Partnership applicants must appear by a partner listed on the application or by an attorney. If you wish to do so and at your own expense, you may be accompanied by an attorney of your choosing to represent you at this hearing.

You will be given an opportunity to speak on behalf of the application and to respond and challenge any charges or reasons given for the denial. No petitions can be accepted by the committee, unless the people who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify. You may present witnesses under oath and you may also confront and cross-examine opposing witnesses under oath. If you have difficulty with the English language, you should bring an interpreter with you, at your expense, so that you can answer questions and participate in your hearing.

You may examine the application file at this office during regular business hours prior to the hearing date. Inquiries regarding this matter may be directed to the person whose signature appears below.

This report is written by Police Officer David NOVAK, assigned to the License Investigation Unit, Days.

The Milwaukee Police Department's investigation regarding this application revealed the following:

1. INCIDENT - On 1-13-2005 an underage Milwaukee police aide entered Hideaway, 9000 W Kaul Ave. at the direction of Milwaukee police officers. The aide was able to purchase an alcoholic beverage from the bartender Patricia L Becker, who was issued a citation for Purchase Alcohol By Minor. No further information.
2. On 09-04-05 at 1:05am, Milwaukee Police were called to investigate an Armed Robbery that occurred at The Hideaway Inn. Police spoke to George WILLIAMS III, B/M 08-08-80, 8500 W. Fond du Lac. George stated he was in the bar and was betting on a game of pool he was playing with friends when one of his friends took his money. A fight started outside of the bar and George stated he was beaten up. George told officers he did not want to prosecute and officers filed a report regarding this incident. It should also be noted that the bartender, Jacqueline A. READER, w/f, 05-03-65, 11735 W. Bobolink Ave. 353-8002, pressed the hold-up alarm to get police to respond to the fight.
3. On 12-30-05, at 11:25 AM, Binyoti F. AMUNGWAFOR, called police regarding a patron who was disorderly and making threats to harm other patrons in the bar. Subject was identified as Leonard T. BARTON III, (B/M 06-27-61, 9442 W Fond Du Lac Ave). Leonard BARTON was arrested for Disorderly Conduct while armed. There were no violations found at The Hideaway and no citations were issued.

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4. On 11/24/07 at 3:25 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 5000 W Chambers (St Joseph's Hospital) for a Battery/Cutting complaint. Police spoke to the victim who stated he was in the Reds Hideaway Bar playing pool. At closing time, he and others were leaving the tavern out of a back hallway when he felt a sharp pain to his leg. The victim could not identify anyone who did this and stated he did not have any conflict with anyone inside the tavern. The victim received three staples and was later released. Officers attempted to conduct follow up at the tavern but no one answered. Officers returned on 11/25/07 and spoke to the licensee Binyoti Amungwafor. Amungwafor provided videotape that showed the victim was at the tavern but it did not show the incident itself. A report was filed.

5. On 12/14/07, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 9000 W Kaul for a Fight complaint. Investigation revealed an argument in sued inside the tavern and continued outside in the parking lot. A patron that was not involved in the initial fight went to break it up and in turn was beat up. The victim sustained a laceration that required stitches and a broken nose. During the investigation, another patron began disorderly and was cited for same.

1. On 12/15/07 at 12:09 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 9000 W Kaul for a Subject With Gun complaint. Officers spoke to a security, Michael Williams, who stated there were 5 to 6 males who started a fight inside the tavern and "trashed" the place. Williams further stated the bartender was injured during this fight and that no guns were seen or involved. Police spoke to the bartender James McClendon who stated a fight broke out between an unknown female and an unknown male and when he went to break it up, the fight grew into a brawl with pool sticks being broken along with beer bottles and pitchers. McClendon stated he was hit with a beer bottle in the head during this time. McClendon refused medical attention at the scene. McClendon has not follow-up with officers regarding possible charges in regards to the battery.

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2. On 09/04/08, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 10234 W Spencer Place for an Armed Robbery complaint. Officers spoke to the victim who stated he had left the Hideway bar and attempted to get into his car when he was approached by two males who robbed him of his belongings. Officers conducted follow up at the tavern and spoke to the bouncer Jeffery Simmons who stated he observed two males walk up the parking lot but that they never entered the tavern. Simmons stated another patron entered the tavern and that he (Simmons) had to go inside (the tavern). Simmons related he was waiting for the two males to enter the tavern but they never did. Simmons did not witness the robbery. The licensee Binyoti Amungwafor entered the tavern and spoke with officers. Amungwafor was able to show the officers the incident that was captured on video surveillance, however he stated he was unable to download a copy for police that night.

