Regarding: Your Class B Tavern and Public Entertainment Premises Licenses Renewal Application as agent for "Sky Pub and Grill LLC" for "SKY BAR" at 1339 S 7TH St. 

There is a possibility that your application may be denied for one or more of the following reasons: The recommendation of the committee regarding the application shall be based on evidence presented at the hearing. Per MCO 85-4-4, unless otherwise specified in the code, probative evidence concerning non-renewal, suspension or revocation may include evidence of the following: failure of the applicant to meet municipal qualifications, pending charges against or the conviction of any felony, misdemeanor, municipal offense or other offense, the circumstances of which substantially relate to the circumstances of the particular licensed or permitted activity, by the applicant or by any employee or other agent of the applicant. If the activities of the applicant involve a licensed premises, whether the premises tends to facilitate a public or private nuisance or has been the source of congregations of persons which have resulted in any of the following: disturbance of the peace; illegal drug activity; public drunkenness; drinking in public; harassment of passers-by; gambling; prostitution; sale of stolen goods; public urination; theft; assaults; battery; acts of vandalism including graffiti, excessive littering, loitering, illegal parking, loud noise at times when the licensed premise is open for business; traffic violations; curfew violations; lewd conduct; display of materials harmful to minors, pursuant to s. 106-9.6; or any other factor which reasonably relates to the public health, safety and welfare, or failure to comply with the approved plan of operation. It is the intention of the Common Council to suspend or non-renew the licenses if objectors provide testimony related to the factors enumerated in MCO 85-4-4 that the Common Council finds to be true by a preponderance of the evidence and/or police reports are found to be true by a preponderance of the evidence. The police reports and other attached documents relating to objections to the license are a part of this notice and expressly incorporated in this notice. The licensee should be prepared to address these matters at the hearing.

**Notice for applicants with
warrants or unpaid fines:**

Proof of warrant satisfaction or payment of fines must be submitted at the hearing on the above date and time. Failure to comply with this requirement may result in a delay of the granting/denial of your application.

Failure to appear at this meeting may result in the denial of your license. Individual applicants must appear only in person or by an attorney. Corporate or Limited Liability applicants must appear only by the agent designated on the application or by an attorney. Partnership applicants must appear by a partner listed on the application or by an attorney. If you wish to do so and at your own expense, you may be accompanied by an attorney of your choosing to represent you at this hearing.

You will be given an opportunity to speak on behalf of the application and to respond and challenge any charges or reasons given for the denial. No petitions can be accepted by the committee, unless the people who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify. You may present witnesses under oath and you may also confront and cross-examine opposing witnesses under oath. If you have difficulty with the English language, you should bring an interpreter with you, at your expense, so that you can answer questions and participate in your hearing.

You may examine the application file at this office during regular business hours prior to the hearing date. Inquiries regarding this matter may be directed to the person whose signature appears below.

Good morning,

As you know, the attached communication from former Milwaukee Police Department Captain Patrick Pajot was added as an objection to the renewal of this business' licenses. To confirm, there remains an objection to the renewal of this business' licenses. The objection is based on the reports at this location and the conduct of Ruben Albanil Coyolt. This includes the attached documents related to Ruben Albanil Coyolt, Sky Bar and the non-renewal of El Cielo Bar. The attached conduct related to Ruben Albanil Coyolt at his residence and El Cielo should be considered by the Committee for the renewal application.

Wis. Stat. § 125.04(5)(b) states that no license or permit may be issued to any person who has "habitually been a law offender" unless the person has been duly pardoned. This provision does not require a conviction to be considered a habitual law offender. The supreme court held that "'habitually been a law offender' covers all persons who are shown to have habitually violated the law, not just those persons who have been convicted on multiple occasions". *State ex rel. Smith v. Oak Creek*, 139 Wis. 2d 788, 798, 407 N.W.2d 901, 905 (1987). Moreover, Wis. Stat. § 125.04(6)(a)2 states that no LLC may be issued any alcohol beverage license unless the agent has satisfactory character, record and reputation as determined by this Committee.

City of Milwaukee Ordinance § 90-2 recognized the requirements imposed by Wis. Stat. ch. 125 and provided regulations in addition to those Wis. Stat. ch. 125 requirements. City of Milwaukee Ordinance § 90-11-2-c-1-a provides a basis of non-renewal as a failure of the applicant to meet statutory and municipal license qualifications. There is also the discretionary determination in City of Milwaukee Ordinance § 90-11-2-c-1-g related to any other factor "which reasonably relate to the public health, safety and welfare".

In the present case, Ruben Albanil Coyolt is demonstrated as a habitual law offender. It is first shown in the October 18, 2024, report regarding the recovery of controlled substances at his residence and the amount of controlled substances recovered. Another offense occurred with the alcohol violation discovered on July 30, 2024 at El Cielo bar (1226 W. National Ave.). On that date, 139 bottles of liquor were confiscated from El Cielo. When interviewed, Ruben Albanil Coyolt stated that he buys his liquor from a retail shop and it is not his fault when the retail store knows he is a licensed bar and would sell to him regardless.

That statement is contrary to his previously submitted licensing applications for Sky Bar for this time period. There are two relevant applications for that period for Ruben Albanil Coyolt and Sky Bar:

1. BTAVN 211480 which covered July 31, 2023 to July 30, 2024.
 - a. This application received on June 2, 2023, reported that Ruben Albanil Coyolt was the agent of Sky Pub and Grill LLC.
 - b. The application acknowledged he must purchase alcohol beverages from wholesalers, breweries and brewpubs.
 - c. The renewal form specifically states that the renewal form cannot be used if the LLC has been dissolved.
2. BTAVN 212478 which covered July 2, 2024 to July 30, 2025.
 - a. The application was dated May 30, 2024 and signed by Ruben Albanil Coyolt as the owner of Sky Pub and Grill LLC.
 - b. The application provided an attestation that Ruben Albanil Coyolt knew he must purchase alcohol beverages from state authorized wholesalers.
 - c. The application provided an attestation that Ruben Albanil Coyolt agrees to operate the business according to law.

Two months after signing an attestation for this license stating he will buy liquor from a wholesaler, Ruben Albanil Coyolt admitted that he buys his liquor from a retail establishment and then blamed the retail establishment for this offense.

Finally, there are the circumstances surrounding the shooting near this location on March 9, 2025, that must be considered. Six .40 caliber casings were recovered from the 1200 block of S. 7th St. Detective William del Moral spoke with William Santiago-Nieves. This individual was on scene, was a victim to a battery and was contracted as security officer working at the location. Santiago-Nieves was in possession of a firearm in a concealed manner without a state certified CCW permit. Santiago-Nieves stated that he did not have a CCW permit, or an armed security permit and was not the rightful owner of the firearm. The firearm recovered from Santiago-Nieves was a 9mm.

Santiago-Nieves was wearing a "black security vest 'plate carrier style', nylon black duty belt, with a black polymer holster securing a black semi-auto pistol under a black coat concealing the nylon belt, firearm and additional tools (pepper spray, handcuffs, etc...)." In an a later interview with Detective William del Moral, Santiago-Nieves said he wore the firearm in an open-carry manner, but was outside after the physical altercation and put on his jacket. Detective William del Moral also spoke with Christopher De Jesus Orengo Ortiz who identified himself as the operator of Black Knight Patrol who is the security company that employs Santiago-Nieves. It was reported that Santiago-Nieves started as unarmed security and worked his way up to armed security but did not have the property certifications to work as armed security or a valid CCW permit.

