I represent Jaggi Ghotra, regarding the renewal of his Public Passenger Vehicle license. Members of the Common Council, I ask you to reconsider non-renewal, based upon several things. First and foremost, Mr. Ghotra has never had any problems with - - He has no traffic record in the last five years. He has no criminal record. He's never had, according to 

paper. In fact, there weren't a lot of incidents documented. Mr. Ghotra is here today. He asks you to reconsider that recommendation. He wants to continue working to support his family. He is a cabdriver. He's trying to work with the City, in that he relinquished his taxicab license to somebody else, but he wants to continue driving. And I ask you to reconsider recommendation and possibly consider suspension and give him a second chance. With that, Mr. Ghotra would just like to make a short statement to members of the Common Council.

MR. GHOTRA: Please give me chance, I taxi driver. I have big family. I take care of family. My record is very good. I am not criminal, not anything. In America, I'm last 15 years in America. I am, everything okay. Thank you.

PRESIDENT HINES: Okay. Thank you.

Are there any questions that members of the

the applicant? If not, I thank the both of you.
We will now hear from the City Attorney's office.

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the license investigative unit, any prior complaints about him being a public passenger vehicle operator.

To give just a short history of what happened at the committee hearing. There was some testimony from the owner of - - the general manager of Yellow Cab, Justice Khalsa, regarding an incident that occurred at the temple, the Sikh temple on South Howell Avenue in which - - in which Mr. Ghotra threw - - allegedly threw a rock and milk carton at him. I will tell you that that was reported eight days after the incident happened. There had been some history prior to that about alleged discrimination on the caste system in the Sikh community. Mr. Ghotra denies that allegation, as well as denying any of the other allegations that were presented to the committee hearing.

I want to - - I want you to take note that there was no witnesses to any of the allegations of him being rude to passengers or dispatchers. The documentary evidence that was presented at the committee hearing was basically slips of paper. Many of them were not identified, who was the author of those slips of

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Schrimpf from the City Attorney's office.

It is true, of course, that Mr. Ghotra

had no traffic or criminal record that was presented by the Milwaukee Police Department. The testimony that was presented was the manager of Yellow Cab Co-op, and then ultimately, because of statements made referencing, by Mr. Ghotra, referencing, the termination of his employment, or acceptance of dispatches from American United, Mr. Richard "Red" Christianson, came to the hearing when he was watching it on TV. He actually drove over to City Hall to offer testimony regarding his experiences with Mr. Ghotra.

Whether you renew this license or non-renew it is, of course, repose to your sound discretion. And if you wish to impose a suspension, that again, is repose to your sound discretion. The limits are again, ten minimum, 90 maximum, on a suspension.

So far as the complaint about the records that were presented by Yellow - - Yellow Cab Co-op presented records that they kept from dispatchers of complaints regarding Mr. Ghotra. I think those pretty clearly fit a business
