There is a possibility that your application may be denied for one or more of the following reasons: The recommendation of the committee regarding the application shall be based on evidence presented at the hearing. Per MCO 85-4-4, unless otherwise specified in the code, probative evidence concerning non-renewal, suspension or revocation may include evidence of the following: failure of the applicant to meet municipal qualifications, pending charges against or the conviction of any felony, misdemeanor, municipal offense or other offense, the circumstances of which substantially relate to the circumstances of the particular licensed or permitted activity, by the applicant or by any employee or other agent of the applicant. If the activities of the applicant involve a licensed premises, whether the premises tends to facilitate a public or private nuisance or has been the source of congregations of persons which have resulted in any of the following: disturbance of the peace; illegal drug activity; public drunkenness; drinking in public; harassment of passers-by; gambling; prostitution; sale of stolen goods; public urination; theft; assaults; battery; acts of vandalism including graffiti, excessive littering, loitering, illegal parking, loud noise at times when the licensed premise is open for business; traffic violations; curfew violations; lewd conduct; display of materials harmful to minors, pursuant to s. 106-9.6; or any other factor which reasonably relates to the public health, safety and welfare, or failure to comply with the approved plan of operation. It is the intention of the Common Council to suspend or non-renew the licenses if objectors provide testimony related to the factors enumerated in MCO 85-4-4 that the Common Council finds to be true by a preponderance of the evidence and/or police reports and other attached documents relating to objections to the license are a part of this notice and expressly incorporated in this notice. The licensee should be prepared to address these matters at the hearin

Notice for applicants with warrants or unpaid fines:

Proof of warrant satisfaction or payment of fines must be submitted at the hearing on the above date and time. Failure to comply with this requirement may result in a delay of the granting/denial of your application.

Failure to appear at this meeting may result in the denial of your license. Individual applicants must appear only in person or by an attorney. Corporate or Limited Liability applicants must appear only by the agent designated on the application or by an attorney. Partnership applicants must appear by a partner listed on the application or by an attorney. If you wish to do so and at your own expense, you may be accompanied by an attorney of your choosing to represent you at this hearing. You will be given an opportunity to speak on behalf of the application and to respond and challenge any charges or reasons given for the denial. No petitions can be accepted by the committee, unless the people who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify. You may present witnesses under oath and you may also confront and cross-examine opposing witnesses under oath. If you have difficulty with the English language, you should bring an interpreter with you, at your expense, so that you can answer questions and participate in your hearing.

You may examine the application file at this office during regular business hours prior to the hearing date. Inquiries regarding this matter may be directed to the person whose signature appears below.

I hope this message finds you well. I am writing as the owner of the building and business located to express my opposition to the proposed age change for Allure Nightclub at 789 N Jackson Street—from 25 and older to 21 and older.

Last summer, we experienced several issues related to Allure's patrons, including loitering, littering, and individuals sitting on our private steps and at our outdoor dining tables. While the situation did improve as the summer went on, I believe that progress came as a result of direct conversations we had with the owner. That said, it's important to note that Allure originally agreed to the 25-and-older policy in order to have their liquor license approved when they first opened in 2021. I feel strongly that this agreement should be honored moving forward.

The stated reason for the proposed change—as reported in the *Milwaukee Journal Sentinel*—is to broaden their customer base in order to stay afloat. While I understand the challenges of operating a business, I am concerned that lowering the age limit will result in a return of the issues we previously faced, and could potentially introduce new problems associated with a younger crowd.

I want to be clear that I am not opposed to Allure's license being renewed under the current terms. However, I do not support any change to lower the age limit to 21. Additionally, I feel that it would have been more respectful and responsible for Allure to communicate this proposed change with neighboring residents and businesses, rather than us finding out through a news article. Open communication would have been a far better approach.

Thank you for your time and for your continued commitment to supporting the 4th Aldermanic District.

I hope this message finds you well. I'm writing to express my concerns about the decision to lower the drinking age at Allure to 21. This decision, especially considering its potential impact on our community on Jefferson Street, worries me.

As a business owner on Jefferson Street for 30 years, I understand the importance of maintaining safety and respect in our establishments. However, I fear that lowering the drinking age might attract a crowd that doesn't align with the mature and responsible atmosphere we've cultivated over the years. This could unintentionally encourage behavior that contradicts our values, especially when promoters and operators prioritize profit over the well-being of our community.