Records from the Wisconsin Department of Financial Institutions demonstrate that Sky Pub and Grill LLC was administratively dissolved from September 13, 2023 to July 22, 2024. Wis. Stat. § 183.0708(4) states that an administratively dissolved LLC "continues in existence as an entity but may not carry on any activities except as necessary to wind up its activities and affairs and liquidate its assets". Even though Wis. Stat. § 183.0709(4)(a) allows reinstatement to relate back to and take effect on the effective date of administrative resolution, the heightened negligence of Ruben Albanil Coyolt to allow the licensee LLC to administratively dissolve for nearly a year while engaging in all of this other behavior is unable to be ignored in the totality of the circumstances.

The original scene of the incident 1223 S. 7th Street (Sky Bar) had interior and exterior cameras, which capture video of the incident. The manager stated he did not have the password to the camera system. Detective STEWERT later collected the DVR system from 1223 S. 7th Street, and conveyed the DVR system to the Kenosha Police Department so that the scene video could be extracted from the DVR system.

In addition to the reasons stated above, Ruben Albanil Coyolt is disqualified from applying for an alcohol license. City of Milwaukee Ordinance § 90-5-9-a states that whenever an alcohol license is not renewed, the procedures for disqualification for license and change of circumstances provided in City of Milwaukee Ordinances §§ 85-13 and 85-15 apply. City of Milwaukee Ordinance § 85-13-1 states that when there is a non-renewal of an alcohol beverage retail establishment or tavern entertainment license, the disqualification periods apply to any other type of alcohol beverage retail establishment license. Pursuant to City of Milwaukee Ordinance § 85-13-5, whenever a license is not renewed, "no other application by the same applicant for the same license, and where applicable, at the same premises, shall be recommended for approval by the licensing committee" for twelve months following the date of nonrenewal.

The attached documents show that Ruben Albanil Coyolt had a Class B tavern license for El Celio bar. A Class B tavern license is defined in City of Milwaukee Ordinance § 90-1-2-5 as the document combining the Class B retailer's intoxicating liquor license and the Class B fermented malt beverage retailer's license. That license was not renewed in November 2024 for his conduct at El Celio bar as outlined in the attached documents. Therefore, Ruben Albanil Coyolt is disqualified from applying for this renewal at Sky Bar at this time.

All of the above-recited conduct and attached documents directly relate to Ruben Albanil Coyolt's ability to have a license for Sky Bar. There are numerous violations over a period of time which show that he is a habitual law offender pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 125.04(5)(b). Moreover, the above-described conduct and the non-renewal of El Cielo bar go to the statutory and municipal qualifications to hold another alcohol license including the character, record and reputation of Ruben Albanil Coyolt pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 125.04(6)(a)2. In the end, Ruben Albanil Coyolt has failed to meet the required qualifications and his conduct demonstrates an adverse impact on the health, safety and welfare of the public and neighborhood.

Narrative
Title INITIAL INVESTIGATION

This report is written by Detective William del Moral assigned to the Criminal Investigations Bureau, Gun Violence Division (GVD) Late shift (*Squad 9341*).

On Sunday, March 9, 2025, at approximately 12:09AM; I responded to 1339 S 7th St. (*In the City and County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin*) as an investigator regarding shooting investigation C25-03080148. While on scene it was determined a person identified as **William Santiago-Nieves (h/m, 06/23/1979)** was on scene, and as a victim to a battery while contracted as a Security Officer, was in possession of a firearm in a concealed manner without a state certified CCW permit.

During a briefing on scene by Sgt. K. Bolyard (*Sqd 2214*); it was determined Santiago-Nieves was battered while performing his official duty as a security guard at the aforementioned location when one of the battery suspects was shot. It was revealed during the briefing Santiago-Nieves was armed with a firearm. It was determined on scene by speaking to Santiago-Nieves that he currently does not have a CCW permit, or an "armed security" permit, and was also not the rightful owner of the firearm. A more thorough check confirmed using law enforcement resources revealing Santiago-Nieves was not a CCW permit holder in violation of state laws.

During the briefing, and in the context of the shooting investigation it was determined Santiago-Nieves was to be detained, and presumably disarmed by Officers on scene for CCW violation and determination of the shooting investigation.

It is normal protocol, during a shooting investigation or a CCW violation; for the safety of the Officer and Suspect for the Suspect(s) to be disarmed and detained. Having uniformed Officers take physical control of any weapon or firearm.

Upon speaking with Sgt. A. Halase (*Sqd 2210*) we were informed that Santiago-Nieves was detained, by



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means of a uniformed officer being in his (*Santiago-Nieves*) presence while Santiago-Nieves maintained full physical control of his firearm on his person and any additional weapons.

Upon entering 1339 S 7th St. (*La Cama Club Dance Place*) Detective Stewart and I located Santiago-Nieves seated at the bar wearing black security vest "*plate carrier style*", nylon black duty belt, with a black polymer holster securing a black semi-auto pistol under a black coat concealing the nylon belt, firearm and additional tools (*pepper spray, handcuffs, etc...*)

I identified and approached Santiago-Nieves at the bar, asked and determined him to still be armed with a firearm and with his compliance, disarmed him. Detective Stewart took control of the firearm (see *supplement regarding.*)

I escorted Santiago-Nieves out of the bar and explained to him that so long as his firearm was under his coat, he was in violation of state law and had to be taken into custody. Santiago-Nieves stated he understood and was compliant with the investigation and my demands.

While speaking to Santiago-Nieves I observed redness and swelling to the right side of his face. Santiago-Nieves stated prior to the shooting incident he was "*jumped*" by three individuals who knocked him to the ground, and battered him with their hands and feet. He stated the subjects then fled on foot northbound in the 1300 block of S 7th St., at which time he then heard multiple gunshots coming from their direction.

Squad 2320 arrived on scene, arrested Santiago-Nieves and conveyed him to St. Francis Hospital for proper medical clearance prior to taking Santiago-Nieves to MPD's Central Booking for processing.

During the investigation I spoke with **Christopher De Jesus Orengo Ortiz (h/m, 07/24/01, alias Christopher Orengo)** who identified himself as the operator of Black Knight Patrol (BKP); the security company that employs Santiago-Nieves.

Orengo stated Santiago-Nieves has been employed by Black Knight Patrol for approximately 12 months. Santiago-Nieves started as "unarmed security" and worked his way up to "armed security" but did not have the proper certifications to work as armed security or a valid CCW permit. Santiago-Nieves works for BKP on a part-time basis, less than 20 hours per week.

Orengo stated he had signed Santiago-Nieves up to take the proper certification classes for the near future but currently did not have certifications (*Armed-security, CCW*).

Orengo stated Santiago-Nieves contacted him via work radio after he (*Santiago-Nieves*) had to remove several subjects from the business after an altercation. As Santiago-Nieves removed the subjects, one of the subjects grabbed Santiago-Nieves by his plate carrier and pulled him to the ground off the entry stairs and onto the sidewalk near a dumpster. Upon landing on the ground, three suspects who had been removed from the bar began striking Santiago-Nieves to his head and upper body with their hands and feet causing him pain and discomfort. Santiago-Nieves then informed Orengo that he heard shots fired coming from the direction of the subjects that jumped him.