3. On 11/08/08 at 12:36 am, Milwaukee police responded to a Fight complaint at 91st/ Fond Du Lac, The Hideaway Bar. Officers attempted to speak with the victim who was observed to be bleeding from the face and head and who also had a cut to his right arm. The victim was highly intoxicated and stated to officers that 20-30 unknown subjects inside the bar attacked him. The victim did not provide descriptions and stated he only wanted to go home. Medical personnel was on scene but the victim refused treatment. Officers spoke to the victims' friend who stated an unknown female threw a drink at him and that he threw a drink back at her which started a fight inside the bar. He further stated as patrons were leaving the bar one shot was fired but that he did not know who was shooting. Officers recovered a casing which was found near the front entrance to the tavern. Police spoke to the security guard Andrew Anderson who provided police a description of the actor who fired the gun. Anderson stated he observed this subject go to his car, retrieve a gun and observed a flash from the weapon as it was shot into the air. Police also spoke to the bartender James McClendon who stated he observed some patrons arguing and that both patrons had thrown drinks at one another and that a fight occurred. Anderson could not provide any more information. Officers also spoke to Binyoti Amungwafor who stated the establishment did have three cameras outside and four cameras inside however upon review of the camera hard drive, it was determined the incident was not recorded.

4. On 01/10/09 at 3:14 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 9205 W Birch for a Battery complaint. Officers spoke to the victim who stated he had been at the Hideaway bar and it was near closing time when he was attacked. The victim stated he was rapping with another patron when that patron became angry with the victim and slammed the victim's head into the wall. The victim stated he left the bar and did not notice that the subject followed him outside. Words were exchanged and another fight started when two other individuals got involved and also began punching and kicking the victim. The victim sought medical attention and was treated for bruising and an abrasion to the right ear. Officers did speak with Binyoti Amungwafor regarding the incident.

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5. On 01/07/12 at 2:08 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to St. Joseph's Hospital to investigate a Battery that occurred at The Hideaway bar located at 9000 W Kaul. Investigation revealed two battery victims were injured with one victim needing six stitches to close a laceration on her nose. On 01/08/12, police conducted follow up regarding the complaint and spoke to Antone Brazil, who is one of the bars managers. Brazil stated there was a fight and he went out to assist his security with it. Brazil stated once outside, the fight had broken up and all subjects left. Officers also spoke with Binyoti Amungwafor who also stated a fight did take place but that he didn't call police because everyone left the parking lot. Amungwafor also stated to police that he is not responsible for the problems in his parking lot. Amungwafor attempted to retrieve video surveillance for officers but was unable to. Police returned on 02/11/12 to retrieve the film and were told by Brazil that the system resets after a period of time and the footage from the incident had been erased.

11. On 03/11/12 at 1:56 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 9000 W Kaul for a Shooting complaint. Investigation revealed two subjects were shot while inside their vehicle that was parked in the parking lot near the bars front entrance. Further investigation revealed the shooting victims were shot after an argument occurred inside the tavern involving multiple patrons. The owner of the bar, Binyoti Amungwafor, was not on scene at the time of the incident but later arrived after being called by officers. Video surveillance was obtained and captured the events as it happened.

12. On 03/12/12, Milwaukee police along with the owner of the bar, Binyoti Amungwafor, had a meeting at District 5 regarding the shooting that occurred the night before. Discussions were held on how to prevent future incidents from happening with Amungwafor stating he would add more security and make sure his ID machine was working and that he would train all his security guards on how to use the metal detector. Amungwafor also agreed to have all his employees call police when there are problems instead of trying to handle it on their own. A suggestion by the district Captain to have a cover charge was made and Amungwafor stated he would consider it, but that the last time he had a cover charge, the crowd was small. Amungwafor was also advised that random license premise checks would be conducted on Fridays and Saturdays.
13. On 03/13/12 at 12:30 am, Milwaukee police conducted a License Premise Check at 9000 W Kaul. No violations were observed at the time with police speaking with Antoine Brazil, who is the bar's manager.
14. On 03/16/12, Milwaukee police conducted a License Premise Check at 9000 W Kaul. Police spoke with Antoine Brazil and no violations were observed.
15. On 03/24/12, Milwaukee police conducted a License Premise Check at 9000 W Kaul. Police observed about 50 patrons with two security guards at the front door. Police observed two bartenders and asked for their licenses. One stated she didn't have it on her but did possess one. The other bartender stated she was new and did not have one. Officers needed to do follow up regarding the bartender who stated she had a license. No other violations were observed.