Furthermore, the absence of the establishment's owners during events could exacerbate these issues. Without their oversight, we risk creating an environment that leads to increased disturbances, safety concerns, and conflicts within our community.

I kindly request you to reconsider the impact of the 21 and over age restriction at Allure. I believe it's crucial to approach this issue with a balanced perspective that prioritizes both the safety of our customers and the integrity of our open and welcoming community.

Thank you for your attention to this matter. I look forward to discussing this further and hope for a solution that benefits all parties involved.

3. On 12/15/23 at 11:49p.m., Milwaukee Police were dispatched to a Fight at 795 N. Jefferson. On arrival officers were flagged down by security from Taylors, pointing to a subject they stated was involved in the fight. Officers interviewed the agent of Allure, who stated an altercation took place inside the bar and security followed proper protocol, escorting the individuals outside. Once outside, the subjects continued to fight outside and a security guard from a neighboring bar became involved. The security guard was struck several times by a subject before eventually restraining them until police arrived.

Jefferson Street. No violations were found.

4. On 01/05/24 Milwaukee Police held a meeting with the agent regarding recent incidents at two of their establishments (789 N Jefferson and 1111 N Old World Third). The concerns that were addressed were related to security at both establishments, surveillance cameras, age restrictions, use of the parking lot by patrons after closing, and the way they cooperate with police during investigations and preventative measures that could be taken.

The agent was advised a good working relationship with police was key to providing a safe environment. Officers called attention to an incident in which a security guard can be heard on an officer's body camera stating something along the lines of "not to tell police that they know anything". The agent agreed a strong relationship with police is beneficial and stated they would talk to security about the statement.

5. On 04/19/24 at 6:19p.m., Milwaukee Police conducted a License Premise Check at 789 N. Jefferson. Assisting was an Agent from Wisconsin Department of Revenue Alcohol and Tobacco. The officers found some contaminants in a few bottles of liquor that were disposed of and the lone bartender, did not have a Class D Operator License. The agent stated they had an employee call in and the bartender was filling in. The business was cooperative.

This report is written by Police Officer Parker POPP, assigned to District One, Early Power shift.

On Friday, April 19th, 2024, at approximately 6:19 p.m., while on Squad 1163 (P.O. PLUMLEY, P.O. MUSTAFA, and I) were conducting Tavern checks with the Department of Revenue (Special Agent Schuering and Special Agent Schleis). We went to the address of 789 N Jefferson St (Allure MKE), which is in the City and County of Milwaukee.

I spoke to licensed premise owner Tino K. BATES (b/m, 02/14/1972). BATES was informed that the Department of Revenue was conducting a check on his business. The D&R requested BATES' invoices for the liquor. Agents along with the assistance of officers checked the business liquor and if there were any contaminants in them. The bottles that were discovered by officers to have contaminants were disposed of on scene.

The business was cooperative with Law Enforcement. The business had 0 security officers on scene.

While on scene, I observed the licenses posted and they were up to date. During my time inside the business. I did not observe any violations in the licensed premise, however the lone bartender Cordell W. ANDERSEN (b/m, 07/24/97) was not licensed to be serving drinks. ANDERSEN and BATES both stated to officers that one of their employees who is licensed called in last minute. It should also be noted that ANDERSEN is on probation and was advised to contact his probation agent regarding the Law Enforcement contact.

Scheuring attended a meeting with the staff from Truth Lounge (1111 N. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr Dr) and Allure (789 N Jefferson St) at the Police Administration Building. This meeting was scheduled to discuss recent events that have occurred at both establishments. The agent of both establishments (BATES, Tino K. B/M 2/14/1972) informed us that he has multiple security measures already in place at both establishments. The recent events have to do with the way security cooperates with police during investigations and security protocol that could have prevented some of the concerns.

BATES informed us that he has security conduct ID checks at the front door, and when security is not working the bartenders check IDs at the bar to verify age. BATES informed us that his security performs pat downs, wanding, and purse checks of patrons entering the establishments. Sgt Scheuring asked Bates if his security was armed and Bates replied that some of them are armed. Bates also informed us that he hires his security and does not go through a private company. Sgt Scheuring brought up the concern that when officers approach the establishments, it is hard to tell who security is because they do not have uniforms or anything that says security on it. Bates informed Sgt Scheuring that his security often wears a shirt that says Truth on it. We expressed concern that if there were an emergency situation, officers and patrons would be looking for someone with a security shirt or hat to help with the situation. Bates agreed to consider a change for the uniform that his security guards wear.

