AMENDMENT INTENT

This amendment reduces the capital borrowing authority for the City Attorney's Office-Planning/Design/Construction Project from \$2,287,500 to \$1,166,625 and eliminates funding (but retains position authority) for 21 half-time equivalent Police Services Specialist Investigator positions in the Police Department.

BACKGROUND & DISCUSSION

City Attorney's Office

During the exterior restoration of City Hall, the City Attorney's Office vacated Floor 8 so that extensive repairs could be made to the roof and dormers of City Hall. Costs to renovate Floor 8 of City Hall prior to the return of the City Attorney's Office are currently projected to total \$4.6 million. This anticipated project cost is roughly \$1 million less than an earlier estimate due to cost savings resulting from the economic downturn and the re-use of construction materials.

The 2010 Executive Budget provides \$2,287,500 million in capital borrowing authority for this project, with remaining funding earmarked for 2011. Approximately \$1.2 million in project costs can be attributed to necessary demolition, plumbing, heating, ventilation and air conditioning, and fire suppression work.

Amendment #5, passed at committee, eliminates the full \$2,287,500 in capital funding provided for the City Attorney's Office-Planning/Design/Construction Project. Amendment #5a reduces funding for this endeavor from \$2,287,500 in the Proposed Budget to \$1,166,625.

> Police Department

The position of Police Services Specialist Investigator ("PSSI"), like Police Services Specialists ("PSS") and Police Aides, was specifically created to free up sworn officers from station house and administrative responsibilities, thereby making them available for "street" duty. A PSSI candidate must be a former law enforcement officer who resigned or retired in good standing, and who also has previous special investigation or supervisory experience. A PSSI may perform background investigations on prospective police officers and civilian job applicants, assist with residency investigations, civil litigation investigations, rules violations, and record requests, as well as work on data gathering, crime trend analysis and follow-up investigations.

The 2008 Budget provided position authority and funding for 13 half-time PSSI positions, while the 2009 Budget, via elimination of Police Services Assistant positions, added authority and funding for 17 full-time PSSI posts. The 2010 Executive Budget continues funding for these 17 full-time and 13 half-time positions — which can also be interpreted as 47 half-time equivalent positions. Since January 1, 2009, Police Department vacancy reports indicate that a minimum of 20 of these 47 positions have remained vacant. Per the Police Department, a focus on selections for the mid-2010 Police Officer Recruit Class caused a delay in hiring for the PSSI positions.

Currently, there are 21 half-time equivalent PSSI vacancies. The Police Department indicates that "Offer Letters" have been extended for all of these vacancies, with employment predicated on individual approvals at the scheduled November 5, 2009 Fire & Police Commission Hearing. The forthcoming hiring of the current PSSI candidates has been deemed essential to returning additional sworn officers to the street. It should be noted that 6 members of the MPD recently retired with the specific intent of accepting a PSSI position.

Amendment #5a eliminates funding, but retains position authority, for 21 half-time equivalent Police Services Specialist Investigator positions in the Police Department.

FISCAL IMPACT

Passage of this amendment will decrease the 2010 Budget by \$1,453,958 and reduce the 2010 tax levy by \$333,083, for a tax rate impact of -\$0.012 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation.

The intent of this amendment is to increase funding for the Special Revenue Fund – Economic Development Fund by \$533,968.

- 1. Amendment 79, which the Finance and Personnel Committee recommended for approval on a 5-0 vote, increases funding for the Economic Development Fund to reflect the latest BID assessment figures from the individual BID 2010 operating plans, which were just approved by the Common Council. Funding is also increased to reflect the recent creation of 2 new BIDs that will be operational for 2010, as well as 2 other BIDs that may be created by 2010. Finally, funding is increased to provide \$100,000 for new neighborhood improvement districts ("NIDs") that may potentially be created in 2010.
- 2. Amendment 79 indicates a budgetary and tax-levy impact of \$507,438. The correct amount as shown on this Amendment 79a -- should be \$533,968, for a tax-rate impact of +\$0.019 per \$1,000 assessed valuation.
- 3. Since the Economic Development Fund functions as a mechanism to pass BID assessment revenues collected by the City through to the individual BIDs, changes in the funding level for the Fund typically have no impact on the tax levy or rate. Therefore, neither Amendment 79 nor Amendment 79a is likely to have a budgetary impact. However, the additional revenues contemplated by this amendment require recognition by the Comptroller.
