presented by the City Attorney. Is there any
objection? Hearing none, we are now in the Committee
of the Whole.

MR. HALL: Thank you. Good morning,

Alderman Hines, and other Council members. I'm James

Hall. I'm an attorney, and I represent Mr. and Mrs.

McKenzie. That's Ricardo and Leonie McKenzie, the

owners of Leoric Sports Club Bar & Grill located at

2035 West Fond du Lac. I would point out that Mr. and

Mrs. McKenzie are present. They're seated right

there.

Thank you for the opportunity to address you this morning. I will be brief. May I ask, do the Council members have the report? Do you have in your packets the report? So I won't belabor this by repeating what's in the report.

Let me just summarize briefly, Mr. and Mrs. McKenzie have owned the property there at 2035 West

Fond du Lac for approximately seven years. They had a tavern there for approximately three years. They have invested more than \$200,000 in the renovation and upgrading of the property. They maintain a quality business.

The neighbors -- It's mostly a commercial neighborhood. There are very few tenants or residents who live there. The neighborhood is very supportive of them. That neighborhood includes Columbia Savings and Loan and Legacy Bank. That corridor there was a little, if I may use the word, dilapidated or not as well built up as it might be. They have come in there and put \$200,000 in the building. They have also bought two buildings adjacent to that building where they plan to establish a restaurant and a recording studio, so they're committed to the neighborhood.

Now, there are a number of incidents cited in the report as the basis for a 15-day suspension. It would just point out that of those incidents, there's one incident that -- that's the March 27th, '04 altercation, which was an incident where a patron in the club got into an altercation with some other patrons there.

They had security, contracted security on-site, which immediately stepped in, broke up the

fight, the owners called the police, City of Milwaukee police, got the police there, and the matter was handled. My suggestion is that they acted responsibly, they were accountable.

Since that time they have obtained an additional security firm, so they now have eight security officers, approximately, on the premises at all times inside and outside. In other words, they have taken measures to make sure that type of occurrence does not happen again.

The only other incident of the incidents in the report where there has been a finding of an incident, was an incident where they entered a plea of no contest of having -- At closing time they stack the chairs and tables and close the door and were not letting additional people in. There was a knock at the door, and it was the City of Milwaukee police, so they were cited for not -- They didn't open the door. They thought it was a patron, as patrons often do knock on the door after closing time, but it was the police.

They were cited for not having, you know, immediate access to the police, and they understand that, and they won't allow that to happen again. But of all the matters in the reports there are other

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incidents that are pending in Municipal Court that they have filed -- those are contested matters, and they will go before the court, but the only matters that you have before you that have actually been incidents, you know, that there's a finding on are the two that I referred to. The first one was the altercation, which is not something that they want to have in their place of business.

So their request is that -- They appreciate the fact that the license application is being recommended for renewal with a change of entertainment that allows them to do poetry and readings and so forth. That's appreciated. But the 15-day suspension, we submit, we think is not warranted under the circumstances, and we would ask the Common Council's consideration in not imposing a 15-day suspension upon them under all the circumstances.

They have indicated certainly their hope and expectation and the willingness to work with Alderman Hines as well as the City of Milwaukee police. Thank you.

PRESIDENT HINES: Thank you, Counsel.

Please remain. Are there any questions the Council has of the representative? The chair recognizes

Alderman McGee.

1 ALDERMAN McGEE: Good morning, Attorney The question is in regards to how many times 2 3 in the past have the police requested to enter the 4 premises, and have they been denied any other time. MR. HALL: That's the only time that the 5 police did not gain immediate access to the premises, 6 and that's in a situation where -- The police have 7 8 come there quite often, you know, for various reasons, some of which we question, of course, but they have 9 10 always been granted immediate access. 11 I might also point out that police officers 12 not on duty come to the place as patrons, so it's not a bad place at all, but the police officers -- that's 13 14 the only time immediate access was not granted. 15 PRESIDENT HINES: The chair recognizes Alderman McGee. 16 ALDERMAN McGEE: How many years has it been 17 in existence? 18 19 MR. HALL: Three years as a lounge-type 20 cabaret; is that right? 21 MR. McKENZIE: Three years. 22 MR. HALL: Three years. 23 ALDERMAN McGEE: Thank you. 24 PRESIDENT HINES: The Chair recognizes Alderman Puente. 25