There was also a concern regarding an age restriction that was put into place at both establishments. At Truth Lounge Bates enforces an age restriction of 25 and up for large groups entering the establishment. Bates feels that it would be more likely to gain compliance from a 25 year old, if a fight should break out, and less likely to get a 21 year old to comply. Bates stated at Allure, he asks staff to enforce an age restriction of 25-30 depending on the group size. Bates felt that this policy was working and was not concerned about arguments occurring in line over different age restrictions for different groups entering the tavern.

There was also a concern with recent surveillance video being turned over to police. During an investigation, Police went to Truth Lounge and attempted to review surveillance video. Police were informed by staff at Truth Lounge that the camera system was down, and they did not have video of the incident. During the meeting, Bates clarified that there has been an ongoing issue with the surveillance system in Truth Lounge, freezing or not recording for long periods of time. Bates informed us that he has put in multiple service requests with the surveillance camera company and is working on getting it resolved. Bates has had the system moved to a different spot in the basement, in hopes that less moisture and dust will get into the actual recording device.

During the meeting Bates brought up concern about loitering in a parking lot behind his establishment. Bates informed us that he does not own the parking lot but his customers sometimes utilize the spots in it. After bar close Bates stated patrons hang out in the lot, listen to loud music, and refuse to leave. Bates was looking for ideas to stop some of the loitering that was going on after bar close. Sgt. Scheuring informed Bates he would work with him during Code Red hours and try to have officers patrol the lot. Bates also filled out a standing complainant form to keep on file for District One Officers.

We expressed to Bates that having a good working relationship with the police department was the key to having a safe environment in the nighttime entertainment area. Sgt Scheuring shared with Bates that during a shots fired investigation, one of his Security Guards can be heard on body camera saying

something along the lines of not to tell police that they know anything. Bates was shocked by this and assured that he will talk to his security about this statement. Bates agreed that having a strong working relationship with the police department and code red officers is beneficial.

This concluded our meeting.

The hearing before the Licenses Committee will take place on 4/8/2025 at 10:25 AM in Room 301-B, Third Floor, City Hall. This is a public hearing. Those wishing to view the proceeding are able to do so via the City Channel – Channel 25 on Spectrum Cable – or on the Internet at http://city.milwaukee.gov/citychannel. Those wishing to provide oral testimony via internet are asked to contact the staff assistant, Yadira Melendez at (414) 286-2775 or stasst5@milwaukee.gov for necessary information. Please make such requests no later than one business day prior to the start of the meeting. You are not required to attend the hearing, but please see the information below if you would like to provide testimony. Once the Licenses Committee makes its recommendation, this recommendation is forwarded to the full Common Council for approval at its next regularly scheduled hearing.

Important details for those wishing to provide information for the Licenses Committee to consider when making its recommendation:

- 1. The license application is scheduled to be heard at the above time. Due to other hearings running longer than scheduled, you may have to wait some time to provide your testimony.
- You must appear in person and testify as to matters that you have personally experienced or seen. (You cannot provide testimony for your neighbor, parent or anyone else; this is considered hearsay and cannot be considered by the committee.)
- 3. No letters or petitions can be accepted by the committee (unless the person who wrote the letter or the persons who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify).
- 4. Persons opposed to the license application are given the opportunity to testify first; supporters may testify after the opponents have finished.
- 5. When you are called to testify, you will be sworn in and asked to give your name, and address. (If your first and/or last names are uncommon please spell them.)

- 6. You may then provide testimony.
- a. Include only information relating to the above license application.
- b. Include only information you have personally witnessed or seen.
- c. Provide concise and relevant information detailing how this business has affected or may affect the peaceful enjoyment of your neighborhood.
- d. If by the time you have the opportunity to testify, the information you wish to share has already been provided to the committee, you may state that you agree with the previous testimony. Redundant or repetitive testimony will not assist the committee in making its recommendation.
- 7. After giving your testimony, the members of the Licenses Committee and the licensee may ask questions regarding the testimony you have given or other factors relating to the license application.
- 8. Business Competition is not a valid basis for denial or non-renewal of a license.

Please Note: If you have submitted an objection to the above application your objection cannot be considered by the committee unless you personally testify at the hearing.
