## Car Show To Benefit Family Of Slain Good Samaritan

Ald. Ashanti Hamilton Says Frank Moore's Family and Predominantly African American Fraternity Will be Beneficiaries of Saturday's Daytime Event

Milwaukee Ald. Ashanti Hamilton will join forces with the Milwaukee native who invented spinning wheel covers for a special car show that will raise money for the family of Frank Moore II, the northwest side father of three who was gunned down July 22 when he confronted a burglar at his neighbor's home.

The Davin Day Car Show – named for Davin Wheels founder and city native David Fowlkes, Jr. – will be held from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Saturday, August 12, 2006 at Club Escape, 6263 N. Teutonia Ave. The event will feature prizes and drawings, and it's open only to cars that are adorned exclusively with Davin "spinners." Set up time for show participants is from 9 a.m. to 11 a.m. Media coverage is invited.

Ald. Hamilton said the event will help raise money for the Milwaukee Sigma Beta Club of The Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity and for the family of Mr. Moore, who was tragically shot to death after he confronted a burglar at a home in the 5100 block of N. 65<sup>th</sup> St. "We wanted to organize a positive event to remember Frank Moore and to benefit his family and Phi Beta Sigma, and we wanted it to advocate against violence and to demonstrate unity and peace for those who like to cruise," said Ald. Hamilton.

David Fowlkes, Jr., a Rufus King High School graduate, invented his now patented spinning wheel covers in the late 1990s, and the "spinners" became a huge hit with Hip Hop stars and fans after they were introduced at the Los Angeles Auto Show. Today, "spinners" adorn cars driven by entertainers and celebrities, professional athletes and car enthusiasts of all ages.

The event will include a raffle featuring audio equipment and a custom paint job for a vehicle, as well as giveaways from various manufacturers and local businesses.
