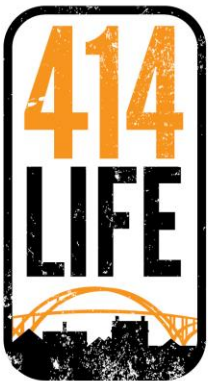

ACTIVITIES

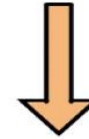
- Outreach with 414 LIFE participants
- Conflict mediation and violence interruption
- Hospital Response
- Education and Mentoring

PROGRAM OUTCOMES

- Increase 414 LIFE participants access to **education & training**
- Increase 414 LIFE participants access to **employment**
- Increase 414 LIFE participants connection to **pro-social relationships**
- 414 LIFE Participants & other youth learn nonviolent **conflict-resolution skills**
- 414 LIFE Participants & other youth embrace non-violent **goals and values**
- 414 LIFE participants avoid situations that increase risk of violent exposure
- 414 LIFE participants and youth apply non-violent responses to conflict

COMMUNITY NORM CHANGE

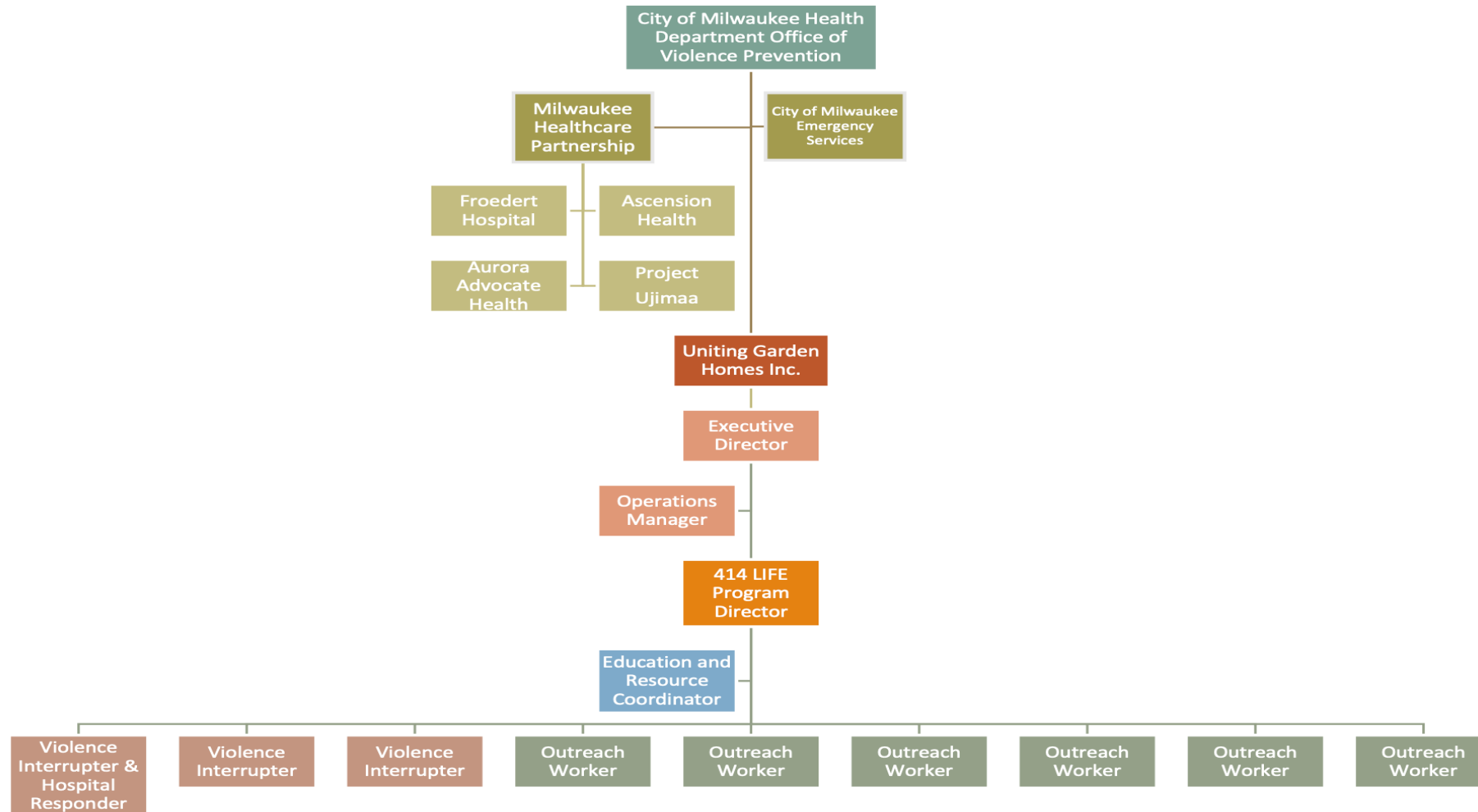
- Community Outreach
- Public Education Campaigns
- Post Shooting Response