ALDERMAN PUENTE: Thank you, Mr. President. 1 The question is were the officers in uniform that 2 evening? 3 MR. HALL: The officers were in uniform. ALDERMAN PUENTE: And is there a window on 5 the door so you could see out? 6 MR. HALL: Is there a little --7 MR. McKENZIE: It has blinds. The blinds 8 were closed. 9 MR. HALL: I am told that there were blinds 10 that were closed, so they did not look out immediately 11 and see that the officers were there. 12 ALDERMAN PUENTE: Regarding the incident, 13 they were cited for three different things, two of 14 them were dismissed, and a no contest plea on the 15 third. Can you answer me yes or no, was there a plea 16 agreement regarding this? 17 MR. HALL: Well, there was a discussion --18 Well, yes, there was a discussion with the City 19 Attorney dismissing the other two. 20 ALDERMAN PUENTE: Okay. 21 PRESIDENT HINES: Thank you. Seeing no 22 additional questions, thank you, Attorney Hall. We 23 will now hear from the City Attorney. 24 MR. SCHRIMPF: Thank you, Mr. President and 25

I'm Bruce Schrimpf, an Assistant City members. Attorney.

Mr. Hall is correct, the committee specifically reserved judgment on the remaining Items C. D and E because they had not yet been adjudicated, and considered for purposes of this recommendation only Items A and B, the apparent altercation that occurred on March 27th, 2004, and the matter of the patrons after hours and not immediate entry to police.

Where there is discussion with the City Attorney and a plea agreement is reached, the typical approach is to consider all of the citations even though some may have been dismissed, and the fact of the matter is, is that they were dismissed because of an agreement, and there was a guilty plea to at least one, and the committee made this recommendation of renewal with a 15-day suspension.

Of course, whether or not you impose a suspension for any particular length, or whether or not you impose this suspension, is at your sound discretion. If you have any questions, I'll be happy to answer them.

PRESIDENT HINES: Thank you, Attorney Schrimpf. Alderman Witkowiak moves that the Committee now rise. Is there any further discussion on this

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particular license? The chair recognizes Alderman
McGee.

ALDERMAN McGEE: Yes. I was wondering, for a point of information for those who missed the committee meeting, I have a question for the committee members as to -- I was there in attendance at that committee meeting, and I wanted to know, is it true that the alderman from that district had recommended a 10-day suspension, and then the committee decided to recommend 15 days?

PRESIDENT HINES: Alderman Witkowiak or Alderman Bohl, do you care to respond to that?

ALDERMAN WITKOWIAK: Mr. President, I think it was a sound decision by the committee. Do you recall if there was a -- Alderman Bohl, do you recall if there was a recommendation made by -- or a request made by someone for a shorter suspension? I believe not. To the best of my knowledge there was not.

PRESIDENT HINES: Chair recognizes Alderman Puente.

ALDERMAN PUENTE: Yes, there was. Their legislative assistant did come before us and recommend 10 days on their behalf, but after listening to the testimony and the totality of the incidents and that, it was moved for a 15-day suspension.

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PRESIDENT HINES: And it was approved?

ALDERMAN PUENTE: That is correct, sir.

PRESIDENT HINES: Does that answer your

ALDERMAN WITKOWIAK: Mr. Chairman, the matter of Mohammad El-hassan, agent for Class "A" Malt renewal for Quick Stop Foods, we conducted a short Utility and Licenses Committee meeting prior to this meeting, and there was a motion to reconsider, and that motion was approved to send this matter back to committee. I believe it was read earlier to deny this license.

Witkowiak. It will be referred back to committee.
