Regarding: Your Class B Tavern and Public Entertainment Premises License Renewal Applications Requesting a Change of Capacity from 79 to 80 as agent for "Pourman's LLC" for "Pourman's" at 1127 N Water St.

There is a possibility that your application may be denied for one or more of the following reasons: failure of the applicant to meet the statutory and municipal license qualifications; pending charges against or the conviction of any felony, misdemeanor, municipal offense or other offense, the circumstances of which substantially relate to the circumstances of the particular licensed activity, on behalf of the licensee, his or her employes, or patrons (if the licensee is a corporation or licensed limited partnership, the conviction of the corporate agent, officers, directors, members or any shareholder holding 20% or more of the corporation's total or voting stock, or proxies for that amount of stock, of any of the offenses enumerated in s. 125.12(2)(ag), Wis. Corporate or Limited Liability applicants must appear only by the agent designated on the application or by an attorney. Partnership applicants must appear by a partner listed on the application or by an attorney. If you wish to do so and at your own expense, you may be accompanied by an attorney of your choosing to represent you at this hearing.

You will be given an opportunity to speak on behalf of the application and to respond and challenge any charges or reasons given for the denial. No petitions can be accepted by the committee, unless the people who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify. You may present witnesses under oath and you may also confront and cross-examine opposing witnesses under oath. If you have difficulty with the English language, you should bring an interpreter with you, at your expense, so that you can answer questions and participate in your hearing.

This report is written by Police Officer David NOVAK, assigned to the License Investigation Unit, Days.

The Milwaukee Police Department's investigation regarding this application revealed the following:

1. On 05/03/2014 Officers conducted underage tavern enforcement. At 11:13pm an underage Police Aid gained access to Pourman's at 1127 N. Water St. through the front door. The Police Aid then ordered, paid for and obtained a Miller Lite from the bartender without being asked for ID to verify her age.

2. On 07/27/2014 at 1:50am officers conducted a tavern check at Pourman's, 1127 N. Water St. The officer asked the employee at the door stated there were about 60-65 patron in the bar but did not have a counting device. The officer conducted a count of patrons and upon reaching 100 called for a supervisor. The supervisors responded and closed the bar by controlling the exits. The patrons were videotaped and counted as they left. The total was 119 patrons. The business has a total capacity of 79.

3. On 08/19/2014 the applicant had a meeting with Asst. City Attorney Nick DeSiato, Sgt. RADEN, and Capt. THIELE. The applicant stated he has added more security on Saturday nights and they would have a clicker for counting people as they entered. He has roped off an area in front of the bar in order to keep an orderly line and separate the people waiting to get in the bar from people loitering on the sidewalk. The applicant stated he will also look into more cameras. The applicant was advised to contact Code RED officers if he was having issues he could not control with his personnel. ACA DeSiato went over concerns regarding the overcapacity issue and stated his recommendation for the citation to be reduced.

PA-33E Narrative

This report is written by P.O. Robert FERRELL, District One, Power Shift, Sq 1431.

On the evening of Saturday May 3rd, 2014 through the morning of Sunday May 4th, 2014 District One personnel performed an underage tavern enforcement initiative. This was supervised by Sq 1413, Sgt. David LIGAS, and staffed with MPD officers Anthony KRUEGER, District One, Early Shift, Jennifer RAMOS, District One, Late Shift and myself. For the underage persons in this initiative we used two MPD police aides who work in the Police Administration Building. They were P.A. Paige CARLONI, W/F 12-15-93, Sensitive Crimes Day Shift, and P.A. Kourtney HARTL, W/F 06-18-94, Central Booking Day Shift.

Prior to attempting any checks of licensed class B tavern establishments the police aides were given instructions. CARLONI and HARTL were told that they were not allowed to consume any intoxicating beverages. They could not lie if asked if they were underage, or show any form of documentation, which could be construed as identification. It was explained that they had to order a Miller Lite Beer, directly from a bartender behind a bar, then meet the plainclothes officer observing them with the alcoholic beverage for a photo in the tavern and then leave together. It was explained that at all times the plainclothes officer shadowing them would be in visual sight and observe the financial transaction for alcoholic beverages.

After this briefing Sq 1413 Sgt. LIGAS, escorted P.O. KRUEGER who was in plainclothes and P.A. HARTL. While I escorted P.O. RAMOS (in plainclothes), and P.A. CARLONI to multiple taverns located throughout the District One boundaries.

On Saturday, May 3rd, 2014 at 23:13 P.A. CARLONI gained entry to the class "B" licensed tavern Pourman's 1127 N Water St. P.A. CARLONI wasn't challenged at the point of entry by security staff present, but instead had the door opened by the doorman to let her in. He was an older W/M heavy set with a white beard. After gaining entry the underage P.A. CARLONI while being observed by P.O. RAMOS, did approach the bar and ordered a Miller Lite from the bartender (W/F brown hair wearing a black shirt). P.A. CARLONI again was not challenged for identification to verify her age. Upon exchange of money with the bartender P.A. CARLONI was served an alcoholic beverage consisting of a Miller Lite Beer. At that time P.O. RAMOS took a photo of P.A. CARLONI inside the tavern and both left together to perform additional checks of nearby class "B" licensed establishments.

After the checks were completed the above listed tavern was not immediately notified of the violation(s) or informed that a PA33 and citations regarding would be filed. This was done at a later time due to the tavern being closed by time we finished.

On Thursday, August 19, 2014 at 1:10pm, Ben Hebl, the owner of Pourman's Pub, met with Asst. City Attorney Nick DeSiato, Sgt. Chad Raden, and myself, Capt. Leslie Thiele at District One. Mr. Hebl's attorney, Michael Whitcomb Jr., was also present for this meeting.