I identified and spoke to **Jahaira Ortiz-Jorge (h/f, 09/22/1978)** whom was also employed by Black Knight Patrol.

Ortiz declared she was the owner of the Tisas PX-9 which was recovered. She has been letting Santiago-Nieves use the firearm for duty purpose only as family and a friend.

Ortiz and Orengo could not provide any additional information regarding the investigation(s).

On Sunday, March 9, 2025, at approximately 12:09AM; I responded to 1339 S 7th St. (In the City and County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin) as an investigator regarding shooting investigation C25-03080148.

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While on scene, it was determined a person identified as **William Santiago-Nieves (h/m, 06/23/1979)** was on scene, and as a victim to a battery while contracted as a Security Officer, was in possession of a firearm in a concealed manner without a state certified CCW permit.

On Sunday, March 9, 2025, at approximately 9:45AM I went to the Milwaukee Police Department Central Booking Facility (CB) at 749 W State St. in Milwaukee County, Wisconsin, to conduct a prisoner interview of **William Santiago-Nieves (h/m, 06/23/1979)**, who is in-custody for Carrying a Concealed Weapons violation.

I initiated the Evidence.com Axon audio and video recording system in interview room 425D at 9:47AM. The Axon system was currently not functioning and audio recording of the interview was performed. Santiago-Nieves was located in the B-cell block of CB, Cell B5 and escorted while in handcuffs to the interview room; the handcuffs were removed once inside the room and Santiago-Nieves was offered a Diet Coke soft drink.

The following is a synopsis, and not a word-for-word dictation, of the interview with Santiago-Nieves. For a complete understanding of any statements and the context in which they were made, the recording of this interview would need to be reviewed. The majority of this interview was performed in Spanish, Santiago-Nieves native language. At approximately 10:00AM, I reviewed a PA-45A Pedigree form with Santiago-Nieves.

Interview

William Santiago-Nieves

(h/m, 06/23/1979)

Santiago-Nieves was informed that he was arrested on scene for violation of CCW state laws; which prohibits the carrying of many firearm or dangerous weapon in a manner in which it is concealed from plain view. Santiago-Nieves stated he understood why he was arrested.

Santiago-Nieves declared he began his shift at "sky bar" at about 10:00PM on Saturday March 8th, 2025 as scheduled.

Upon entering the location he observed and greeted patrons of the bar, and noticed three Hispanic males highly intoxicated at the bar that he did not recognize as "regular patrons." Santigao-Nieves described the males as:



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Subject 1(S1): Hispanic male, early to mid 30's, low to short haircut

Subject 2(S2): Hispanic male, early to mid 30's, low to short haircut

Subject 3(S3): Hispanic male, early to mid 30's, tall, medium to heavy build, mid to long hair in a ponytail style.

Santiago-Nieves declared that subject 3, he recognized from working security on 11th and Greenfield. Santiago-Nieves' earlier security shift is a contract with Greenfield Liquor Market (1110 W. Greenfield Ave.) While working there, he periodically walks across the street to the south to The Blue Kangaroo Laundry (1115 W. Greenfield Ave.) On multiple occasions at The Blue Kangaroo Laundry he has spoken to a female employee he knows to be the Wife of Subject 3, and has seen Subject 3 at that location numerous times.

At about one hour into his shift at "Sky bar", the operator/bartender requested that Santiago-Nieves; in his security capacity remove the three intoxicated subjects. Santiago-Nieves stated that he observed the subjects behaving in an unruly manner and being disrespectful and belligerent towards the bartender and staff.

Santiago-Nieves escorted the three males to the exit door begrudgingly and they continued to behave in an aggressive and disruptive manner. Upon getting the primary actor out of the door (S1), pulled the door open as Santiago-Nieves attempted to pull the door closed. As a struggle for the door began, one of the actors (S1 or 2) grabbed Santiago-Nieves by his Security vest pulling him through the doorway and down the two entrance steps. Santiago-Nieves stated he lost his footing and landed face down on to the concrete sidewalk using his hands to break the fall.

Santiago-Nieves declared he then felt being punched and kicked to his face, and felt a 3rd actor striking him to the back of his head. Santiago-Nieves declared he knew there were 3 people attacking him and felt confident S3 was the subject striking him to the back of his head.

While on the ground (*sidewalk/concrete*) Santiago-Nieves curled his arms over his face and attempted to grab his radio to communicate with his company to request help, when all three actors ran northbound in the 1300 block of S. 7th St. on the west side sidewalk.

As the subjects ran, Santiago-Nieves soon (*undetermined amount of time*) audibly heard multiple gunshots coming from the direction in which the actors fled on foot. Santiago-Nieves heard a person yelling as if they had been struck by gunfire but could not identify who had been shot. He (*Santiago-Nieves*) then saw a smaller frame pick-up truck flee northbound and crash on to the side walk to the north.

Santiago-Nieves recovered himself from the ground and called his supervisor (*earlier identified as Christopher Orengo*) over the company radio advising as to what had happened.

Orengo arrived on scene prior to uniformed Officer with Ortiz (*Jahiara Ortiz-identified in Supplement .001*), who had left her security post to assist Santiago-Nieves until uniformed officer arrived on scene.

Santiago-Nieves stated he was carrying the firearm in an Open-Carry manner; but was outside after the physical altercation and was cold due to the cooler temperatures, which he is still acclimating too. Santiago-Nieves moved from 12-months prior to the date of this report.

Upon squads arriving on scene, he went inside the Sky bar and put on his coat to warm up. Upon talking



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to uniformed officer, the coat he was wearing concealed his firearm and utility belt.

Santiago-Nieves declared he identified himself to responding squads on scene, and told them he was armed security who had been involved in the fight preceding the shooting. He (*Santiago-Nieves*) declared the squads and supervisor on-scene did not disarm him and only instructed him to stay inside Sky bar.

Upon arriving on scene, regarding shooting investigation C25-03080148; I identified **William Santiago-Nieves (h/m, 06/23/1979)** on scene, and as a victim to a battery while contracted as a Security Officer, was in possession of a firearm in a concealed manner, contrary to Wisconsin statute 941.23, Carrying Concealed Weapon without a state certified CCW permit-certification.

I performed an arrest of Santiago-Nieves on scene without incident, and the firearm recovered was placed on INV. 25005972. Santiago-Nieves was conveyed to St. Francis Hospital for medical clearance before being conveyed by Squad 2320 to Central Booking for processing.

This report is written by Detective Janay PATTERSON, assigned to the Gun Violence Division of the Criminal Investigation Bureau.

On Sunday, March 9, 2025, Lieutenant Jasmine ARCE instructed me to respond to Froedtert Hospital regarding a shooting that occurred at 1329 N 7th St, which is in the City and County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin. The victim, Jose M. SIERRA-ZARATE (H/M, 06/22/91), sustained multiple gunshot wounds to his left flank, left shoulder, and right arm.

Upon arrival, I spoke with Squad 2241 (P.O. MARTINEZ VAZQUEZ), who informed me that SIERRA-ZARATE was unable to speak during the ambulance ride from the scene to the hospital because paramedics were stabilizing him due to critical injuries sustained from the shooting. SIERRA-ZARATE was admitted to the hospital at 11:23 PM and was under the care of Dr. Taylor Sonnenberg. I was informed that SIERRA-ZARATE only speaks Spanish, and P.O. MARTINEZ VAZQUEZ translated for me during the interview.

