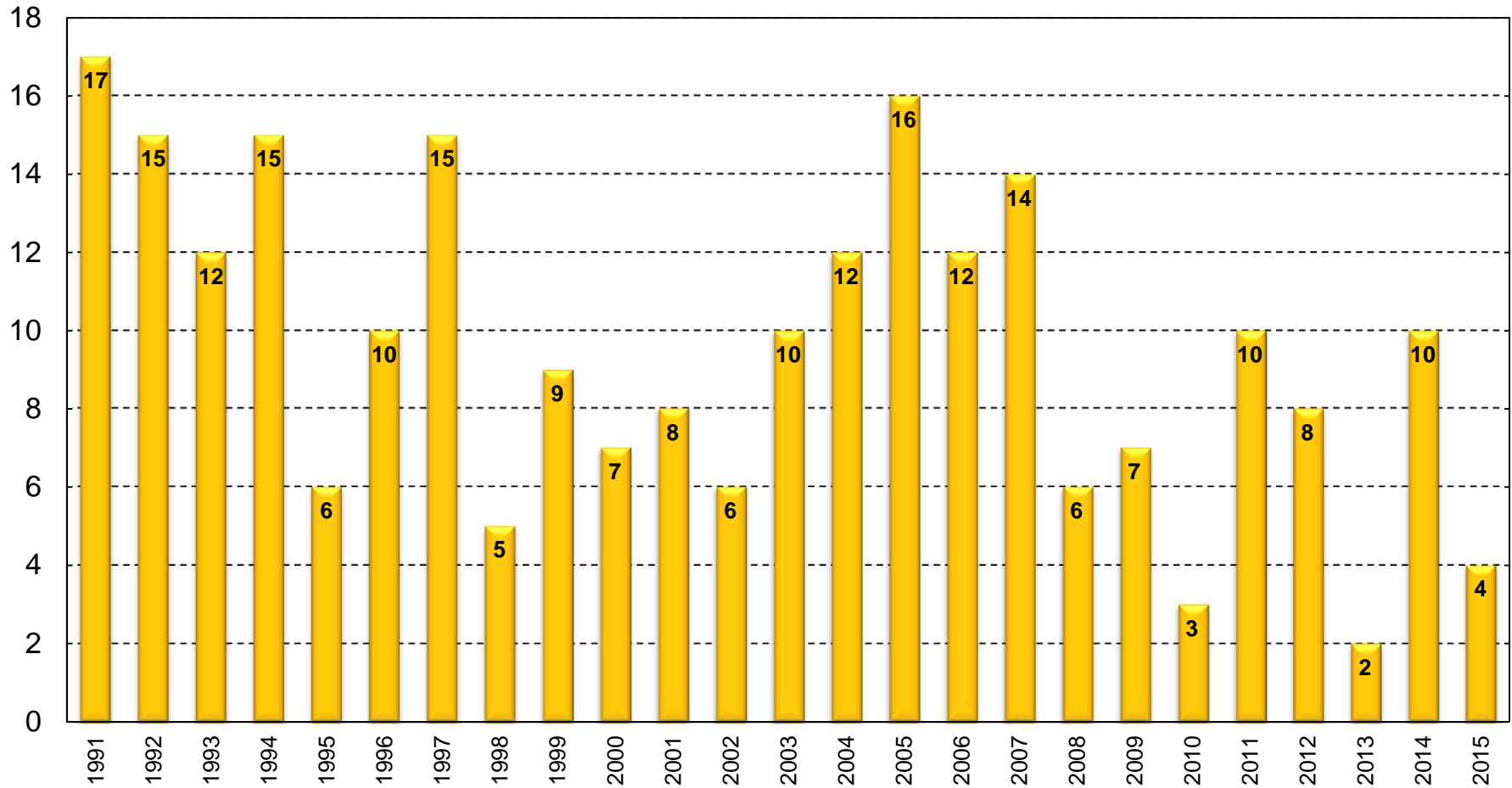
# Public Health Approaches to Violence Prevention

1. Increasing interest nationwide in a public health approach to violence prevention
2. Public health model incorporates the following:
  - ❑ identifies the “who, what, where, when, and how” of violent incidents
  - ❑ Establish Risk factors for violence
  - ❑ Develop and test prevention strategies
  - ❑ Disseminate and implement successful strategies on a broad scale.