The meeting was to discuss the overcapacity situation that occurred at Pourman's on July 27, 2014. The tavern's capacity is set for 79 and the establishment had 119 patrons including employees inside. A \$10,000 citation was issued to Mr. Hebl on July 30th for being 40 people over his allowed amount.

Mr. Hebl discussed the changes that he has put in place already and ones that he planned on making in the near future so this situation did not occur again. Mr. Hebl has added an additional security guard for Saturday nights in order to usher people inside from a proper line. The security guard will have a clicker that will be used to keep track of the amount of people being allowed in. He has roped off an area in front of his establishment going northbound toward Coyote Ugly (the tavern next door) in order to keep those individuals who are trying to get into his tavern in one area. This will help in keeping the crowds in order. This will also help the people in determining who is waiting to get into the establishment and who is just loitering outside of the tavern.

Mr. Hebl has stated that he will also look into more cameras and it was suggested by Sgt. Raden that Mr. Hebl put the rope line out every night that he is open in order to establish a routine for the patrons. This could also help to deter any underage patrons from assuming that a large group of people can just walk in at once without having ids checked at the door.

Mr. Hebl was apologetic regarding the situation and was very eager to work with police and other taverns in the Water Street area to keep things under control and for all of the businesses to be successful with minimal issues.

A discussion was held regarding the crowds loitering in front of Pourman's as well as the other bars on N. Water Street. A recommendation was made to Mr. Hebl to contact the other bar owners for advice and guidance if needed, but he was told if he is having issues outside of his establishment that cannot be handled by his personnel that he should contact one of the officers assigned to Code R.E.D.

Assistant City Attorney DeSiato went over some of his concerns regarding overcapacity and notified him that he would put in a recommendation for the citation to be dropped to \$5,000 which he offered Mr. Hebl. Mr. Hebl was going to discuss this with his attorney and they would get back to ACA DeSiato.

Mr. Hebl was told if he ever had any questions or concerns, to contact Capt. Thiele, Sgt. Raden or ACA DeSiato.

This report is submitted by P.O. BOGUST assigned to District One, Power Shift, squad 1460. On Sun July 27th, at approximately 1:50 AM I conducted a tavern check at 1127 N Water ST (Pourman's LLC). I was informed by Code Red Officers that they believed the bar was operating over capacity.

I entered the establishment and talked with the employee stationed at the door. I asked how many patrons were in the bar? The employee had no counting device and stated that there were approximately sixty to sixty-five people in the bar. I walked through the bar doing a head count, I then proceeded to patio area once there was a heavy smell of marijuana in the air. It was evident to me that patrons were openly smoking marijuana in the patio area.

When my total head count of patrons was over one hundred I stopped counting and radioed for a supervisor. SGT LIGAS and SGT ACKLEY both responded to my location. SGT LIGAS placed me at the rear door of the Bar while SGT AKLEY counted and video tapped all patrons exiting the establishment. This bars total occupancy on their permit from the City of Milwaukee is seventy-nine. The total count of patrons in the bar was one hundred and nineteen. While counting prior to the supervisors arrival patrons of the bar were being asked to leave by the owner of the establishment Benjamin a HEBL (w/m 10/25/83).

I reviewed the posted license prior to my departure with the owner, I also informed him of the heavy marijuana smell coming from the open patio area of his bar. HEBL is also aware that he will be receiving a over occupancy citation with in a few days

3. No letters or petitions can be accepted by the committee (unless the person who wrote the letter or the persons who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify).
4. Persons opposed to the license application are given the opportunity to testify first; supporters may testify after the opponents have finished.
5. When you are called to testify, you will be sworn in and asked to give your name, and address. (If your first and/or last names are uncommon please spell them.)
6. You may then provide testimony.
 - a. Include only information relating to the above license application.
 - b. Include only information you have personally witnessed or seen.
 - c. Provide concise and relevant information detailing how this business has affected or may affect the peaceful enjoyment of your neighborhood.
 - d. If by the time you have the opportunity to testify, the information you wish to share has already been provided to the committee, you may state that you agree with the previous testimony. Redundant or repetitive testimony will not assist the committee in making its recommendation.
7. After giving your testimony, the members of the Licenses Committee and the licensee may ask questions regarding the testimony you have given or other factors relating to the license application.
8. Business Competition is not a valid basis for denial or non-renewal of a license.
Please Note: If you have submitted an objection to the above application your objection cannot be considered by the committee unless you personally testify at the hearing.

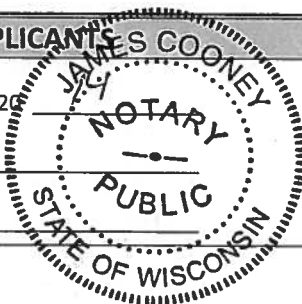

On Wednesday, September 25th, 2013 at 01:24 Sq 1430 (P.O. McCORD and FERRELL) responded to a call to check for a suspect at the licensed tavern KIKU'S Sushi Bar (200 W. Wisconsin Ave). Located in the City and County of Milwaukee.

Upon arrival we located the wanted subject ZHANG, Man F M/A 01-06-1978, the licensee of the tavern. At that time Sq 1443 (P.O. Matt ANDERSON and P.O. Jeff CLINE) took ZHANG into custody. ZHANG was asked if anyone in the tavern was licensed to keep his tavern service open in his absence. Zhang responded "No", at that time he informed employees to close for the night.

CARRASCO said that the only person she knew of that had a license was ZHANG. GONZALEZ, Emerald L F/H 09-14-91, 3703 S. 84th St, Milwaukee, WI 53228, ph# 414-213-0086. GONZALEZ also stated that she was an unlicensed bartender for the restaurant/tavern. FERNANDEZ, Victoria M F/H 07-01-92, 1749 S. 60th St, Milwaukee, WI 53214, ph#414-578-6522. FERNANDEZ stated that she had completed her responsible servers class but had not applied for a bartender's license.