SIERRA-ZARATE stated that he was at a bar with his brother when a physical altercation broke out. He said he attempted to break up the fight, but when it continued, he decided to leave before the confrontation escalated. As he walked to his vehicle, which he described as a red pickup truck, he noticed the security guard from inside the bar following him. SIERRA-ZARATE reported that the security guard followed him to his vehicle and shot at him several times. He attempted to get bystanders to help, but no one assisted him, so he got into his car and drove away. After speaking with SIERRA-ZARATE, I took digital photographs of him and his injuries. He was then transferred from Trauma Room C to SICU Room 19.

On Sunday, March 9, 2025, I was instructed by Sergeant Sean MCCORD to respond to 1223 S 7th St for a shooting investigation.

Upon arrival, I, along with Detective Albert DAMMONS (Squad 9347) and Detective William DEL MORAL (Squad 9341), were briefed regarding the shooting by Sergeant Kevin BOLYARD (Squad 2214). We were advised that William SANTIAGO-NIEVES (w/m 06/23/79) was working security at 1339 S 7th St (Sky Bar), and he was armed with a handgun. We were advised that SANTIAGO-NIEVES did not have a CCW permit and was carrying the firearm concealed, and it was determined that he would be arrested for CCW.

I went to Sky Bar with Detective DEL MORAL, and Detective DEL MORAL recovered the handgun and holster from SANTIAGO-NIEVES' person and handed me the property.

I took the handgun to my squad car, removed the magazine and locked the slide back, revealing there was a live cartridge in the chamber.

FI Sarah RAKOWSKI took photos of the firearm, holster and ammunition. I later inventoried the firearm and other items and delivered the handgun to B of I for processing and NIBINS test firing.

While on scene, I was also instructed to attempt video retrieval from Sky Bar. I spoke with the owner of the bar, Ruben ALBANIL-COYOLT (w/m 06/08/85), and he advised me that the surveillance system should have recorded the incident, but he did not have access to it. ALBANIL-COYOLT stated the surveillance system was password protected, and he did not have the password. ALBANIL-COYOLT stated somebody was supposed to come out to the following day to reset access to the system.

I viewed the camera system and confirmed it was password protected.

I relayed the information to Sergeant MCCORD, and he stated we would wait until the following day to see if the video could be accessed.

This report is written by Detective William del Moral assigned to the Criminal Investigations Bureau, Gun Violence Division (GVD) Late shift (*Squad 9341*).

On Wednesday, March 19, 2025 at approximately 7:00 AM; I responded to 2558 S 7th St. (*In the City and County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin*) as an investigator regarding shooting investigation C25-03080148. The purpose of my knock and talk at the residence was to interview a witness to the shooting; which occurred on March 8th, 2025 identified as **Juan A. Sierra-Zarate (h/m, 08/12/1995)**.

Sierra-Zarate was on scene during a battery which preceded the shooting incident at 1339 S. 7th St. at about 11:00PM on 03/08/2025.

I located Juan Sierra-Zarate at the address and he confirmed it to be his primary residence. Sierra-Zarate stated he is a laborer at

Sierra-Zarate stated he wasn't sure what time he arrived at Sky bar (1339 S. 7th St.) and was there as a patron with his brother, Jose Sierra-Zarate; whom was identified as the victim of the shooting incident.

Sierra-Zarate declared that they were at the location drinking, and were intoxicated so his recollection is limited. Sierra-Zarate stated his brother was pretty intoxicated and he remembers a female bartender serving him cups of ice water. Sierra-Zarate stated he remembers momentarily walking away from the bar only to be told by the onsite security officer that he had to leave.

Sierra-Zarate stated he was pretty intoxicated and remembers being forced out of the bar while his brother sat at the bar. Sierra-Zarate stated he grabbed the entrance door from outside and was only trying to get his brother; when he remembers being thrown on to the concrete sidewalk. Sierra-Zarate stated he remembers being punched and kicked but doesn't know if it was the security guard or another party. Sierra-Zarate stated he remembers someone grabbing him by his clothing material in a dragging manner and hearing someone yell about a gun.

Sierra-Zarate declared once he was able to get to his feet, he and his brother fled on foot northbound. Within a second or two (*measure of time*) he heard his brother say something about being shot when he heard the gunfire of a firearm. Sierra-Zarate stated he has no idea who was shooting and jumped in the passenger side of his brothers' pickup truck. Upon moving out of the parking spot, his brother told him he was shot and crashed the truck on the west-side of the street onto the sidewalk.

Sierra-Zarate told that he remembers the squads showing up, but wasn't sure if he spoke to any uniformed officers until he was issued a citation for Battery regarding the security guard. Sierra-Zarate stated he tried to tell the Officers he had nothing to do with a fight but was issued a citation regardless.

On Saturday, March 8th, 2025, at approximately 11:54 PM, Sergeant Sean MCCORD instructed me to respond to the address of 1223 S. 7th Street, which is located in the City and County of Milwaukee Wisconsin, to investigate a shooting incident. I arrived on scene on Sunday, March 9th, 2025, at approximately 12:09am, at which time I attended a briefing regarding the preliminary information of the shooting.

Synopsis:

Sergeant BOLYARD stated on Saturday, March 8th, 2025, at approximately 11:00am, officers responded to the address of 1329 S. 7th Street, to investigate a shooting incident. Sergeant BOLYARD stated upon arrival, officers observed a vehicle, later identified as a: Red, 2000, Chevrolet S10 pick-up truck, WI: UX7783 – VIN: 1GCCS19W1YK250416, on the sidewalk in front of the listed address, and appeared to have damage from a crash. Sergeant BOLYARD stated the driver of the crashed vehicle, later identified as Jose M. SIERRA-ZARATE (M/H, 06/22/1991) was observed slumped over the steering wheel, of the crashed vehicle and was pulled from the vehicle through the front passenger door. Sergeant BOLYARD stated officers observed a total of five (5) gunshot wounds on SIERRA-ZARATE's person (left lower back, left shoulder, left buttocks, and right arm). Sergeant BOLYARD stated SIERRA-ZARATE was transported to Froedtert Medical Hospital for medical treatment. Sergeant BOLYARD stated six (6) casings were recovered from in the 1200 block of S. 7th Street.

Scene description:

The primary scene of the incident is located in the 1300 block of S. 7th Street. The original parking



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position of the victim vehicle as well as the recovered spent casings, were observed directly in front of 1337 S. 7th Street. S. 7th Street is a one-way (North) street, with East facing, diagonal parking on the street.

At the time of the shooting, the lighting conditions were dark, with artificial lighting from lights posted on the exterior of the surrounding houses, as well as several City of Milwaukee street lights, which line the street. According to www.theweatherchannel.com at the time of the shooting, the weather conditions were 41 degrees with no precipitation.

Evidence collection:

All pieces of evidence recovered from the scene were marked with yellow/numbered crime scene makers (CSM). Using a "Lomnum" digital laser distance meter, I measured the location of each piece of evidence from a fixed reference point (RP). The fixed reference point (RP) was a City of Milwaukee light post, with is located in the East curb of South 7th Street, in front of the address of 1320 S. 7th street. The coordinates of the (RP) are Longitude: 43.01751 degrees North and Latitude: 87.91963 degrees West. The coordinates of the (RP) were obtained using <https://earth.google.com>.

