#### 1. Description of Grant Project/Program (Include Target Locations and Populations):

This grant will resume the interdisciplinary review of infant and fetal deaths occurring in the City of Milwaukee to identify opportunities to reduce infant mortality and support families at risk. This grant is a renewal of a 4 year grant cycle which began June 1, 2005.

### 2. Relationship to City-wide Strategic Goals and Departmental Objectives:

The City Strategic Plan identifies the reduction of Infant Mortality as one of its most pressing problems. This grant will provide for public health and safety among City objectives and identifies the infant mortality rate as a benchmark indicator. The Department's second objective includes reducing the five-year average infant mortality rate below 9 per thousand births. Information from this study will help focus infant mortality prevention efforts. The 2006 infant mortality rate is 12.3 infant deaths per 1000 live births.

## 3. Need for Grant Funds and Impact on Other Departmental Operations (Applies only to Programs):

Grant funds are needed to reach program goals and objectives which include:

- a) Data analysis of abstracted medical record data and available state and local aggregate data.
- b) Case Review Team analysis of 2005-2009 fetal and infant deaths to provide system, provider, community and individual recommendationsthat may prevent future infant deaths.
- c) An educational and outreach effort that will utilize Health Department staff to support services for bereaved parents, the parents and caregiversofall newborn infants, their healthcare providers, healthcare and social service institutions and community based organizations, and any othe rotizen orgroup interested in the FIMR project and goals.

## 4. Results Measurement/Progress Report (Applies only to Programs):

Major outcomes will be the medical and social service record review of 100% of City of Milwaukee fetal and infant deaths, the production of recommendations to reduce future infant mortality rates such as a decrease in the number of infants exposed to prenatal and environmental smoke, an increase in the number of caretakers placing infants in a safe sleeping environment, community education on preterm labor and fetal movement, and the support of bereaved parents.

Current year funding will run from June, 2008 through May 31, 2009. These are normally 4 year renewal grants.