All three of these individuals told me that no one in the restaurant had a license to serve alcohol in ZHANG'S absence. At that time I advised them to stop alcoholic beverage sells that night and not to serve any alcoholic beverages until ZHANG'S return.

The following night upon returning to work on Thursday, September 26th, 2013 at 20:56 I went past KIKU'S and observed their bar open. At that time I stopped and performed another tavern check for licensed persons. Upon entering the restaurant/tavern I observed the bar open with multiple tables having bottles of beer on them, and cocktails with FERNANDEZ behind the bar serving drinks. When asked who was licensed upon the premises, FERNANDEZ replied no one. At that time I called acting Lieutenant, Sgt. HEIDEMANN regarding the repeat violation. Sgt. HEIDEMANN stated close the restaurant/tavern down and issue citation regarding.

The restaurant/tavern was subsequently ordered closed and a citation was left for ZHANG, being given to FERNANDEZ to give to ZHANG upon his return.

PA-33E Narrative

This report is written by P.O. Anthony KRUEGER, District One, Early Shift, Sqd. 1421.

On the evening of Saturday May 3rd, 2014 through the morning of Sunday May 4th, 2014 District One personnel performed an underage tavern enforcement initiative. This was supervised by Sq 1413, Sgt. David LIGAS, and staffed with MPD officers Robert FERRELL, District One, Power Shift, Jennifer RAMOS, District One, Late Shift and myself. For the underage persons in this initiative we used two MPD police aides who work in the Police Administration Building. They were P.A. Paige CARLONI, W/F 12-15-93, Sensitive Crimes Day Shift, and P.A. Kourtney HARTL, W/F 06-18-94, Central Booking Day Shift.

Prior to attempting any checks of licensed class B tavern establishments the police aides were given instructions. CARLONI and HARTL were told that they were not allowed to consume any intoxicating beverages. They could not lie if asked if they were underage, or show any form of documentation, which could be construed as identification. It was explained that they had to order a Miller Lite Beer in a bottle, directly from a bartender behind a bar, then meet the plain clothes officer observing them with the alcoholic beverage for a photo in the tavern and then leave together. It was explained that at all times the plain clothes officer shadowing them would be in visual sight and observe the financial transaction for alcoholic beverages.

After this briefing Sq 1413 Sgt. LIGAS, escorted P.O. Anthony KRUEGER who was in plainclothes and P.A. HARTL. While P.O. FERRELL escorted P.O. RAMOS in plainclothes, and P.A. CARLONI to multiple taverns located throughout the District One boundaries.

On Sunday, May 4th, 2014 at 1:10 AM P.A. HARTL gained entry to the class "B" licensed tavern Kiku located at 200 W Wisconsin Ave. P.A. HARTL wasn't challenged at the point of entry by security staff, even though security was present. A b/m subject working security at the door did not check for an ID from P.A. HARTL and permitted her to enter the tavern. After gaining entry the underage P.A. HARTL while being observed by P.O. KRUEGER, approached the bar and ordered a Miller Lite from the bartender, (H/F, 20's). P.A. HARTL again was not challenged for identification to verify her age. Upon exchange of money, the bartender served an alcoholic beverage consisting of a Miller Lite Beer. At that time P.O. KRUEGER took a photo of P.A. HARTL inside the tavern and both left together to perform additional checks of nearby class "B" licensed establishments.

After the checks were completed the above listed tavern was notified of the violation(s) and informed that a PA33 and citations regarding would be filed. We were unable to identify the above listed subjects and a follow up investigation will be conducted to obtain the information regarding.

Alderman Bauman,

My name is _____ . I live at _____ and work in the Germania Building, so I spend a lot of time walking between home and work. I just got back from walking my dog, and I am thoroughly disgusted with the condition of the square block between Wells and Wisconsin, and 2nd and 3rd St.

Here are my concerns:

1. The sidewalk on the south side of Wells is in total disrepair. And even though there was money to put up a ridiculously obtrusive parking sign that nobody understands, there has been no attempt to fix the cracks in the sidewalk or the slope that goes below the curb and causes water to pool and freeze in the winter.
2. The garbage behind Kiku Restaurant is always overflowing into the alleyway and the bags and boxes are broken open which attracts animals and must be some kind of health code violation. No other business in the area has their garbage openly exposed and strewn all over the street.
3. Cars continue to park in the alleys where no parking signs are clearly posted, but parking enforcement rarely monitors these areas.
4. There is no garbage can next to the bus stop on the west side of 2nd street which is always littered.
5. The grassy area between the parking lot and the street is not mowed or cleaned up regularly. And the benches on 2nd Street serve no purpose because there is no bus stop or park there, and unfortunately this summer, a lot of homeless men have taken to sitting and sleeping on them and not getting any help to find shelter. I have called 211 and talked to the police and they say there is nothing they can do.
6. Finally, these homeless have started to seek shelter in the doorway of the Germania Building on 2nd Street. I feel this is a safety and a community health issue and I am concerned about the growing number of homeless that are not getting the shelter or physical and mental health treatment that they may need.

With the emphasis on the revitalization of downtown and the possibility of the new arena being built right around the corner, I feel that these issues must be addressed. If we want to attract more people to live and work and develop businesses downtown I believe we must maintain a clean and safe environment and have a plan to help people who cannot help themselves so we don't have another Red Arrow Park incident.

I invite you to come and observe this area so you and the common council have a clear understanding of the problems and how to address them. Thank you for your attention to these matters.