The following evidence was measured from the fixed reference point (RP):

- CSM #1 - Spent, Brass, .40mm casing, stamped "HORNADY 40 S&W". Measurements 44.22 feet South and 46.53 feet West from the reference point. Placed on Inventory 2500597 (Item 1 of 6).
- CSM #2 - Spent, Brass, .40mm casing, stamped "FEDERAL 40 S&W". Measurements 40.02 feet South and 47.07 feet West from the reference point. Placed on Inventory 2500597 (Item 2 of 6).
- CSM #3 - Spent, Brass, .40mm casing, stamped "HORNADY 40 S&W". Measurements 38.20 feet South and 41.60 feet West from the reference point. Placed on Inventory 2500597 (Item 3 of 6).
- CSM #4 - Spent, deformed bullet. Measurements 0.98 feet North and 37.26 feet West from the reference point. Placed on Inventory 25005974 (Item 1 of 2).
- CSM #5 - Spent, deformed bullet. Measurements 2.38 feet North and 38.54 feet West from the reference point. Placed on Inventory 25005974 (Item 2 of 2).
- CSM #7 - Spent, Brass, .40mm casing, stamped "FEDERAL 40 S&W". Measurements 3.89 feet North and 27.07 feet West from the reference point. Placed on Inventory 2500597 (Item 4 of 6).
- CSM #8 - Spent, Brass, .40mm casing, stamped "FEDERAL 40 S&W". Measurements 4.44 feet North and 34.61 feet West from the reference point. Place on Inventory 2500597 (Item 5 of 6).
- CSM #9 - Spent, Brass, .40mm casing, stamped "FEDERAL 40 S&W" Measurements 10.35 feet North and 30.65 feet West from the reference point. Placed on Inventory 2500597 (Item 6 of 6).



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Using latex gloves, I collected each piece of evidence, placed each item in a manila evidence envelope, and transported the items to the Milwaukee Police Administration Building. I later hand delivered the spent casings to the Milwaukee Police Department National Integrated Ballistic Information Network (NIBIN) division.

A canvass was conducted by uniformed District 2 officers on scene. Please see supplemental reports regarding the canvass.

The original scene of the incident 1223 S. 7th Street (Sky Bar) had interior and exterior cameras, which capture video of the incident. The manager stated he did not have the password to the camera system. Detective STEWERT later collected the DVR system from 1223 S. 7th Street, and conveyed the DVR system to the Kenosha Police Department so that the scene video could be extracted from the DVR system.



Re: Report of the Renewal Application of the Class "B" Tavern and Public Entertainment Premises (PEP) Licenses, for Ruben Albanil Coyolt, Agent for El Cielo LLC, for the premises located at 1226 West National Avenue in the City and County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin ("El Cielo Bar").

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Ruben Albanil Coyolt (hereinafter "the Licensee") is the holder of Class "B" Tavern and PEP Licenses, for the premises located at 1226 West National Avenue in the City and County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin ("El Cielo Bar"). Said licenses expired at midnight on August 2, 2024.
2. An application to renew said licenses was filed with the Office of the City Clerk on May 31, 2024.
3. Pursuant to Chapters 68, 85, 90 and 108 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances and Chapter 125 of the Wisconsin Statutes, the matter was referred to the Milwaukee Police Department for investigation. On June 3, 2024, the Milwaukee Police Department responded with a report that could form the basis for nonrenewal of said licenses.
4. On November 1, 2024, the City Clerk's Office provided timely notice to the Licensee pursuant to Chapters 68, 85, 90, and 108 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances and Chapter 125 of the Wisconsin Statutes of the police report. The matter was scheduled for a hearing on the police report and neighborhood objections on November 12, 2024, commencing at approximately 2:10 p.m. in Room 301-B of the third floor of City Hall. At said date, time and place, the Licensee appeared at the hearing with counsel, Attorney Vincent Bobot, and admitted receipt of the notice of hearing.
5. Based upon the sworn testimony heard and the evidence received at the hearing, the Committee finds the following:
 - A. On July 9, 2023 at 2:25 a.m., Milwaukee Police were dispatched to a Subject with Weapon at 1226 West National Avenue. Investigation revealed a physical altercation took place inside the establishment between patrons. The agent was notified and came downstairs and sprayed pepper spray in an attempt to disperse the crowd. The business was cooperative with the investigation and allowed officers to view video surveillance of the incident.



B. On September 24, 2023 at 1:26 a.m., Milwaukee Police were dispatched to a Subject with a Gun at 1226 West National Avenue. Investigation revealed a subject was removed from the tavern due to causing a disturbance. The subject then fired multiple shots into the establishment, causing damage to the exterior. The subject fled the scene and officers. The subject crashed a short time later. Officers recovered spent casings and magazines in the unoccupied vehicle. The business was cooperative with the investigation and allowed officers to view video surveillance of the incident.

C. On December 14, 2023 at 12:40 a.m., Milwaukee Police were dispatched to a fight at 1226 West National Avenue. Officers interviewed the agent who stated he observed two subjects from opposing gangs making threats to shoot one another, however, did not observe any weapons. The Licensee did not want the subjects removed, as they did not want involvement in any potential conflicts. The Licensee requested increased police presence.

D. On April 29, 2024 at 1:36 a.m., Milwaukee Police were dispatched to a Property Damage at 1226 West National Avenue. Officers observed a subject who stated they were in pain due to being pepper sprayed at the location. Officers interviewed the Licensee as well as several witnesses who stated the patron was causing a disturbance in the bar and engaged in a physical altercation, at which time the Licensee pepper sprayed the subject and called for police. The Licensee stated officers could come back to view video surveillance once they retrieved the password.

E. On July 30, 2024 at 8:30 p.m., Milwaukee Police conducted a License Premise Check at 1226 West National Avenue, regarding a complaint of underage bartenders. Assisting in this assignment were Agents from Wisconsin Department of Revenue Alcohol and Tobacco Division. On arrival officers found the business open and one employee inside (33 yo), who initially stated they were the bartender, however, then recanted and stated they were just opening up for the owner who lives upstairs. The DOR Agent found the following violations:

- No Licensed Operator on Premise
- Seller's Permit was not posted
- Beer Purchased from Unlicensed Distributors
- Defaced Labels
- Contaminated Liquor
- Missing Invoices

The Agent confiscated a total of 139 liquor bottles, both open and unopened. The Agent advised the business agent this would be an educational visit and made suggestions to correct the violations.

F. Milwaukee Police were dispatched to 1226 West National Avenue for Noise complaints on the following dates:

- 07/21/23 at 9:45 p.m. Music could be heard on officer's body cam from two properties away. Officers advised the business to close the door and lower the music
- 07/23/23 at 12:51 a.m. No loud music could be heard from the premise



- 09/09/23 at 10:29 p.m. The officer determined the loud music was not coming from the premise
 - 02/10/24 at 9:52 p.m. Caller cancelled the squad because music was turned down
 - 02/13/24 at 12:30 a.m. Body cam showed music could not be heard until the door was open. The employee agreed to lower the music.
- G. On October 18, 2024, at approximately 12:21 p.m., Milwaukee Police Officers executed a search warrant in the tavern and residential units of 1226 West National Avenue. The warrant was requested because officers were investigating a shots fired incident from the residential unit and the Licensee was the suspect. Officers recovered cocaine, drug paraphernalia, a suspected drug sales ledger, and 9mm cartridges. Chickens were also located in the basement of the tavern. The Licensee was arrested; charges have been referred to the District Attorney's Office.
- H. Attorney Bobot said that the police report stated that the business has been cooperative with MPD, that there are cameras outside and inside the tavern and that surveillance videos have been provided when incidences are investigated. He added that the item from July 30, 2024 was an educational visit from the Department of Alcohol and Tobacco where bottles of alcohol were confiscated and they had subsequent violations from there. He also said that the rest of the calls are for loud music except for the incident on October 18, 2024. Attorney Bobot also said that he spoke to his client's defense attorney and that no charges have been filed against his client, that he maintains his innocence and that he is not the one who fired the shots and is not the owner of the recovered cocaine.

