Regarding: Your Pedicab Owner's Permit Renewal Applications For Your Four Pedicabs as agent for "MILWAUKEE PEDAL TAVERN, LLC" for "MILWAUKEE PEDAL TAVERN" at 6650 W State St #288.

There is a possibility that your application may be denied for one or more of the following reasons: you do not meet the municipal qualifications or any of the licensing requirements of Chapter 100 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances; pending charges against or the conviction of any felony, misdemeanor, municipal offense or other offense, the circumstances of which substantially relate to the circumstances of the particular licensed activity, by the permittee, or by any employee, driver or lessee of the permittee; the permittee, or any employee, driver or lessee of the permittee, having violated any of the operating regulations and prohibited practices set forth in Chapter 100 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances; any other factor or factors which reasonably relate to the public health, safety and welfare. See attached police report and/or written correspondence regarding this application. Please be advised the public will be able to provide information to the committee in person or in writing. The committee will receive and consider evidence regarding the above mentioned criteria.

Notice for applicants with warrants or unpaid fines: Proof of warrant satisfaction or payment of fines must be submitted at the hearing on the above date and time. Failure to comply with this requirement may result in a delay of the granting/denial of your application.

Failure to appear at this meeting may result in the denial of your license. Individual applicants must appear only in person or by an attorney. Corporate or Limited Liability applicants must appear only by the agent designated on the application or by an attorney. Partnership applicants must appear by a partner listed on the application or by an attorney. If you wish to do so and at your own expense, you may be accompanied by an attorney of your choosing to represent you at this hearing.

You will be given an opportunity to speak on behalf of the application and to respond and challenge any charges or reasons given for the denial. No petitions can be accepted by the committee, unless the people who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify. You may present witnesses under oath and you may also confront and cross-examine opposing witnesses under oath. If you have difficulty with the English language, you should bring an interpreter with you, at your expense, so that you can answer questions and participate in your hearing.

You may examine the application file at this office during regular business hours prior to the hearing date. Inquiries regarding this matter may be directed to the person whose signature appears below.

Limited parking for persons attending meetings in City Hall is available at reduced rates (5 hour limit) at the Milwaukee Center on the southwest corner of East Kilbourn and North Water Street. Parking tickets must be validated in Room 205, City Hall (City Clerk's Office).

Thanks for the response and the copy of the message to responsible parties.

The thing that has been becoming more and more frustrating in the Third Ward is that the neighborhood has been moving in the direction of being seen as way too tolerant of drunken misconduct. My car was one of four windshields smashed last fall at bar time on Menomonee St. Two months ago two young men climbed up my fire escape with some beers, were making a scene on the roof and had to be escorted down by my neighbor. When the atmosphere of anything goes is what is being cultivated by the development strategy of a neighborhood this is what occurs.

The bike tavern in particular seems completely ridiculous as true they don't themselves have a liquor license but people are allowed to bring beer on the ride and as a rule tend to for some reason stream and blast music as they go and are contributing (in my opinion) greatly to the anything goes mentality.

Perhaps this question is for Mr. Basting or Mrs. O'Keefe. Is it not possible for someone in an official capacity to contact the Bike Tavern people directly and tell them to cool it after 9PM or do I actually have to call the Police Friday night at 11PM and have them pulled over?

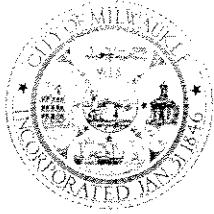

To whom it may concern:

The above application has been made by the above named applicant(s). This requires approval from the Public Safety and the Common Council of the City of Milwaukee. The hearing before the Public Safety will take place on 3/28/2013 at 9:15 AM, in Room 301-B, Third Floor, City Hall. If you wish, you may provide testimony at the hearing regarding the request; see below for further information. You are not required to attend the hearing. Once the Public Safety makes its recommendation, this recommendation is forwarded to the full Common Council for approval at its next regularly scheduled hearing. Please review the information below and if you have further questions regarding this process, please contact the License Division at (414) 286-2238.

Important details for those wishing to provide information for the Public Safety to consider when making its recommendation:

1. The license application is scheduled to be heard at the above time. Due to other hearings running longer than scheduled, you may have to wait some time to provide your testimony.
2. You must appear in person and testify as to matters that you have personally experienced or seen. (You cannot provide testimony for your neighbor, parent or anyone else; this is considered hearsay and cannot be considered by the committee.)
3. No letters or petitions can be accepted by the committee (unless the person who wrote the letter or the persons who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify).
4. Persons opposed to the license application are given the opportunity to testify first; supporters may testify after the opponents have finished.
5. When you are called to testify, you will be sworn in and asked to give your name, and address. (If your first and/or last names are uncommon please spell them.)
6. You may then provide testimony.
 - a. Include only information relating to the above license application.
 - b. Include only information you have personally witnessed or seen.
 - c. Provide concise and relevant information detailing how this business has affected or may affect the peaceful enjoyment of your neighborhood.
 - d. If by the time you have the opportunity to testify, the information you wish to share has already been provided to the committee, you may state that you agree with the previous testimony. Redundant or repetitive testimony will not assist the committee in making its recommendation.
7. After giving your testimony, the members of the Licenses Committee and the licensee may ask questions regarding the testimony you have given or other factors relating to the license application.
8. Business Competition is not a valid basis for denial or non-renewal of a license.

Please Note: If you have submitted an objection to the above application your objection cannot be considered by the committee unless you personally testify at the hearing.