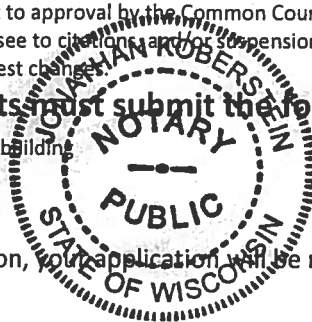

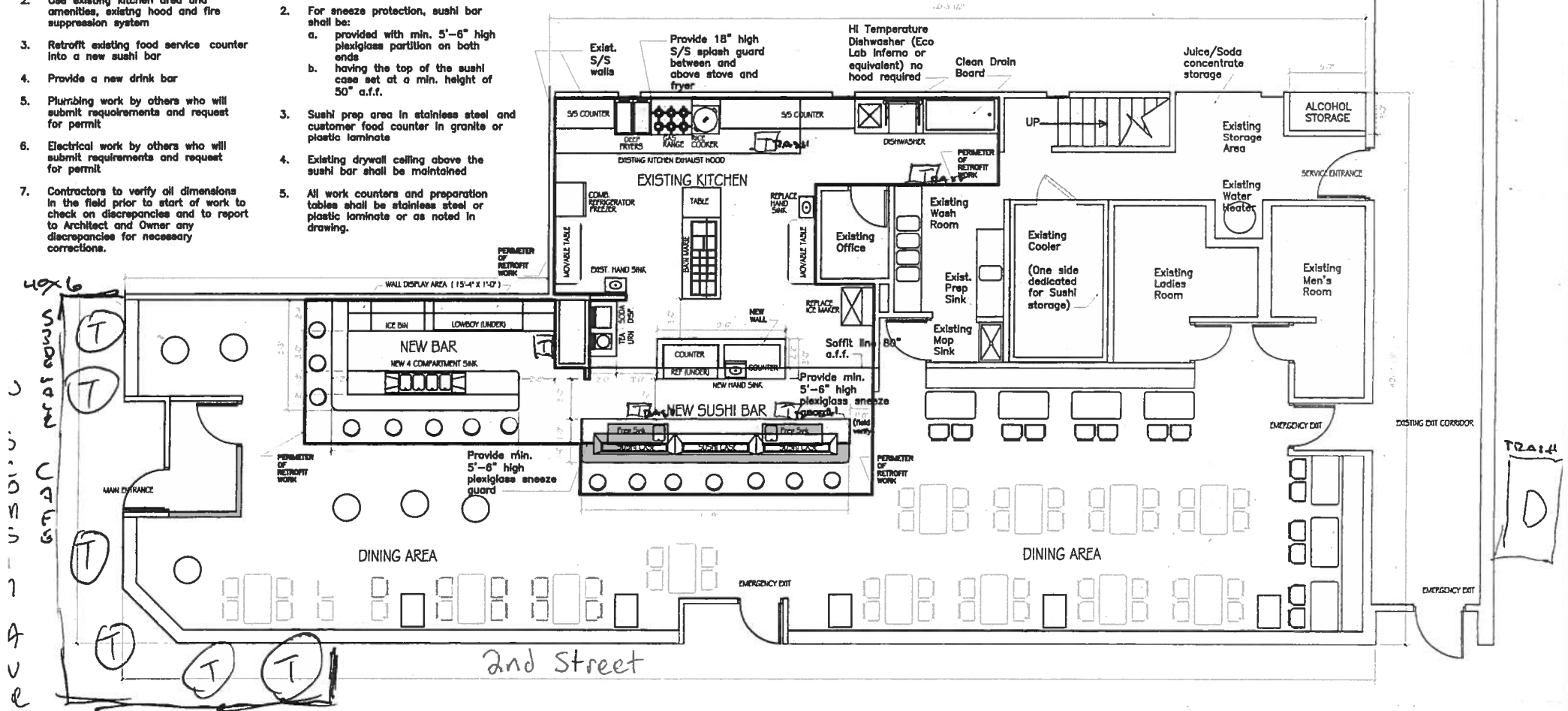

2. On 04/20/2014 Milwaukee police, while on patrol in the 600 block of North Water Street as part of Code Red, observed two subjects fighting in front of Ultra Lounge (628 North Water Street). After placing both subjects in custody, a third subject approached the arresting officers and yelled at one of the arrested subjects. This third subject approached officers a total of three times, the third time he was armed with a semi-automatic pistol. This subject, who was also arrested for disorderly conduct while armed, stated he was at Ultra Lounge prior to the incident. The two subjects originally observed fighting were sighted for disorderly conducted.

3. On 06/19/2014 at 2:15am Officers were on patrol in the 600 block of N. Water St and observed that there were still patrons inside 628 N. Water St (Ultra Lounge) well after legal hours of operation. On scene was David HINTON who stated he was the owner. He stated he did not know the hours of operation and it was his fault the people were in the bar. The officer showed him the license posted on the wall which showed the closing time was 1:45am. The applicant was cited for Class B Premises Allow Patron After Hours.

