Capital Improvements

Capital Improvements - \$2.4 million

- MacArthur Square Renovation: \$610,000
 - ADA Ramp \$510,000
 - Kilbourn Tunnel DOT inspection and subsequent repairs \$100,000
- Miscellaneous Structure Repairs: \$100,000
 - Ongoing Structural repairs and emergencies
- Surface and Tow Lot Paving: \$275,000
 - General paving repairs
- 1000 N. Water Parking Structure Repairs: \$425,000
 - Elevator Upgrades
- ADA Compliance: \$50,000
- Green Lots: \$700,000
 - Reconstructed islands with trees and stormwater retention
- Single-Space Parking Meters: \$50,000
 - Continued Smart Meter conversions

Capital – Green Lots

- Green Lots: Two-year capital planning
 - Funding partnership with MMSD
 - Community partnership with 16th Street Community Center, DPW Environmental Services & others
 - Reconstructed with green infrastructure islands and trees to provide storm water retention and shade
- Locations
 - 1657 S 13th St
 - 1002 W Maple St
 - 716 W Maple St
 - 1223 S 15th Place

Transportation

- 10th and Mitchell Redevelopment
 - Best Design/Implementation of a Surface Lot







2023 Transportation Initiatives

- Parking Meter Conversion to Smart Meters
 - Completed City-wide by end of 2022
 - Spring 2022 began variable/market rate pricing around Fiserv – Event Based
- CMAQ grant for full conversion to EV for parking enforcement vehicles
- Citation by mail night parking regulations
 - Ongoing LPR investment





2023 Parking Initiatives

- Expansion of metered time restrictions
 - Expand to 9 PM and on Saturday
- Increase meter citation fee from \$22 \$25
- Enhance night parking permit options
- Consider amending ordinance to require payment of all outstanding debt in order to retrieve a vehicle from our City Tow Lot
