### Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

Description

The nomination comprises two buildings, constructed in 1879 (east) and 1884 (west). Both have a Creem City brick exterior (painted light green) and limestone foundations. The 1884 structure features a three-story projecting bay with a variety of wood ornament. Highly-decorated metal cornices inscribed with the construction dates crown both structures.

The two buildings were joined in 1970. The original appearance of the upper stories was retained, while the first story facades were altered, replacing the former glass-panel storefronts with a single brick facade. Segmental arch windows and entry follow the fenestration pattern of the upper stories. The cornice from the building on the east was extended across both addresses. The 1884 building originally had an English basement and a first floor walkup with a wrought iron railing. The basement level now features a new courtyard with a fountain designed by Orlandini Studios of Milwaukee.

In the 1970 remodeling, the common wall between the buildings was broken through and the interior space was re-designed. The interior now contains well-harmonized elements of the original structures, architectural antiques, and new additions. Original features include hardwood floors and some wainscoting and moldings. Bannisters, doors, hardware, and fire-place mantels (all floors have operating wood-burning fireplaces) were salvaged from now demolished Milwaukee mansions. The sconces for corridor and stairway lighting throughout the buildings were designed by Louis Sullivan for the Garrick Theatre in Chicago, and were purchased by the owner of the Milwaukee buildings after the theater's demolition. Brass chandeliers of various ages include some that were initially gas fixtures.

### Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

The nomination is of <u>local</u> significance because of the site's relationship to the history of journalism and commerce in Milwaukee and to the development of commercial architecture within the city.

ARCHITECTURE. These buildings are significant as part of an ever-diminishing number of small, three and four story, nineteenth century commercial buildings in downtown Milwaukee. The Milwaukee Architectural and Historical Survey has estimated that there are about forty such structures remaining in the central business district, an area which has undergone much demolition in the last two decades. In addition, the use of materials (Cream City brick, a prominent local brick) and the Picturesque ornamented facades of these buildings make them important on the basis of their typicality; they represent a part of the character of central Milwaukee in the late nineteenth century.

JOURNALISM. The 1879 Milwaukee News Building is significant for its role in the newspaper and printing history of Milwaukee. It was constructed for the Milwaukee News, established in 1848 as a "Democratic daily." The Journal of Commerce, a commercial weekly, shared the quarters. Most importnat, however is the structure's association with the Milwaukee Journal. In 1885, its third year of publication, The Daily Journal (as it was then called) moved to this address from around the corner on Broadway. The growing paper remained in this building until 1891, when it relocated in larger offices on the corner of Michigan and Milwaukee Streets. During the late nineteenth century, the stretch of Mason Street between Water Street and Broadway was a center for Milwaukee newspaper publishing. Several newspapers and magazines (the 1885 Milwaukee City Director lists fifteen) were located on the block, including the prominent Milwaukee Sentinel.

COMMERCE. The 1884 building was constructed as offices for the Milwaukee Abstract

Association and for lawyer Samuel Howard, president of the firm. The Wisconsin Legal News,
a daily report of "official city and county news," was also published at this address for
a short time. In 1890, Howard founded the Milwaukee Title Insurance Company at this site.