4. On 07/12/2014 Milwaukee police, while on patrol in the 600 block of North Water Street as part of Code Red, were speaking to bouncers outside Ultra Lounge (628 North Water Street) when a fight broke out inside the business. Bouncers were able to control the situation and held their positions until additional squads responded to assist with crowd control.
5. On 09/27/2014 Milwaukee police were approached by security from Ultra Lounge and 618 Live, stating there was fight on the sidewalk at approximately 630 North Water Street. While responding, one of the officers fell and injured his right hand.
6. On 09/29/2014 a Milwaukee police officer was flagged down by a citizen who stated there was a large fight in the 600 block of North Water Street. Officers responded and discovered a group of 40-50 people in the street and on the sidewalk in front of Ultra Lounge (628 North Water Street), some of which were fighting. This group eventually dispersed and no citations or arrests were made.
7. On 10/04/2014 at 1:46am a Milwaukee police officer went over the air with a "huge fight" in front of 618 Live. Subsequently, the Milwaukee police mounted patrol and 15 additional police squads responded and discovered numerous separate fights in the area involving 20-40 people each. While investigating these fights, officers were told by staff from the bar that there were still approximately 150 people inside the tavern. The officer who originally called for assistance regarding the "huge fight" indicates that he had been assigned to monitor the release of The Ultra Lounge and 618 Live. This officer observed a subject screaming, pounding and pulling on the front door of 618 Live after being ejected from the business. The applicant told police that this subject had been ejected for fighting inside the business and that the other combatant had been kicked out of the back door of the tavern. The two combatants located each other again after being ejected from the club and again began fighting. This incident led to other fights and other patrons gathering to view the commotion. Security staff from 618 Live was observed assisting officer's break up the fights. 618 Live staff also provided police with video footage of the incident. Five subjects were cited as a result of the fights, officers were unable to detain additional subjects because of the number of fights occurring in close proximity to each other. At one point an officer used Oleoresin Capsicum "pepper spray" to stop the actions of one of the combatants. One of the suspects cited admitted to coming from the Ultra Lounge.

8. On 10/08/2014 the applicant and representatives of The Ultra Lounge met with representatives of the Milwaukee police department and the Milwaukee city attorney's office to discuss areas of concern including fights that occur on a regular basis at the end of the night. Several suggestions were made to help alleviate these issues. Some of the suggestions recommended for implementation by The Ultra Lounge, such as using an ID scanner, are already in place at 618 Live. Some suggestions, such as a patron being banned from one business also being banned from the other, are applicable to both businesses. Suggestions that would apply only to 618 Live were to change their minimum age to 23 and decrease capacity from the current 480 to 350. On 10/09/2014 it was agreed that capacity would be lowered to 400 and the minimum age would be changed to 23. The applicant was advised to contact the license division to update paperwork in order to reflect these changes.
9. On 10/20/2014 a Milwaukee police officer was dispatched to the front desk at Milwaukee police district #1 regarding a battery complaint. The victim told officers she had been attacked around 1:30am while inside Ultra Lounge (628 North Water Street) by another patron known to her as Brande Conner. The victim stated she was struck several times in the head with a bottle while inside the business. The victim was treated and released at Froedtert Hospital for a concussion. Milwaukee police incident report #142930140 filed.
10. On 10/31/2014 Officers were flagged down at 610 N. Water St by a City of Milwaukee Parking Checker. The checker stated she was writing citations when she was confronted by a group of females who wanted to know why they were getting tickets. The group was understanding except one person, identified as Brittany HORTMAN, who pushed the checker. The Police were flagged down at this point and HORTMAN was issued a Disorderly Conduct citation. HORTMAN stated she was at the Ultra Lounge having drinks right before the confrontation.
11. On 11/08/2014 Milwaukee police were flagged down regarding the possibility of an underage patron being inside Ultra Lounge. Officers discovered an 18 year old female inside the business that had used another person's identification to gain entry to the bar. The female was cited for Presence of Underage in Place of Sale and Misrepresentation of Age. 12. On 11/15/2014 at 12:22am an Officer received a call about a large fight at 628 N. Water St (Ultra Lounge). When officers arrived they saw patrons leaving in all directions and the front glass door shattered. They were given a description of the actors and that one may be armed with a gun. The investigation revealed a fight occurred inside and continued outside. Two bouncers were injured during the altercation. The actors were not located but while on scene a patron of the bar was observed exiting the bar drinking an alcoholic beverage. The patron continued walking down the sidewalk where he was stopped and cited for public drinking.

PA-33E Narrative

This report is submitted by P.O. BOGUST assigned to district One, Power Shift, Squad 1460. On 11/15/2014, at 12:22 AM I received a call on my personal cell phone regarding a large fight in progress at 628 N Water ST (Ultra Lounge Bar). I broadcast the fight over channel one and started responding to the location. Squads 1449 P.O. BOHLEN P.O. BJORKQUIST, 1444 P.O. DEL MORAL P.O. KNAPINSKI, 1441 P.O. LIMBERG P.O. GREENE and 1411 Sgt ACKLKEY also responded to the location.

Upon my arrival I observed patrons leaving the area in all directions. I also observed the front glass door to the bar was shattered. Squad 1449 P.O. BOHLEN was able to give a description of the actors and that one may be armed with a gun. By the time the info was given most patrons were in their cars leaving the area, and I was unable to locate any of the actors.

I returned to the front of the bar with Sgt ACKLEY to determine what happened. I talked with a few patrons still leaving the bar and was told that there was a fight between six to eight patrons and about six of the bouncers in the club. The fight escalated out on the sidewalk and continued to the middle of N Water ST. No one could give me a reason to what or who started the fight. I also observed two bouncers with minor injuries HUTCHINS, Jamie L (b/m 2-7-80) had a small laceration to the back of his head and SMITH, Robert F (m/b 11-25-71) had a swelled up nose. Both bouncers refused medical treatment and stated they were ok and didn't want anything done.

As I went back outside I observed a patron Throne SABB (m/b 3-7-76) exit the bar drinking an alcoholic beverage walking down the sidewalk. I stopped the patron, confirmed that it was a hard alcoholic beverage mixed with soda. I confiscated the drink and cited the patron for public drinking.

I then went to 618 N Water and asked the manager for video footage from the camera they have that faces toward Ultra Lounges front door. I was able to view the footage and confirm exactly what happened. I observed both groups exit the front door of the bar physically fighting on the sidewalk and then to the middle of N Water ST in front of the club. I have enclosed a copy of the video footage with this report. It took seven officers and one supervisor to bring this problem under control.