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16. On the following dates and times, a License Premise Check was conducted by Milwaukee police with no violations being observed:

17. On 05/20/12 at 2:00 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to Hideway tavern for a Trouble With Subject complaint. Prior to police arrival, a couple was arguing in the parking lot about who was going to drive home. The girlfriend was pushed out of the vehicle and the boyfriend drove off with the vehicle. The woman sustained a right arm injury during this incident. MFD was on scene to treat the woman.

18. On 07/29/12 at 12:21 am, Milwaukee police conducted a License Premise Check at 9000 W Kaul. Officers spoke with bartenders Jessica Downey and Julianah Coker regarding the check and no violations were observed.
19. On 07/29/12 at 2:28 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 9000 W Kaul for a Shooting complaint. Upon arrival, the bar appeared to be closed and officers found spent gun casings in the bar's parking lot. Police were able to speak with Terry Harmon who works security for the bar who stated he heard gunshots but did not observe who was shooting and where the shots were fired from. Harmon stated that when the shots were fired, patrons ran back into bar and that Harmon inquired with another security guard, Jerry Simmons, about what was going on outside and Simmons informed him that an unknown female was shooting a gun into the air but that Simmons never told him where the shooter was firing the gun. Police attempted to view video surveillance, but the cameras did not capture where police believed shots were fired. Further investigation revealed two subjects were shot; one to the ankle and buttocks and the second victim was shot in buttocks. An officer was made aware by another department personnel that an unknown individual from the Hideaway staff spoke to police via phone prior to police arrival. The Hideaway staff was instructed not to close their establishment and that the police would be there to investigate an incident. The Hideaway staff seemingly ignored police instruction and closed the business anyway.

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20. On 06/16/2013 Milwaukee police conducted a licensed premise check at 9000 West Kaul Avenue (Hideaway Tavern). No violations were observed.
21. On 11/03/2013 Milwaukee police were dispatched to St. Joseph's Hospital to investigate a Substantial Battery complaint. Investigation revealed that around 1:20am the victim, Hakeem Williams, was in the Hideaway Tavern at 9000 West Kaul Avenue. There was an altercation between Williams and several other bar patrons. All of the involved parties were escorted out of the bar by security. Williams was attacked by the other patrons in the parking lot of the business, resulting in the need for 2 staples to the back of his head as well as treatment of other injuries. Milwaukee police incident report #13370043 filed.
22. On 11/10/2013 Milwaukee police were dispatched to a Battery complaint at 9000 West Kaul Avenue (Hideaway Tavern). Investigation revealed the victim, Etienne Poirier, lives above the business. Poirier stated that as soon as he entered the bar, he was attacked by two men that he has had previous altercations with. Poirier states the attack continued until security from the business intervened. Milwaukee police incident report #133140016 filed.
23. On 11/23/2013 Milwaukee police were dispatched to the anonymous complaint of drug dealing at 9000 West Kaul Avenue. The information contained in the dispatch indicated this address is a gas station. The officer checked both the gas station at 91st and Kaul and the business located at 90th and Kaul (Hideaway Tavern) but was unable to locate the caller and did not discover anyone dealing drugs.

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24. On 05/18/2014 officers responded to Hideaway Tavern at 9000 W. Kaul Av for a property damage complaint. The investigation revealed that a female patron of The Hideaway was kicked out for being disorderly after getting in an argument with another patron. The female then went outside and broke the rear window of the other patrons car. The applicant was on scene and cooperative with the investigation.
25. On 05/24/2014 at 1:37am officers responded to the Hideaway at 9000 W. Kaul Av for a shots fired complaint. The call had come in at 12:04am as a trouble with subject but was upgraded to the shots fired at 1:35am. The officers spoke with security outside the tavern and they stated they heard no shots. The applicant was on scene and became agitated when the officers advised him why they were there. He stated he made the call for people not leaving the bar an hour ago but has heard no shots fired. The officers found no evidence of shots fired. The applicant was argumentative with the officers during this investigation.
26. On 02/24/2015 a meeting was held at District Four regarding a homicide that occurred on 02/08/2015 at 8340 W. Fond du lac Av and its relation to The Hideaway at 9000 W. Kaul Av. Present were Captain Beecher, ACA Nick Desiato, the applicant and his manager Tony Brazil. BRAZIL stated the bar has cameras, ID scanner, security and a metal detector. All patrons are wanded for weapons when they enter. Anyone entering with a gun is told to leave the building. BRAZIL stated the crowd gets big between 12:30am and 1:00am on Friday and Saturday nights and they have started a cover charge to keep the crowd down. Captain Beecher asked about gang activity. BRAZIL stated there are 5-6 males that come in together and an additional 2-3 at a time. He stated they never cause trouble inside and he asks them to leave if they throw gang signs. BRAZIL stated he does not believe the shooting was related to the bar and did not believe the victim of the shooting was at the bar that night. The applicant was advised of the importance of calling if there is an incident at the business.
27. On 03/20/2015 the applicant was cited in the City of Milwaukee at 9000 W. Kaul Av for Refilling of Liquor Bottle.