- Partnerships with Emergency Services and Public Officials

- Community residents and public officials exposed to pro-peace **messages**
- Community is motivated to reduce acts of violence
- Community residents gain **self-efficacy** to reduce violence
- Community is actively involved in violence prevention efforts

Activity	Definition	Status
Violence Interruption/Mediation	Credible conflicts with high risk for violence or retaliation	84
Case Management	High risk individuals receiving case management services from 414 LIFE	44
Hospital Response	Violence Interrupter/Hospital Responder provides support to family and gun violence survivor(s) in healthcare facility	189

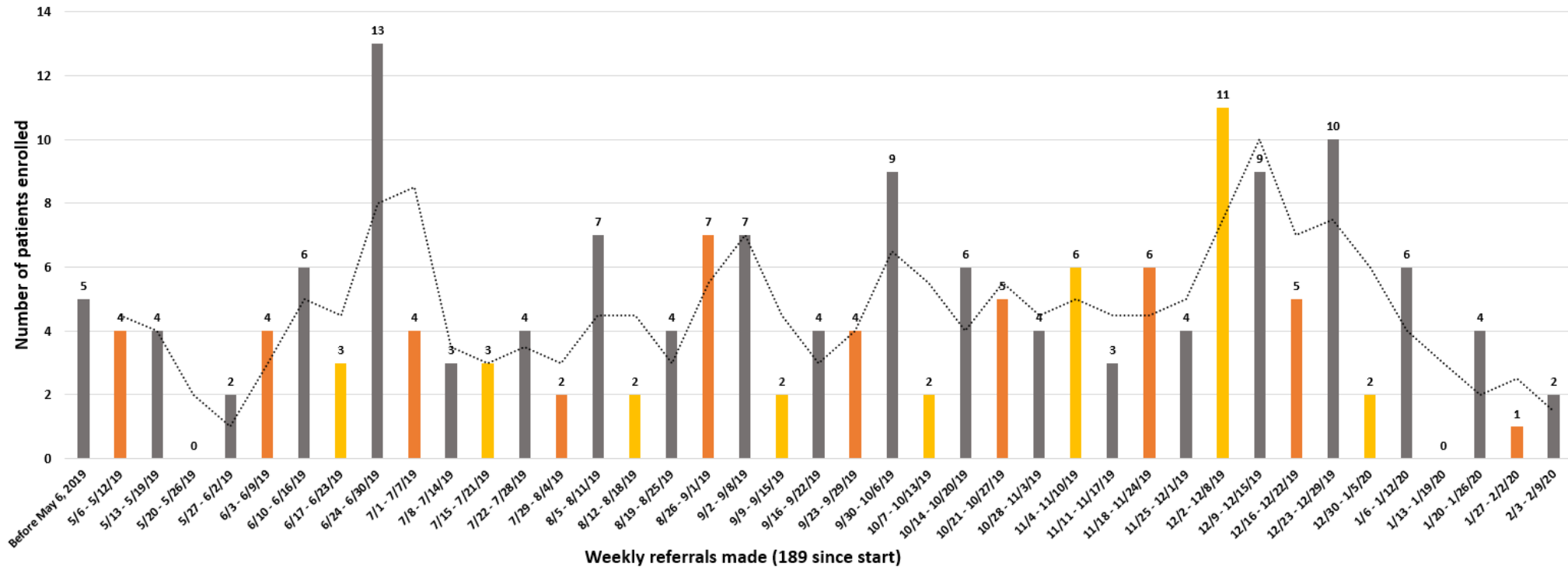
HOSPITAL REFERRALS

- ❖ **189** PATIENTS REFERRED TO 414 LIFE BY FROEDTERT HOSPITAL (MAY 2019-JANUARY 30, 2020)
- ❖ **83%** MALE
- ❖ **84%** AFRICAN AMERICAN
- ❖ **53%** VICTIMS ARE AGES 21-30
- ❖ **98%** MILWAUKEE RESIDENTS
- ❖ **80%** OF REFERRALS RESPONDED TO WITHIN 60 MINUTES OR LESS BY 414 LIFE