This report is submitted by Police Officer Joseph Serio assigned to District 1, early shift. On Sunday, April 20, 2014 squad 1443, Police Officer Todd Bohlen and I were assigned to a Code Red deployment in the 600 block of N. Water Street, which is located in the City and County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin.

Our deployment duties are to monitor the bars in 600 block of N. Water Street and respond to calls for service regarding bar related offenses. At approximately 1:30am on April 20, 2014 squad 1410, Sergeant Wesam Yagham, squad 1413, Sergeant David Ligas and Squad 1442, Police Officer Adam Bradley and Police Officer Matthew Anderson responded to the area of the 600 block of N. Water Street to assist us with bar dismissal.

At 1:53pm on April 20, 2014 I observed a fight in the middle of the street in front of the Ultra Lounge bar located at 628 N. Water Street. Sergeant Wesam Yagham, Sergeant David Ligas, Police Officer Todd Bohlen and I responded to the fight. The two subjects involved in the fight were later identified as Stephen D. King and Eric D. Buchanan. King and Buchanan both stated that they came from the 618 night club located at 622 N. Water Street. The two subjects were taken into custody. The fight was in the middle of N. Water Street because the patrons of Ultra Lounge were occupying the entire sidewalk waiting for Ultra Lounge valet.

Sergeant Ligas and I escorted King back to my fully marked squad car which was located at 602 N. Water Street. While we were outside of my squad car in full police uniform a subject later identified as Robert C. Jones approached us in the street yelling at King, "Which one is he? Who were you fighting with? Jones eventually walked away.

SLOWINSKI and I) were flagged down by tavern security from both Ultra Lounge and 618 Live, stating there was a fight on the sidewalk at approximately 630 N Water St. P.O. SLOWINSKI and I ran from down the block and approached the group that we were told was fighting. While approaching, the group began to run from the location. As we approached the South East corner on N Water St and E Wisconsin Ave, P.O. SLOWINSKI tripped on the curb and fell to the ground. The group of 4-5 black males were running northbound on N Broadway from E Wisconsin Ave at this time. I checked on P.O. SLOWINSKI, at which time he stated the he believed he had broken fingers in his right hand. I called for medical and a supervisor, to which MFD responded. Squad 1413 (Sgt. LIGAS) responded and transported P.O. SLOWINSKI for medical care.

Enclosed with this report is a video from the closing time from Sunday, September 28, 2014 at approximately 1:45 a.m. to 2:05 a.m. This footage depicts the normal closing of the two taverns in the 600 block on N Water St..

On Monday, September 29, 2014 at approximately 1:32am, I was backing up squad 1340 on a traffic stop on W. Michigan Ave when an unknown vehicle pulled up next to me and informed me that there was a large fight on the 600 block of N. Water St. I advised dispatch and drove eastbound on E. Michigan St. As soon as I got to the intersection of E. Michigan St. and N. Water St. I observed a crowd of approximately 40-50 subjects, both in the street and on the sidewalk. I also observed two male subjects physically fighting and another 6-7 subjects surrounding them. This was in front of Ultra Lounge, 628 N. Water St. I was unable to determine if the 6-7 subjects were also involved in the fight or if they were trying to break it up. I activated my emergency lights and sirens and pulled over in front of Ultra Lounge. I advised dispatch that there was a large fight and requested additional squads to respond. I then exited my car and approached the two subjects that were fighting and was able to push one of the subjects away from the other. He looked at me and stated that the other subject had hit him first. Additional squads responded to help me keep the subjects separated from one another. The CAD lists a total of 8 MPD squads, including myself, as having responded to this incident.

While I was trying to keep order on N. Water St Squad 1340, P.O. Figueroa, walked around the corner to make sure there were no additional fights east of Water St. on Michigan St. At one point P.O. Figueroa got on his radio and stated that a vehicle had almost ran him over as he was attempting to speak with the driver. The vehicle, a black Mercedes Benz, sped away from the scene southbound on N. Water St.

Order was eventually restored with no citations issues or arrests made.

This report was written by PO Thomas Ackley, assigned to District One, Late Power Shift.

On Saturday, October 4th, 2014, at 1:46 AM, Squad 1421, PO Paul Bjorkquist and PO Joseph Serio, went over the radio with a "huge fight" in front of 618 Live. There were several subsequent fights of approximately 20 - 40 people each. The mounted patrol responded along with over 15 squads. The Supervisor on scene requested any squad available to respond to assist with the chaos. There were five subjects that were cited as a result of the fights. The Officers were unable to detain more subjects that were fighting because there were more fights erupting in such a close proximity.

The following subjects were cited:

- Richard J Bivens (B/M, 4-18-91) – Citation # 48930111121 for DC
- Eric T Alston (B/M, 3-19-92) – Citation # 48930111119 for DC
- Rickey D Wise (B/M, 8-24-88) – Citation # 48930111120 for DC
- John R Loy (W/M, 10-4-89) – Citation # 48914611292 for DC
- Travis D Jones (B/M, 7-1-85) – Citation # 48930111118 for DC

Sergeant Ackley's observations:

I (Sergeant Ackley) arrived on scene at about 1:48 AM. I observed several fights along the 600 block of N Water St, one right after the next. These fights, as they were broken up, would start again as the group traveled east towards the surface lot, which is located on the southeast corner of N Broadway and W Michigan St. The fights were groups of 10-40 people fighting, with another 20-40 people running towards the fight to watch. As one fight would erupt, Officers would try to pull out the most aggressive person out of the group and immediately go back in the middle of the fight and pull more people out. After this first group of people left the area, there were still more groups that began to fight.