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28. On 03/17/2018 at 1:59am officers observed a large group in the parking lot at 9000 W. Kaul Av, The Hideaway. The subjects fled the scene upon seeing officers. On 03/24/2018 officers followed up with security officer, Terrance STEWARD. He stated there was a fight on the night of 03/17/2018 and he pushed out the victim because the suspect had a large group of friends. He stated the victim left in an auto and the suspect and his friends stayed in the parking lot until the Police arrived.





This License Premise Report was typed by P.O. Ralph MCCLAIN, District Four, assigned to Squad 4365 (Tavern Car), Late Shift. On Saturday, March 17th, 2018, at approximately 1:59 am, Squad 4320 (P.O. Brett STEGERWALD/P.O. Charrita TOWNSEND), while on patrol in the area of N. 91st and W. Fond Du Lac Ave, observed a large crowd standing near the far north end of the parking lot, at the address of 9000 W. Kaul Ave. This location is a Class B license premise establishment (The Hideaway). As the above squad entered the parking lot, it became obvious to P.O. TOWNSEND and P.O. STEGERWALD that some type of commotion was/or had taken place. Squad 4320 (who was in a marked MPD squad car) activated it's lights and audible siren. All subjects began to run and jump into various cars and flee the scene.

On Saturday, March 24, 2018, P.O. PRESTI and I viewed the video surveillance from this incident. On the establishment's camera system, the incident is captured on camera 6, camera 7, camera 10, and camera 14. On cameras 6 and 7, at 12:57:23 am, there are two subjects embroiled in what appears to be a heated argument. One of the subjects (a black male with long dreadlocks, wearing a black and black and white long sleeve shirt, white pants and a light colored baseball cap) punches another black male near the entrance of the bar. The bar's security (Terrance D. STEWARD, b/m, 12/07/87) is observed stepping in front of the subject that is punched and pushing him towards the entrance of the establishment.

The video shows multiple subjects closely follow STEWARD and the subject as they approach the entrance. As they arrive at the front door, camera 10 (front entrance), shows multiple subjects pushing and swinging at the subject, as he and STEWARD exit the front door. On camera 14 (exterior), the video shows these subjects continuing their attack on the subject outside. The subject's (the one attacked) description as it appears on the video is, possibly a black male, low hair cut, light complexion, wearing a dark colored t-shirt and blue jeans.

STEWARD said in a statement to P.O. PRESTI and I that he overheard part of the argument between the two subjects. STEWARD stated he heard one of the subjects (an apparent friend of the subject that threw the punch) say "Dude ain't nobody trying to holla at your girl, we ain't on that shit". STEWARD stated he was standing by the establishment's entrance patting male patrons down for weapons, when out of his peripheral vision, he observed a black male subject punch another subject. STEWARD stated he quickly intervened and wrapped his arms around the subject that got punched. STEWARD stated he did this to protect the subject from getting hit again. STEWARD stated he then pushed this subject towards the door because he observed that the subject who threw the punch had many friends with him and all were advancing towards the subject to attack him.

STEWARD stated that as he escorted this subject out of the bar, these subjects continued punching the subject (the continued assault on this subject was out of view of the exterior cameras). The subject (that was attacked) entered the passenger side of a vehicle and was driven away from the premise. STEWARD stated the other subjects stood around talking loudly until police arrived on scene.

3. No letters or petitions can be accepted by the committee (unless the person who wrote the letter or the persons who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify).
4. Persons opposed to the license application are given the opportunity to testify first; supporters may testify after the opponents have finished.
5. When you are called to testify, you will be sworn in and asked to give your name, and address. (If your first and/or last names are uncommon please spell them.)
6. You may then provide testimony.
 - a. Include only information relating to the above license application.
 - b. Include only information you have personally witnessed or seen.
 - c. Provide concise and relevant information detailing how this business has affected or may affect the peaceful enjoyment of your neighborhood.
 - d. If by the time you have the opportunity to testify, the information you wish to share has already been provided to the committee, you may state that you agree with the previous testimony. Redundant or repetitive testimony will not assist the committee in making its recommendation.
7. After giving your testimony, the members of the Licenses Committee and the licensee may ask questions regarding the testimony you have given or other factors relating to the license application.
8. Business Competition is not a valid basis for denial or non-renewal of a license.
Please Note: If you have submitted an objection to the above application your objection cannot be considered by the committee unless you personally testify at the hearing.