Individuals also present:

- I. Alderman Burgelis asked Attorney Bobot if he has something additional to say about the DOR raid that happened on July 30, 2024.
- J. Attorney Bobot said that he does not know if there are any actions taken against his client from the Department of Alcohol and Tobacco because they were told that it was an educational visit but by looking at the violations cited on the police report, now he knows that they exist. He added that the contaminated bottles refers to bottles with fruit flies and that he has no reason to dispute the violations and neither does his client.
- K. Alderwoman Zamarripa asked the Licensee if he had a permit to have the chickens in the basement.
- L. The Licensee said that he did not have a permit and that he buys chickens over the weekend, that he puts them in the basement and that they are gone by Monday.
- M. Attorney Bobot asked the Licensee how many chickens were there because it is not mentioned on the police report.
- N. The Licensee said that there were 2 chickens.
- O. Alderwoman Zamarripa asked what he does with the chickens.



- P. The Licensee said that he buys the chickens to eat them.
- Q. P.O. Tracy – said that during the search warrant done at the Licensee's residence, they found a bowl with cocaine that was easily linked to Mr. Albanil because his vehicle's insurance card was right on the middle of the bowl. He added that the chickens were found in the basement next to where beer and bar stuff is stored. He also said that the chickens were in an enclosed area separated by a small door.
- R. Alderman Spiker asked if MPD contacts the MHD in situations like this.
- S. P.O. Tracy said that they took the chickens to MADACC and that they do referrals to MHD and DNS.
- T. Alderman Spiker asked where exactly the cocaine was found.
- U. P.O. Tracy said that it was in the Licensee's room (same room where the shots were fired from), that it was in a bowl with his car's insurance card right in the middle. He added that in the same area, they also found small measuring spoons which looked to have small cocaine residue on them and next to small portions divided out in units to be sold.
- V. Alderwoman Zamarripa said that regarding Attorney Bobot's statement about his client not being the one who fired the shots into the air; she asked P.O. Tracy if he witnessed and retrieved the video where the Licensee fired shots into the air.
- W. P.O. Tracy said that it is correct, that they recovered 3 spent 9mm casings in front of the address and that on the search warrant they found boxes of the same ammunition at the Licensee's house. He added that the video was from a residence across the street. He also explained that the video is too far away to make out facial descriptions but that the Licensee admitted that he was alone at the residence at the time when the shots were fired. He also said that his description was compared with the footage of the body camera as well and it was determined that it was the Licensee in the video.
- X. Alderman Burgelis asked if they recovered the weapon during the search warrant.
- Y. P.O. Tracy said that they did not.
- Z. Alderman Spiker asked the Licensee if he fired the shots out of the window of his residence.
- AA. The Licensee said that he did not.
- BB. Attorney Bobot said that his defense attorney asked the Licensee not to disclose any information until the investigation is closed.
- CC. Alderman Burgelis asked the Licensee if he owns a 9mm gun.
- DD. The Licensee said that he does not.
- EE. Alderman Burgelis asked the Licensee if he uses cocaine.



- FF. The Licensee said that he uses cocaine sometimes.
- GG. There were no neighbors present to testify. Alderwoman Zamarripa said that this is a very concerning police report, that she understands the message that Attorney Bobot and the Licensee are trying to convey but that they also have the testimony of P.O. Tracy who was on the scene and that she cannot support this application.
- HH. Alderman Perez said that there is a history of disciplinary actions that speak for itself and that it is hard to support this application as this business was part of his district in the past and that the Licensee knows better than to get himself into the trouble he has gotten into.
- II. Attorney Bobot said that he is aware of the 10 day suspension only, that the committee must follow progressive discipline since there was no disciplinary action for the last two years. He thinks that a revocation does not fall in place. He added that the bar is profitable, that the Licensee is probably going to sell it as a result of this but that he cannot guarantee it.
- JJ. Alderman Perez said that this is a small business (capacity of 54) where no money needs to be spent on security to keep the crowd in order, that Attorney Bobot has mentioned that it is profitable. He added that he told the Licensee that he did not want any problem with the police department and with the neighbors and that he has violated both requests including the suspension. He also said that in 2 years, the Licensee has had noise complaints, the outdoor patio has been shut down, that there have been accusations in the past about him doing stuff upstairs including afterhours gatherings. He continued saying that with the recent interaction with the police, it makes it very hard to believe that the Licensee will change his ways with any progressive discipline.
- KK. Attorney Bobot said that we are talking about a 10-day suspension in 2021, that we are in 2024, and that the committee can go to a 90-day suspension since no one was killed/shot.
- LL. Alderman Spiker asked the Licensee if he has a security guard in regards to why people were pepper sprayed at the bar.
- MM. The Licensee said that he has a security guard on Thursday, Friday and Saturday and that he pepper sprayed the guy because he was punched in the face after throwing him out of the bar twice and that the security was not there that day because the incident happened on a Monday.
- NN. Alderman Perez moved nonrenewal based upon the preponderance of the evidence in the police report, aldermanic, police and Licensee testimony that demonstrates the operation results in a threat to health, safety or welfare of the public. There were no objections. (Prevailed 5 0)

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Committee has jurisdiction to hold hearings and provide Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law and a Recommendation to the full Common Council pursuant to Chapters 68, 85, 90, and 108 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances and Chapter 125 of the Wisconsin Statutes.



2. Based upon the above facts found, the Committee concludes that the Licensee, Ruben Albanil Coyolt who holds Class B Tavern and Public Entertainment Premise (PEP) licenses for the premise located at 1226 West National Avenue in the City and County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin ("El Cielo Bar") has not met the criteria of Chapters 68, 85, 90, and 108 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances and Chapter 125 of the Wisconsin Statutes for the renewal of his Class B Tavern and Public Entertainment Premises, licenses. The Committee finds the police report and aldermanic objections as stated above to be true.
3. In order to protect the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Milwaukee, it is the recommendation of the Licenses Committee that the full Common Council of the City of Milwaukee should exercise its judgment for non-renewal of the Class B Tavern and Public Entertainment Premise (PEP) licenses for the premises located at 1226 West National Avenue in the City and County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin ("El Cielo Bar"). The Committee based its recommendation upon the preponderance of the evidence in the police report, aldermanic and police testimony that demonstrates the operation results in a threat to health, safety or welfare of the public.

RECOMMENDATION

Based upon the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law stated above, the Committee, by a vote of **three (3) ayes, one (1) noes and (1) abstained**, recommends that the Class "B" Tavern and Public Entertainment Premises (PEP) Licenses of Ruben Albanil Coyolt for the premises located at 1226 West National Avenue, ("El Cielo Bar") in the City and County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin not be renewed.

Said nonrenewal is effective November 26, 2024.

