You are hereby notified that the Milwaukee Common Council will hold a hearing on May 5, 2009, commencing at 9:00 a.m., or as soon thereafter as this matter may be heard, in the Common Council chambers on the third floor of City Hall, 200 East Wells Street, Milwaukee, Wisconsin to consider the renewal of your Class "B" Tavern, Tavern Amusement (Cabaret/Nite Club) and Billiard Hall licenses for the premises at 3419 West Forest Home Avenue, Milwaukee, Wisconsin ("The Moon").

Attached you will find a copy of the Report of the Licenses Committee, which includes its Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Recommendation, recommending renewal of your Class "B" license with a fifteen (15) day suspension and renewal of the Tavern Amusement (Cabaret/Nite Club) license with a thirty (30) day suspension based upon the police report and aldermanic testimony. Re: Report of the renewal applications of May Y. Xiong, Agent for "Asian Moon, LLC", for the Class "B" Tavern, Billiard Hall and Tavern Amusement (Cabaret/Nite Club) licenses for the premises located at 3419 West Forest Home Avenue in the City and County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin ("The Moon").

#### FINDINGS OF FACT

1. May Y. Xiong (hereinafter the "Licensee") is the agent for "Asian Moon, LLC" doing business at 3419 West Forest Home Avenue in the City and County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin ("The Moon"). Said licenses expire at midnight, May 12, 2009.
2. Applications to renew said licenses were filed with the Office of the City Clerk on February 27, 2009.
3. Pursuant to Chapter 90 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances and Chapter 125 of the Wisconsin Statutes, the matter was referred to the Milwaukee Police Department for investigation. The Police Department respond with a report dated March 2, 2009 which could form the basis for non renewal or suspension of this license. There were also alleged neighborhood objections to loitering, littering, loud music and noise, parking and traffic problems, drug and criminal activity, prostitution, trespassing, public urination, fights, shootings, vandalism, thefts, and operation of the premises in such a manner that it creates a public nuisance and conduct which are detrimental to the health, safety, and welfare of the neighborhood. However, no neighbors appeared in opposition to the renewal of this license.
4. On April 8, 2009, the City Clerk's Office provided notice to the Licensee pursuant to Chapter 90 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances and Chapter 125 of the Wisconsin Statutes of the

objections of the neighbors. The matter was scheduled for a hearing on the police report on April 21, 2009 at 9:00 a.m. in Room 301B of the third floor of City Hall. The licensee did appear at the hearing and was not represented by counsel.

5. Based upon the sworn testimony heard and the evidence received at the hearing, the Committee finds the following:
  - A. On April 21, 2008, officers of the Milwaukee Police Department were dispatched to 5000 West Chambers for a shooting complaint. Officers spoke to the victim who stated he parked his auto in a bank parking lot at 34<sup>th</sup> and Forest Home Avenue and started to walk to The Moon tavern. The victim stated that he was approached by two males who told him to "break himself". The victim started to argue with the men because he thought they were going to rob him when one actor pulled out a gun. The victim ran away when he heard 10 to 15 shots with one bullet striking him in the buttocks. Officers who responded to the scene did locate and inventory six casings that were found at 2737 South 34<sup>th</sup> Street.
  - B. On September 21, 2008 at 2:37 a.m., officers of the Milwaukee Police Department were dispatched to 34<sup>th</sup> and Forest Home Avenue for a battery complaint. Officers spoke to the victim who stated he was a patron at The Moon tavern and was asked to leave the premises a half hour prior to being beaten. The victim stated he left the tavern and was driving his auto out of the parking lot when he was approached by a group of males who opened his door and pulled him out of the car. These males started to kick and punch the victim in the head. Due to the victim being intoxicated, he could not provide much detail of what exactly happened. Officers spoke to the owner of The Moon who stated the victim was in the bar earlier but was kicked out because he was grabbing at girls and that his security might have observed what happened. Officers spoke to security officer Myron Davis who stated that there were 10-12 males and that they came from Sheboygan. Davis stated he did not observe the fight but that the actors fled in two separate vehicles. The victim was treated for a laceration to the forehead that required 15 sutures to close.
  - C. At hearing, the licensee agreed to eliminate hip hop music from its entertainment offering and improve parking lot

lighting. The licensee has also hired a consultant to assist with security issues.

### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Committee has jurisdiction to hold hearings and provided Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law and a Recommendation to the full Common Council pursuant to Chapter 125 of the Wisconsin Statutes and Chapter 90 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances.
2. Based upon the above facts found, the Committee concludes that the licensee, May Y. Xiong, as agent for "Asian Moon LLC" who holds Class "B" Tavern, Billiard Hall and Tavern Amusement (Cabaret/Nite Club) licenses for the premises located at 3419 West Forest Home Avenue in the City and County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin ("The Moon "), has not met the criteria of Chapter 90 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances or Chapter 125 of the Wisconsin Statutes to allow renewal of the Class "B" Tavern license without undergoing a fifteen (15) day suspension of said license and or renewal of the Tavern Amusement (Cabaret/Nite Club) license with undergoing a thirty (30) day suspension of said license. The Committee finds the neighborhood police report, as stated above, to be true.
3. The Committee recommends renewal of the Billiard Hall license.