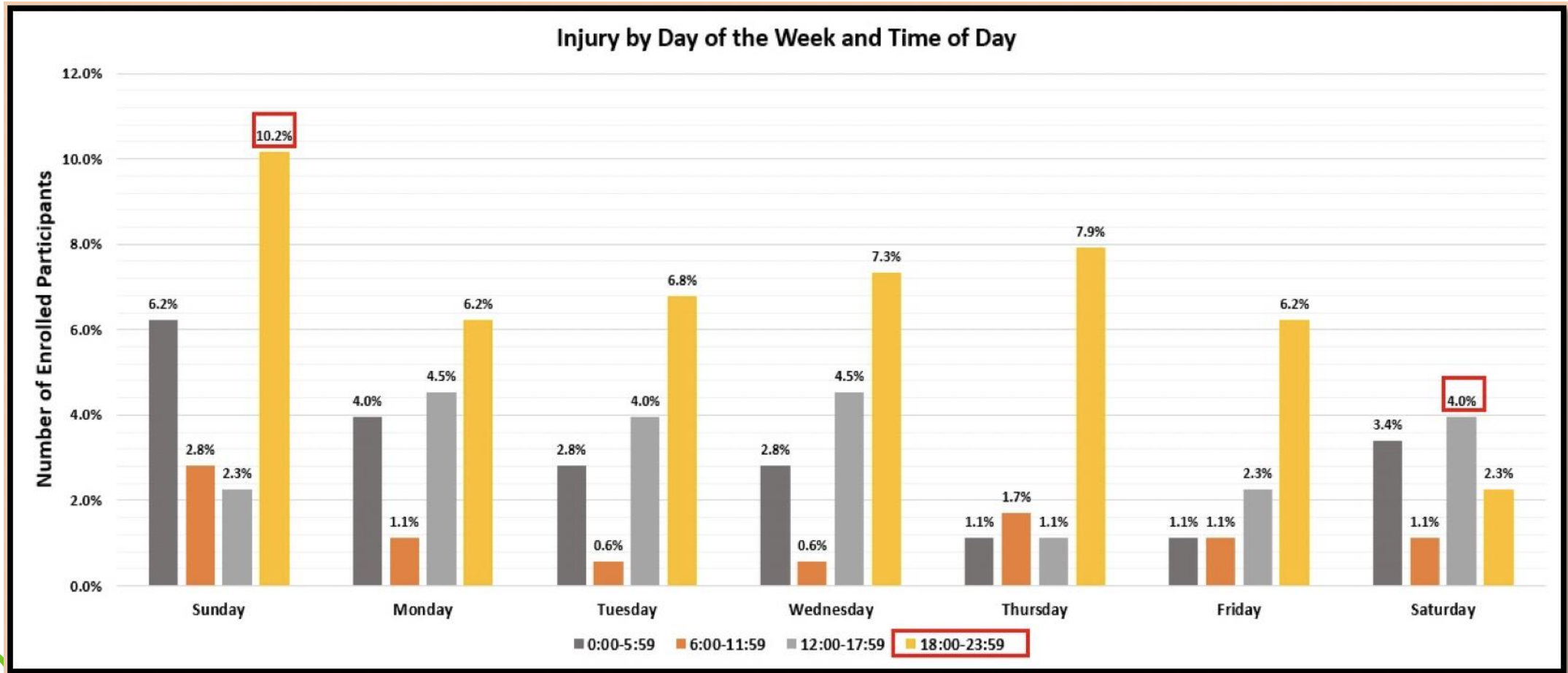


HOSPITAL RESPONSE

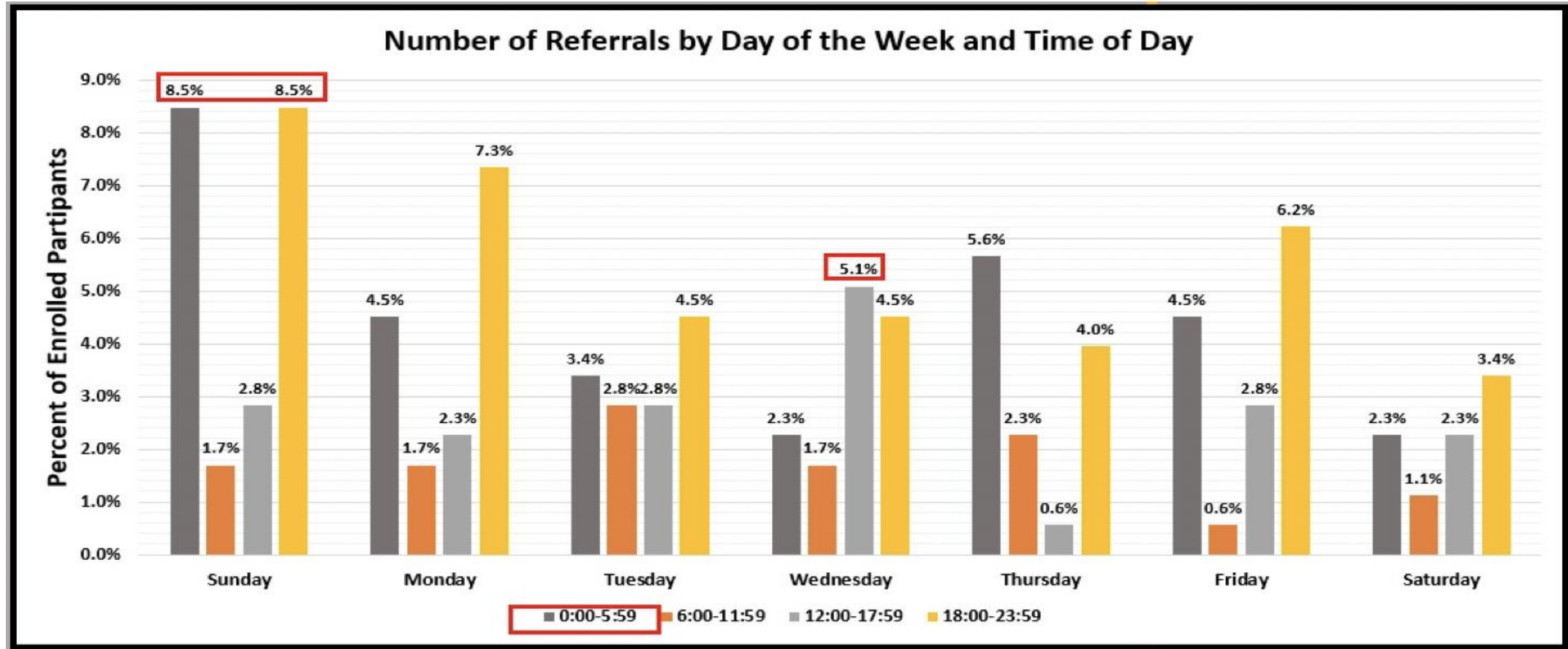
of Patients Enrolled in 414LIFE by Week Since Initiation with Moving Average