Scott SUVAKA (squad 2150) were dispatched to a shots fired complaint at the address of 1241 W National Ave. During the course of the investigation officers recovered video footage which showed a Hispanic male who officers suspected to be Ruben ALBANIL-COYOLT (H/M 6/8/1985) stick his head out of the upper window of 1226 W National Ave and extend his arm and fire several shots into the air. This footage was uploaded to Axon Digital evidence system by P.O. TRACY under CAD # P2410140657.

Also, during the course of the investigation officers located 4 spent casings directly in front of the address of 1226 W National which officers knew to be from the upper unit, likely from the tenant and bar owner Ruben ALBANIL-COYOLT. These spent casings were placed on MPD inventory. This report was field under MPD case number C2410140085. I then drafted a search warrant for the entire address bar and residence located at 1226 W National Ave. This search warrant was executed on 10/18/24.

On 10/18/24 at 11:45am I briefed Milwaukee Police Officer Jason STACHOWIAK and Colin ULATOWSKI (squad 2165) who were in an unmarked Milwaukee Police Department Squad car watching the address before the execution of the search warrant that Ruben ALBANIL-COYOLT (H/M 8/6/85) was wanted for firing a handgun from his residence MPD IR C2410140085, and if they see him to stop and arrest him. P.O. STACHOWIAK and ULATOWSKI observed ALBANIL-COYOLT exit the residence where Officers arrested him. ALBANIL-COYOLT was then transported to district two for processing where he requested a lawyer.

AT 12:21 Officers from the Milwaukee Police Department tactical enforcement unit executed the search warrant and cleared the residence and turned it over to investigation officers to search. I along with P.O. Brian HEDER searched the bedroom and located top dresser drawer in the master bedroom a blue bowl which contained a powdery white substance which I suspected to be powder cocaine. I also observed in this bowl a plastic progressive insurance card with the name "Ruben" in the bowl. Also in this drawer was a set of measuring spoons with white powdery residue on it which I suspected to be used to measure out smaller quantities of cocaine for sales and distribution. Also in this drawer were multiple identifying documents belonging to Ruben ALBANIL-COYOLT. Located in a nightstand next to the main dresser were three boxes of Blazer 9mm brass in color Blazer unfired cartridges. I know this caliber to be consistent with the caliber casings located from the shots fired incident directly in front of the address of 1226 W National Ave.

I along with Officer HEDER located a suspected drug ledger on top of the main dresser, also located on top of the main dresser was a small bag of a white powdery substance which I suspected to be cocaine. This evidence and cocaine were transported to District Two for processing by P.O. HEDER and tested with the NARC II 07 field test kit which yielded a positive result for cocaine with a total weight of 7 grams (6.33 bowl and .77 small bag) This amount of cocaine, the presence of tools to measure out smaller amounts for sales, is consistent with an individual distributing cocaine. This report is written by Police Officer Roberto Gamino, assigned to *DISTRICT Two, Late Power Shift (7PM-3AM)*, working as Squad 2472.

On Saturday, March 8th, 2025, at approximately 11:30 PM, I, along with Sergeant Jose Arzaga responded to 1339 S 7th St for a shooting.

Upon *our arrival*, we observed numerous squads in the 1200 block of S 7th St. It should be noted the call for the shooting was at 1223 S 7th St but we were informed the shooting stemmed from an initial incident at the address Sgt. Arzaga and I responded to.

Total squads that responded to the shooting were the following supervisors, squads and detectives. Sergeants Kevin BOLYARD Squad 2214, Adam HALASE Squad 2210 and Sean Mccord Squad 9315. Police Officers Jack CARLONI Squad 2432, Christopher MARTINEZ-VAZQUEZ and Cindy HERNANDEZ Squad 2241, Ryan KRANZ Squad 2230, Shemar Moore Squad 2472, Girgis MINA Squad 2390, Diego KILWEIN JENNERJOHN and Diego ESPINOSA Squad 2320. Detectives Andrew STEWART Squad 9334, William DEL MORAL Squad 9341, Janay PATTERSON Squad 9342 and Albert DAMMONS Squad 9347.

While on scene, I interviewed the security guard on scene who identified himself with a valid WI driver's license as William SANTIAGO NIEVES (W/M, 06/23/1979). Santiago Nieves stated that at approximately 10-10:30 PM, he arrived at work to start his shift at 1339 S 7th St at Sky Pub and Grill LLC. Santiago Nieves stated shortly after being at the business, he noticed 2 men that were sitting at the bar becoming unruly and patronizing other innocent customers. Santiago Nieves stated he was then asked by other employees if he could escort the two gentleman out due to being a nuisance and noticeably intoxicated. Santiago Nieves stated he then escorted the men out with force due to the two men being resistive. Santiago Nieves stated one of the men then began to attack him as he attempted to enter the bar by striking him to the face numerous times, dragged him by his vest and kicked him to the body an unknown number of times. I observed minor swelling to the right side of Santiago Nieves' face along with what appeared road rash near his right eyebrow. I also observed drag marks on Santiago Nieves' left side of his vest and pants.

Officer Hernandez interviewed a witness, who is also the brother of the shooting victim, and identified himself as Juan A SIERRA-ZARATE (W/M, 08/12/1995). Officer Hernandez stated Sierra-Zarate initially stated he was at the bar drinking with his brother. Sierra-Zarate stated while he was there, he was talking with his brother who were also talking to other females. Sierra-Zarate stated he then quickly got up to use the restroom. Sierra-Zarate stated when he was coming back to his seat, that was when he was

approached by security to exit the business due to acting unruly. Sierra-Zarate stated he questioned what was it that he did wrong but would not receive answers. Sierra-Zarate stated he was then escorted out the business and walked northbound on S 7th St. Sierra-Zarate then informed Officer Hernandez he believed he heard shots fired and believed the security guard shot at both he and his brother. Officer Hernandez asked him why he believed it was the security guard that shot at them and if he observed him do it. Sierra-Zarate responded by saying he did not observe him shooting but believed it was him because he kicked him out of the business. Officer Hernandez then stated Sierra-Zarate was reinter viewed by a detective which then Sierra-Zarate stated he had got into an argument/scuffle with another separate group of gentleman. Sierra-Zarate stated he believed they were Nicaraguans but could not specify. Officer Hernandez then stated Sierra-Zarate's story was all over the place and could not understand it furthermore.

Detective Stewart spoke to the licensed premise owner who identified himself as Ruben Albanil Coyolt (W/M, 06/08/1985) . The business was cooperative with the investigation. Det. Stewart was advised by Albanil Coyolt that he did not have access to the cameras as the cameras were newly set-up and he was going to have a tech review the camera's system to gain access and provide footage as soon as possible to cooperate with the investigation.

The business had 1 security officer on scene at the time of the incident which was later upgraded to 3 including the owner of the security company who identified himself as Christopher Orengo Ortiz (W/M, 07/24/2001).

I checked online at City of Milwaukee License Search for the above listed business, and all the licenses were up to date until 7/30/2025.

During my investigation assisting the shooting, I did not observe any violations in the licensed premise.

On Tuesday, July 30, 2024, at approximately 8:30 PM, Squad 2445 (PO Justin Merritt, PO Jesus RODRIGUEZ and I) along with Special Agents Ashley Schnering and Erin Dorn) regarding an investigation with underage bartender at 1226 W National Ave (Exclusive Night Lounge/El Cielo), in the City and County of Milwaukee.