4. In order to protect the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Milwaukee, it is the recommendation of the Licenses Committee that the full Common Council of the City of Milwaukee should exercise its judgment to renew the Class "B" Tavern license of May Y. Xiong, as agent for "Asian Moon, LLC" for the premises located at 3419 West Forest Home Avenue in the City and County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin ("The Moon ") with a fifteen (15) day suspension based on the police report and aldermanic testimony; to renew with a thirty (30) day suspension the Tavern Amusement (Cabaret/Nite Club) license held by May Y. Xiong, Agent, "Asian Moon, LLC" based on the police report and aldermanic testimony; and to renew the Billiard Hall license.

### RECOMMENDATION


Based upon the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law stated above, the Committee, by a vote of three (3) ayes, one (1) no and one (1) excused, recommends that the Class "B" Tavern

license held by May Y. Xiong as agent for "Asian Moon, LLC" be renewed with a fifteen (15) day suspension, further recommends that the Tavern Amusement (Cabaret/Nite Club) portion of the tavern license of May Y. Xiong, as agent for "Asian Moon, LLC" for the premises located at 3419 West Forest Home Avenue in the City and County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin ("The Moon "), be renewed with a thirty (30) day suspension and recommends renewal of the Billiard Hall license.

Said suspension of the Class "B" Tavern license is to be in effect from 12:01 a.m., May 13, 2009 through midnight, May 27, 2009.

Said suspension of the Tavern Amusement (Cabaret/Nite Club) license is to be in effect from 12:01 a.m., May 13, 2009 through midnight, June 11, 2009.

Re: Report of the renewal applications of Nicholas A. Paulsen for the Class "B" Tavern and Instrumental Music licenses with change in hours for the premises located at 540 South 76<sup>th</sup> Street in the City and County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin ("Liquid Johnny's").

#### FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Nicholas A. Paulsen (hereinafter the "License") is the holder of Class "B" Tavern and Instrumental Music licenses for the premises located at 540 South 76<sup>th</sup> Street in the City and County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin ("Liquid Johnny's"). Said licenses expire at midnight, May 8, 2009.
2. Applications to renew said licenses were timely filed with the office of the City Clerk on April 8, 2009.
3. Pursuant to Chapter 90 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances and Chapter 125 of the Wisconsin Statutes, the matter was referred to the Milwaukee Police Department for investigation. The Milwaukee Police Department responded with a report that could form the basis of non-renewal or suspension of these licenses on April 9, 2009.
4. On April 9, 2009, the City Clerk's Office provided timely notice to the Licensee pursuant to Chapter 90 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances and Chapter 125 of the Wisconsin Statutes of an amended report of the Milwaukee Police Department and included therewith a copy of the Milwaukee Police Department report. The matter was scheduled for a hearing on April 21, 2009, commencing at 8:45 a.m. in Room 301B of City Hall. At said date, time and place, the licensee appeared and was not represented by counsel.

5. Based upon the sworn testimony heard and the evidence received at the hearing, the Committee finds the following:
- A. On September 30, 2008 at 5:15 p.m., officers of the Milwaukee Police Department were conducting sales of alcohol to minors and had a Milwaukee police aide who is under the age of 21 enter 540 South 76<sup>th</sup> Street in an attempt to purchase alcohol. The bartender served the aide a bottle of beer without asking for any identification. The licensee, Nicholas Paulsen, received a citation for sale of alcohol to underage person and was found guilty on February 11, 2009 and fined \$160.00.
  - B. On February 2, 2009 at 12:40 a.m., officers of the Milwaukee Police Department were dispatched to 540 South 76<sup>th</sup> Street for an armed robbery complaint. The investigation revealed that an armed robbery occurred inside the tavern with two suspects entering the tavern and demanding money from the patrons as well as the tavern register. The bartender stated that approximately \$1,000 was taken from the cash register.
  - C. On February 11, 2009 at 4:15 p.m., officers of the Milwaukee Police Department were conducting sales of alcohol to minors and had a Milwaukee police aide who is under the age of 21 enter 540 South 76<sup>th</sup> Street and attempt to purchase alcohol. The bartender/licensee, Nicholas Paulsen, served the aide a bottle of beer even after checking the police aide's identification. The licensee received a citation for sale of alcohol to underage person, was found guilty on April 1, 2008 and fined \$160.00.
  - D. On January 29, 2009, the applicant was convicted of operating while intoxicated in Milwaukee County and his driver's license was revoked for one year.

#### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Committee has jurisdiction to hold hearings and provided Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law and a Recommendation to the full Common Council pursuant to Chapter 125 of the Wisconsin Statutes and Chapter 90 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances.

