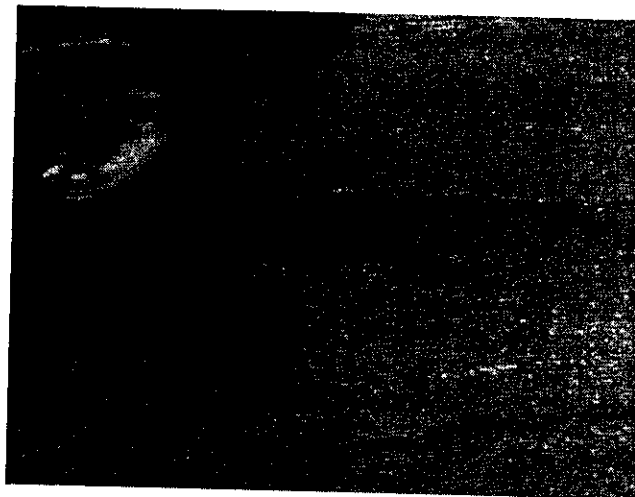

In Milwaukee, seasonal crews that usually aren't dispatched until spring have been out making repairs.

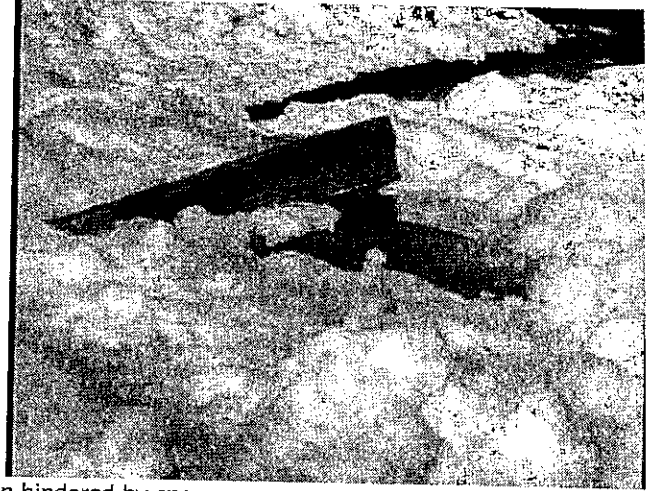
Today, the common council's Public Works Committee will meet to talk about how the repairs are coming and what else can be

## Rats in the snow?

MILWAUKEE-We've heard the complaints about unshoveled sidewalks, delayed garbage pick up and potholes.

But the Southside Organizing Committee says it's now getting reports of rats in yards.

The calls started coming in after last week's massive melt off of snow.

But before they could get any clean up underway, Friday's storm dumped on the city once again.

Cleaning garbage and debris cleared out is essential. They're hosting a "Winter Clean Up" meeting Tuesday, March 25th at 6:30 p.m. at the Prince of Peace Church Hall at 25th and Scott Streets.