Debrief:

We were informed by Special Agent Schnering there have been multiple complaints received that bartender at the listed location, are alleged under the age of 18, serving alcohol to customers, and inappropriately dancing on bar tops. Special Agent Schnering stated these events are happening during the busier days and we will be assisting them with this investigation.

On Scene:

Upon arrival, we observed the business was open. We entered and did not see anyone at the bar. A female subject was observed sitting down playing on her phone. This female identified herself verbally as Diana P. Lopez-Medina (w/f, 3/17/91). Lopez-Medina originally stated she was the bartender and was opening up for the owner. Lopez-Medina recanted her statement and stated she is just helping the owner open, as the bartenders who were originally set to open the bar did not arrive. Lopez-Medina stated the owner lives upstairs and could be coming down shortly.

Special Agent Schnering explained to Lopez-Medina officers are currently there to double check their license and permits, along with invoices. A short time later, the owner who was identified as Ruben Albanil-Coyolt (w/m, 06/8/85) walked downstairs from his residence and was explained why we were there.

While there, Special Agent found the establishment in violation of the following:

1. Did not have a licensed operator on premises
2. Post Seller's Permit
3. Beer was not purchased by License Distributors
4. Defaced labels

Special Agents confiscated 38 sealed liquor bottles and 101 open liquor bottles.

Special Agent Schnering informed Albanil-Coyolt he would not be facing criminal chargers or would be referred to the District Attorney's office.

This simply will be an educational visit and suggested the following:

1. Must have a License Operator on premise at all times.

Albanil-Coyolt stated he is upstairs and his workers can open the bar without him being there. He was informed by Special Agent Schnering that is not possible and would need to be present at all times if he does not have a proper License Operator on the premise. Albanil-Coyolt became irritated and stated he will just contact his lawyer and get a license for his employees.

1. Post Seller Permit

Albanil-Coyolt stated his permit was posted however upon our arrival, Special Agent asked Lopez-Medina for the seller's permit which was never provided. Once provided, it was observed the seller's permit was expired. Special Agent Schnering explained it would need to get renewed with angered Albanil-Coyolt who stated he was told by the state he did not need it. It was explained to Albanil-Coyolt he could go online and retrieve an updated version.

1. All liquor and beer must be purchased through a License Distributor not retail.

Albanil-Coyolt stated he buys his liquor from a retail shop located on W. Oklahoma Ave. Albanil-Coyolt stated it is not his fault when the retail store knows he is a licensed bar and would sell to him regardless. It was explained to Albanil-Coyolt, he needs to buy through a License Distributor only not a retail service as they did invoices to keep track of all the purchases.

1. Defaced Liquor Labels
2. Dispose of Contaminated Liquor
3. Invoices must be on premises for 2 year sequence.

Albanil-Coyolt informed officers and agents on scene he kept his invoices in his residence or with his accountant. Albanil-Coyolt was informed he cannot do that and needs to keep them in the bar or in a folder inside the bar.

Albanil-Coyolt was displeased with officers and agents and informed us multiple times he would contact his lawyer who can contact Special Agent Schnering.

Albanil-Coyolt signed the following forms:

2. Property Receipt.

This report is written by Police Officer Roberto Gamino, assigned to DISTRICT Two, Late Power Shift (7PM-3AM), working as Squad 2472.

On Saturday, March 8th, 2025, at approximately 11:30 PM, I, along with Sergeant Jose Arzaga responded to 1339 S 7th St for a shooting.

Upon our arrival, we observed numerous squads in the 1200 block of S 7th St. It should be noted the call for the shooting was at 1223 S 7th St but we were informed the shooting stemmed from an initial incident at the address Sgt. Arzaga and I responded to.

Total squads that responded to the shooting were the following supervisors, squads and detectives. Sergeants Kevin BOLDYARD Squad 2214, Adam HALASE Squad 2210 and Sean Mccord Squad 9315. Police Officers Jack CARLONI Squad 2432, Christopher MARTINEZ-VAZQUEZ and Cindy HERNANDEZ Squad 2241, Ryan KRANZ Squad 2230, Shemar Moore Squad 2472, Girgis MINA Squad 2390, Diego KILWEIN JENNERJOHN and Diego ESPINOSA Squad 2320. Detectives Andrew STEWART Squad 9334, William DEL MORAL Squad 9341, Janay PATTERSON Squad 9342 and Albert DAMMONS Squad 9347.

While on scene, I interviewed the security guard on scene who identified himself with a valid WI driver's license as William SANTIAGO NIEVES (W/M, 06/23/1979). Santiago Nieves stated that at approximately 10-10:30 PM, he arrived at work to start his shift at 1339 S 7th St at Sky Pub and Grill LLC. Santiago Nieves stated shortly after being at the business, he noticed 2 men that were sitting at the bar becoming unruly and patronizing other innocent customers. Santiago Nieves stated he was then asked by other employees if he could escort the two gentlemen out due to being a nuisance and noticeably intoxicated. Santiago Nieves stated he then escorted the men out with force due to the two men being resistive. Santiago Nieves stated one of the men then began to attack him as he attempted to enter the bar by striking him to the face numerous times, dragged him by his vest and kicked him to the body an unknown number of times. I observed minor swelling to the right side of Santiago Nieves' face along with what appeared road rash near his right eyebrow. I also observed drag marks on Santiago Nieves' left side of his vest and pants.

Officer Hernandez interviewed a witness, who is also the brother of the shooting victim, and identified himself as Juan A SIERRA-ZARATE (W/M, 08/12/1995). Officer Hernandez stated Sierra-Zarate initially stated he was at the bar drinking with his brother. Sierra-Zarate stated while he was there, he was talking with his brother who were also talking to other females. Sierra-Zarate stated he then quickly got up to use the restroom. Sierra-Zarate stated when he was coming back to his seat, that was when he was approached by security to exit the business due to acting unruly. Sierra-Zarate stated he questioned

what was it that he did wrong but would not receive answers. Sierra-Zarate stated he was then escorted out the business and walked northbound on S 7th St. Sierra-Zarate then informed Officer Hernandez he believed he heard shots fired and believed the security guard shot at both he and his brother. Officer Hernandez asked him why he believed it was the security guard that shot at them and if he observed him do it. Sierra-Zarate responded by saying he did not observe him shooting but believed it was him because he kicked him out of the business. Officer Hernandez then stated Sierra-Zarate was reinter viewed by a detective which then Sierra-Zarate stated he had got into an argument/scuffle with another separate group of gentleman. Sierra-Zarate stated he believed they were Nicaraguans but could not specify. Officer Hernandez then stated Sierra-Zarate's story was all over the place and could not understand it furthermore.

Detective Stewart spoke to the licensed premise owner who identified himself as Ruben Albanil Coyolt (W/M, 06/08/1985) . The business was cooperative with the investigation. Det. Stewart was advised by Albanil Coyolt that he did not have access to the cameras as the cameras were newly set-up and he was going to have a tech review the camera's system to gain access and provide footage as soon as possible to cooperate with the investigation.

The business had 1 security officer on scene at the time of the incident which was later upgraded to 3 including the owner of the security company who identified himself as Christopher Orengo Ortiz (W/M, 07/24/2001).

I checked online at City of Milwaukee License Search for the above listed business, and all the licenses were up to date until 7/30/2025.

During my investigation assisting the shooting, I did not observe any violations in the licensed premise.