2. Based upon the above facts found, the Committee concludes that the licensee, Nicholas A. Paulsen, has not met the criteria of Chapter 90 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances or Chapter 125 of the Wisconsin Statutes to allow renewal of his Class "B" Tavern and Instrumental Music licenses without undergoing a thirty (30) day suspension of said licenses based upon the police report. The Committee finds the police report, as stated above, to be true.
  
3. In order to protect the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Milwaukee, it is the recommendation of the Licenses Committee that the full Common Council of the City of Milwaukee should exercise its judgment to renew the Class "B" Tavern and Instrumental Music licenses held by Nicholas A. Paulsen for the premises located at 540 South 76<sup>th</sup> Street in the City and County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin ("Liquid Johnny's") with a thirty (30) day suspension based upon the police report.


#### RECOMMENDATION

#### FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Stojan Coralic (hereinafter the "License") is the holder of Class "B" Tavern and Tavern Dance licenses for the premises located at 2936 South 13<sup>th</sup> Street in the City and County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin ("The Brew House"). Said licenses expire at midnight, May 19, 2009.
2. Applications to renew said licenses were timely filed with the office of the City Clerk on March 12, 2009.
3. Pursuant to Chapter 90 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances and Chapter 125 of the Wisconsin Statutes, the matter was referred to the Milwaukee Police Department for investigation. The Milwaukee Police Department responded with a report that could form the basis of non-renewal or suspension of these licenses on March 16, 2009. There were also alleged neighborhood objections to loitering, littering, loud music and noise, parking and traffic problems, drug and criminal activity, prostitution, trespassing, public urination, and operation of the premises in such a manner that it creates a public nuisance and conduct which is detrimental to the health, safety and welfare of the neighborhood.
4. On April 8, 2009, the City Clerk's Office provided timely notice to the Licensee pursuant to Chapter 90 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances and Chapter 125 of the Wisconsin Statutes of an amended report of the Milwaukee Police Department and included therewith a copy of the Milwaukee Police Department report. The matter was scheduled for a hearing on April 21, 2009,

commencing at 11:15 a.m. in Room 301B of City Hall. At said date, time and place, the licensee appeared and was represented by Attorney Ronald Shikora, Shikora & Kaiser, 161 West Wisconsin Avenue, Suite 3032, Milwaukee, WI 53203.

5. Based upon the sworn testimony heard and the evidence received at the hearing, the Committee finds the following:
  - A. On February 6, 2009 at 1:30 a.m., officers of the Milwaukee Police Department were dispatched to 2936 South 13<sup>th</sup> Street for a subject with a gun complaint. Officers spoke to the caller who stated a patron who was still in the tavern was armed with a black semi-automatic handgun. The caller provided a description of the patron and stated this patron had the gun in his waistband. Officers entered the tavern and located the subject who matched the description given and recovered the handgun. Further investigation revealed this subject to be under the age of 21 and highly intoxicated. He was also found to be in possession of a half full Heineken beer. This subject was arrested and charged with reckless use of a weapon and issued a citation for possession/consumption of alcohol-underage. On February 7, 2009, officers conducted a follow-up at the tavern and spoke to the bartender regarding the violation found. She stated she could not believe that an underage person would be in the tavern because she had security at the door checking patrons' identifications. She stated she would further discuss this with her security. Officers then spoke to the licensee, Stojan Coralic, and explained the violations found. Officers issued a citation to the bartender for presence and sale to underage and one to Stojan Coralic for licensee responsibility. The bartender was found guilty on her citation on March 30, 2009 and fined \$367.00.
  - B. At hearing, it was disclosed that the underage patron had been in the premises two times before.

#### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Committee has jurisdiction to hold hearings and provided Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law and a Recommendation to the full Common Council pursuant to Chapter 125 of the Wisconsin Statutes and Chapter 90 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances.

2. Based upon the above facts found, the Committee concludes that the licensee, Stojan Coralic, has not met the criteria of Chapter 90 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances or Chapter 125 of the Wisconsin Statutes to allow renewal of his Class "B" Tavern and Tavern Dance licenses without undergoing a ten (10) day suspension of said licenses based upon the police report. The Committee finds the police report, as stated above, to be true.
3. In order to protect the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Milwaukee, it is the recommendation of the Licenses Committee that the full Common Council of the City of Milwaukee should exercise its judgment to renew the Class "B" Tavern and Tavern Dance licenses for the premises located at 2936 South 13<sup>th</sup> Street in the City and County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin ("The Brew House") with a ten (10) day suspension based upon the police report.

#### RECOMMENDATION

Based upon the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law stated above, the Committee, by a vote of four (4) ayes, zero (0) noes and one (1) excused, recommends that the Class "B" Tavern and Tavern Dance licenses be renewed with a ten (10) day suspension based on the police report.

Said suspension is to be in effect between 12:01 a.m. on May 20, 2009 through midnight, May 29, 2009.