During the second phase of the fights, I observed PO Bjorkquist and PO Todd Bohlen placing Richard Bivens in handcuffs. Bivens was taken out of a fight for wildly swinging his arms, trying to hit anyone that was close. As Bivens was being pulled away from the crowd, I observed PO Bjorkquist trip over a metal pole. All three fell off of the curb. Bivens was on the bottom of the two when PO Bjorkquist and PO Bohlen fell on top of Bivens. Bivens had a laceration to the right side of his forehead. PO Bjorkquist soon called for medical attention for Bivens. I spoke with Bivens, who stated that he had just come from 618 Live.

While on scene, I could not tell which bar the fights stemmed from whether it was The Ultra Lounge or 618 Live.

After the second phase of the fights had subsided, 618 staff told us that there were still 150 people inside of the tavern. I had already called for any available squad from District One to respond, along with squads from another District. As it turned out, there were only about 20 people left, so there was not a second large group that left the tavern.

I eventually met PO Serio regarding a use of force. While there, I observed several other people walking away in a manner, which was consistent with being sprayed with OC spray. I heard someone yell, "Get outa here, they have to arrest you if they spray you!"

It should be noted that while in the midst of the fights, I could hear the arc sound emanating from a taser. Each time I looked in the direction of the sound, I could see the arc, but I did not see an Officer. I could not tell who had the taser. Officers stated to me that they heard from passers by that the bouncers had the taser and also had OC spray out. I did not receive any further information about the identity or affiliation of the subject(s) who had the taser and the OC spray.

618 Live staff was seen moving people along all the way from their front door to the surface parking lot at N Broadway and W Michigan St. The Ultra Lounge security staff was not seen helping with the crowds once the crowds leave their tavern.

I spoke with PO Serio, who advised me of the following information:

PO Serio, who was assigned to Squad 1421 with PO Paul Bjorkquist, was assigned to monitor the release of The Ultra Lounge and 618 Live. PO Serio stated that he observed a subject, who was identified as Deangelo M Young (B/M, 9-26-88) get kicked out of the front exit door of 618. PO Serio observed Young yelling, screaming, pounding and pulling on the front door of 618 Live. The licensee of 618 Live, Habib Manjee, advised PO Serio that Young had been kicked out for fighting inside of the tavern. Manjee further stated that the other half of the fight had been kicked out of the back door of the tavern, presumably into the alley between N Broadway and N Water St. Young walked southbound towards W Michigan St and eventually located the other subject. The other subject was only described as a black male with a "True Religion" shirt on. Young and the other subject began fighting. This fight erupted into a fight of 10-15 people. PO Ray Bogust and PO Serio arrested one of the subjects that were fighting, Travis D Jones (B/M, 7-1-85) who claimed he was Deangelo Young's friend. Jones stated that he just came from 618 Live. Jones was cited for DC and released, as his friends were getting into a late 90's tan / silver Dodge Durango. Young was soon released and also entered the Durango. After a lot of arguing about who is going to get in the Durango, or who was going to stay and fight, the Durango finally left. The Durango was seen circling the block several times. Jones stated to PO Serio that he had just come from 618 Live.

Within seconds, PO Bogust requested more squads to the front of 618, as there was another fight breaking out. There were anywhere between 20 – 40 people actively fighting on the sidewalk, just south of 618 Live. There were dozens more that were running towards the fight just to watch. It should be noted that 618 Live's security staff was assisting the Officers with breaking up the fights as they occurred. PO Serio was in the immediate area when his partner, PO Bjorkquist and PO Bohlen arrested Bivens for fighting.

PO Serio stated that another large fight erupted on W Michigan St, between N Broadway and N Water St. PO Serio ran over to the fight. PO Serio stated that there were 4 subjects that were walking towards him, about to fight one person who was behind him. The main aggressor in this group of four was later identified as John R Loy (W/M, 10-4-89). Loy had his hands up in a boxer stance and was walking towards PO Serio and the subject behind him. The other three subjects were also walking towards PO Serio. PO Serio yelled at the group to stop. The group refused to stop, instead they continued to yell and gesture that they were going to start to fight the other person behind PO Serio. PO Serio sprayed one burst of his OC spray towards all four of the subjects. Three of the four ran away, while PO Bogust and PO Jeremy Limberg took Loy into custody. The other subjects were described as black men, all in their 20's. Loy was cited for DC, was given medical attention on scene

for his OC exposure and was eventually released from the scene. Loy stated to PO Serio and me that he had just come from The Ultra Lounge with his friends.

I spoke with PO Schmidt, who advised me of the following information:

PO Schmidt observed Young get kicked out of the front door of 618 Live. Young was being disorderly in front of the tavern. PO Bogust placed Young in handcuffs but was soon released, as it seemed as if Young had settled down. Young walked southbound towards Michigan St and met with the other person, who he had been fighting inside of 618 Live. Jones and Young, along with several of their friends fought with the other subject, who was in a "True Religion" shirt. The subject in the "True Religion" also had friends that had joined the fight. PO Bogust placed Jones in handcuffs and cited him. PO Serio and PO Schmidt escorted the subject in the "True Religion" eastbound towards an awaiting car. That subject stated to PO Schmidt that he had just been kicked out of the back door of 618 Live for fighting inside of the tavern.

At that point, PO Bogust went over the air with another fight, directly in front of 618 Live. Within this fight, Bivens was pulled out and arrested. PO Thoams Frank III arrested and cited Rickey D Wise (B/M, 8-24-89). PO Schmidt arrested and cited Eric T Alston (B/M, 3-19-92). The Officers on scene pulled out several more subjects but were not able to handcuff them as the fight was still escalating.