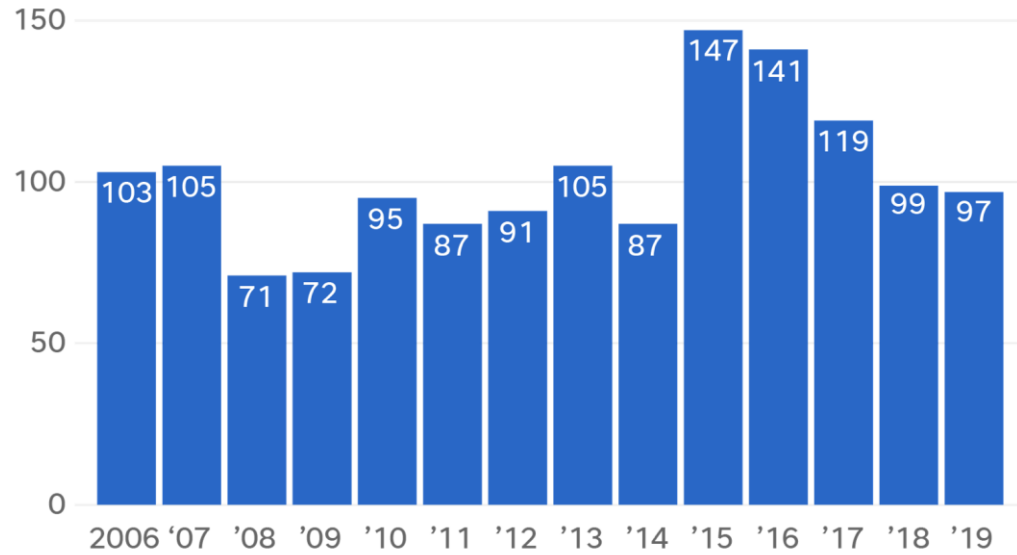

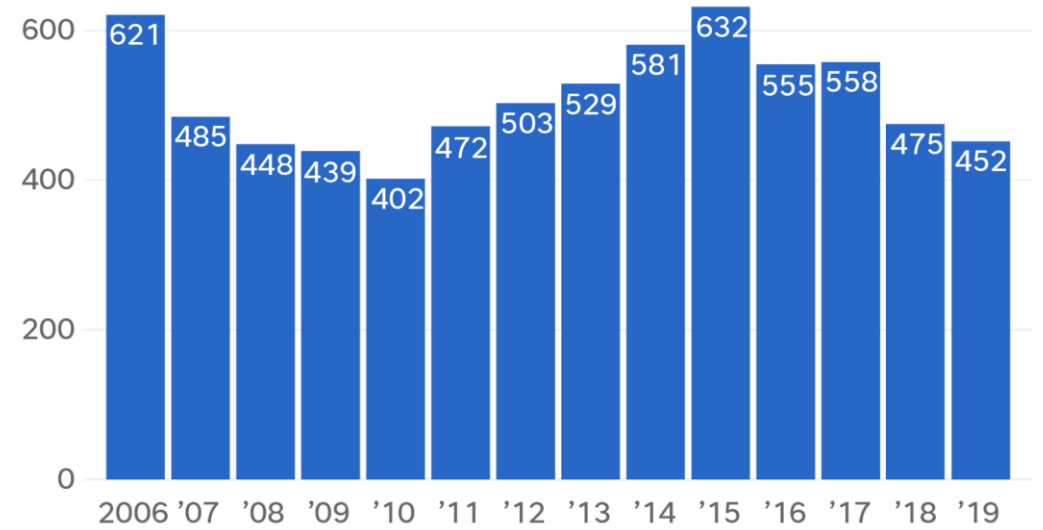

PRIORITIES FOR 2020

- ❖ LAUNCH AND PROMOTE CITY-WIDE 414 LIFE HOTLINE
- ❖ EXPAND HOSPITAL PARTNERSHIPS TO INCLUDE ADVOCATE-AURORA
- ❖ STRENGTHEN COORDINATION WITH PROJECT UJIMA AND THE MILWAUKEE HEALTHCARE PARTNERSHIP
- ❖ INCREASE PRIVATE FINANCIAL SUPPORT FOR PROGRAM EXPANSION
- ❖ INCREASE COMMUNITY CRISIS RESPONSE COORDINATION BETWEEN COMMUNITY PARTNERS, TRAUMA RESPONSE, FIRST RESPONDERS, AND THE CITY OF MILWAUKEE HEALTH DEPARTMENT'S OFFICE OF VIOLENCE PREVENTION
