

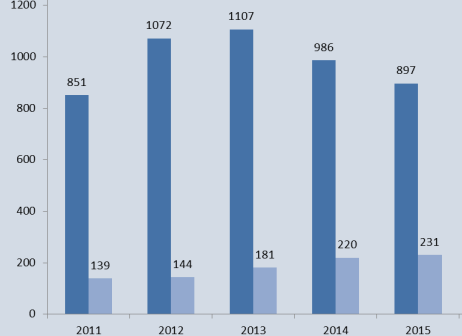

Overdose Deaths by Year Compared to EMS Naloxone Administration



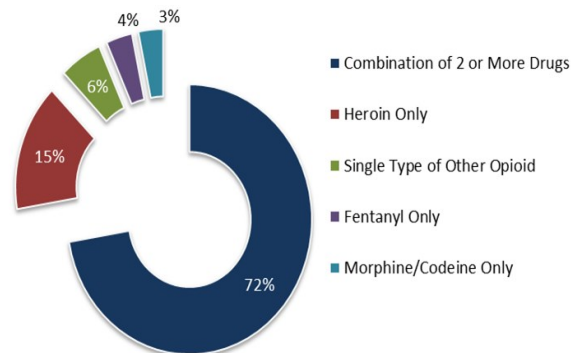
Community Resource Inventory