I spoke with PO Todd Bohlen, who advised me of the following information:

Richard Bivens stated that he had just come from 618 Live. Eric Alston also stated that he had just come from 618 Live.

That night, 618 Live staff provided video footage of the incident. On Tuesday, October 07, 2014, Sergeant David Ligas contacted David L Hinton (B/M, 6-22-80), who claimed to be the manager of The Ultra Lounge. Dave was unable to retrieve any video. Dave provided the building owner's phone number, but that phone number had been disconnected.

Attached is Police radio traffic for part of this incident.

I watched the squad video of all the squads with video systems installed. There were no squads that were pointing towards the fights. The Officers were mostly on foot during this incident.

We discussed our concerns that we had as a District. We discussed the fights that occur on a regular basis, at the end of the night, which provide an unsafe environment and a disturbance to businesses and residents in the area. Concerns included when both taverns let out at the same time, the crowd that is leaving the taverns are more disorderly than when let out separately. We discussed that 618 Live on Water's security personnel assists Officers with escorting patrons of both taverns to their respective parking lots and that I (Sergeant Ackley, street supervisor) have not seen The Ultra Lounge security help with this. The ID scanner that 618 Live on Water employs, along with the screening process, helps with the crowd entering the tavern and The Ultra Lounge does not currently have such a scanner. We discussed that there may be an issue that if patrons were told to leave one tavern, they tend to be allowed in the other tavern.

Several solutions were discussed to help alleviate many of these issues:

- We recommended that The Ultra Lounge purchase an ID scanner. Tremaine Brown agreed to purchase an ID scanner.
- Both taverns agreed that if one tavern bans a patron, that the other would also ban entry to that patron.
- Both taverns agreed to have meetings with each other on a regular basis, before they both open for the night, to discuss the night's events and have better communication.
- Both taverns agreed to slightly move their last call time and "push" where they have their patrons leave so that each tavern does not have a simultaneous let out. The tentative plan is as follows:

Friday nights:

The Ultra Lounge will let out at 1:40 AM

618 Live on Water will let out at 1:55 AM

Saturday nights:

The Ultra Lounge will let out at 1:55 AM

618 Live on Water will let out at 1:40 AM

-The Ultra Lounge agreed to have their security personnel help walk patrons to their respective parking lot in order to prevent fights and keep order.

-The Ultra Lounge agreed to ask for and take advice from 618 Live on Water staff as they have been in business for a long time and their managerial style does a good job.

This report is being submitted, by P.O. Frank SALINSKY, assigned to District One, Early Shift.

On Monday, 10-20-14, at 6:47 P.M., P.O. Richard LOPEZ and I (squad 1230), were dispatched to a walk-in battery complaint at the District One front desk at 749 W State St Rm. 214.

On arrival I met the complainant/victim, Asia D. TURNER (B/F 10-03-90) of 4173 N 72nd St (ph# 731-5572). She stated that at 1:30 A.M. this morning (10/20), an acquaintance, Brande CONNER, struck her with a bottle several times, inside the Ultra Lounge (628 N Water St).

The victim stated she had about three drinks the whole night.

The victim stated she knows CONNER through a guy that she is dating, Robert. She sees her at social gatherings. The victim used Facebook on her phone to identify the suspect through photos posted from last night's party. She described CONNER as a black female in her late twenties with blonde hair. The female in the photos was wearing a red dress and had a very distinctive haircut (long blonde hair on top and short brown hair on the sides like a mohawk).

The suspect was identified as Brande D. CONNER (B/F 04-13-86) of 7988-F N 94th St.

According to the victim, she was attending a party at the Astor Hotel (924 E Juneau Ave). She arrived at the party sometime after 10:00 P.M. and ran in to the suspect who gave her a hug. Around 11:30 P.M. she went to the Ultra Lounge for an after party. At about 1:30 A.M., she was walking to the restroom inside the club, when the suspect came at her and without warning or provocation struck her in the head with a glass bottle. The victim stated she fell to the floor and hit the back of her head. She got up and in an attempt to defend herself started fighting with the suspect, who kept striking her to the left side of her face and body with the bottle. Security broke up the fight and she went home.

The victim stated she believes the attack stemmed from the suspect being jealous of her, because the suspect is attracted to her boyfriend. She stated this information was heard through others and not the suspect.

I observed injuries to the victim's face and upper torso, all on the left side. She had several small scratches and lacerations to her left forehead and cheek and two more serious deep lacerations, one cut on her neck and one deep laceration above her left breast.

Sgt. David LIGAS took photos of the injuries and suspect's facebook photo.

The victim stated she went to Froedtert Hospital ER this morning. She presented me discharge instructions, which recorded the admit time at 10:36 A.M. and the treating physician as Dr. Jonathan RUBIN M.D. The primary diagnosis was a mild traumatic brain injury also known as a concussion. She was prescribed pain medication and was released with follow-up instructions.

When asked why she did not seek medical attention after the fight she replied because she did not like the emergency room. She stated that she did not call for police because there was police already outside the bar on N Water St. When I inquired why she did not approach the officers she replied because she was drunk and her head hurt so she just wanted to go home.

P.O. LOPEZ interviewed an apparent witness to the incident. See supplement 001 regarding.

After our investigation we responded to the Ultra Lounge where we determined the video cameras did not capture video on the hallway where the restrooms are located. We then changed locations to look for the suspect at 7988-F N 94th St. The suspect was not located.

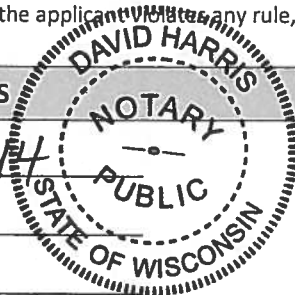
